8 AN ACT TO ENHANCE THE EFFECTIVENESS OF SCHOOL  
9 DISTRICT PARENTAL INVOLVEMENT PLANS; AND FOR OTHER  
10 PURPOSES.  
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## Subtitle

14 TO ENHANCE THE EFFECTIVENESS OF SCHOOL  
15 DISTRICT PARENTAL INVOLVEMENT PLANS.  
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18 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ARKANSAS:  
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20 SECTION 1. Arkansas Code § 6-15-1704 is amended to read as follows:

21 6-15-1704. Annual review of parental involvement plans - Monitoring.

22 (a) ~~Beginning on October 1, 2004, and by each October 1 thereafter~~  
23 Annually by October 1, every school district shall review and update the  
24 school district's parental involvement plan and:

25 (1) ~~file~~ File a copy of the plan with the Department of  
26 Education; and

27 (2) Place a copy of the plan on the school district's website.

28 (b)(1)(A) The department shall:

29 (i) ~~review~~ Review each plan; ~~and~~

30 (ii) ~~determine~~ Determine whether the plan is in  
31 compliance with provisions of this subchapter; and

32 (iii) ~~shall indicate~~ Indicate on the school's  
33 performance report under § 6-15-1402 whether or not the school district is in  
34 compliance with this subchapter.

35 (B) Periodically on a rotating schedule, the department  
36 shall monitor each school district's plan to:



1 (i) Evaluate whether the school district is  
 2 implementing its plan and the implementation's effectiveness; and

3 (ii) Assess the areas in which a school district  
 4 needs to revise its plan or its implementation of the plan.

5 (C) The department shall place priority for monitoring  
 6 under subdivision (b)(1)(B) of this section on school districts that have  
 7 been identified as being in:

8 (i) School improvement for two (2) consecutive  
 9 school years; or

10 (ii) Academic distress.

11 ~~(2) If the department determines that a school district is not in~~  
 12 ~~compliance with §§ 6-15-1701—6-15-1703, the department shall send the~~  
 13 ~~school district written notification indicating any deficiencies in the~~  
 14 ~~school district's plan no later than January 1 of each year and allow the~~  
 15 ~~school district an opportunity to correct any deficiency. By January 1 of~~  
 16 ~~each year, the department shall provide any recommendations in writing to a~~  
 17 ~~school district:~~

18 (A) Concerning areas of noncompliance with §§ 6-15-1701 –  
 19 6-15-1703; or

20 (B) As a result of the department's monitoring under  
 21 (b)(1)(B).

22 (3) The department shall allow the school district an  
 23 opportunity to implement the department's recommendations.

24 (4) The State Board of Education shall incorporate the  
 25 provisions of this subsection into its rules for parental involvement plans.

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 27 SECTION 2. Arkansas Code § 6-15-1703 is amended to read as follows:  
 28 6-15-1703. Staff Professional development.

29 (a) The State Board of Education's Standards for Accreditation of  
 30 Arkansas Public Schools and School Districts shall require:

31 (1) ~~No fewer than two~~ Two (2) or more hours of professional  
 32 development ~~opportunities for teachers, which may be included in the~~ as part  
 33 of the annual minimum number of hours of professional development required,  
 34 designed to enhance understanding of effective parental involvement  
 35 strategies; and

36 (2) ~~No fewer than three~~ Three (3) or more hours of professional

1 development ~~opportunities for administrators, which may be included in the~~ as  
2 part of the annual minimum number of hours of professional development  
3 required, designed to enhance understanding of:

4 (A) Effective parent involvement strategies; and

5 (B) The importance of administrative leadership in setting  
6 expectations and creating a climate conducive to parental participation.

7 (b) The Department of Education shall provide the professional  
8 development required under this section.

9 (c) Each school district shall provide training at least annually for  
10 volunteers who assist in an instructional program for parents.

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
