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1	SECTION 3. Arkansas Code § 23-115-410 is amended to read as follows:		
2	23-115-410. Compulsive gambling Gambling disorder prevention,		
3	treatment, and educational programs.		
4	(a) As used in this section, "gambling disorder" means problem		
5	gambling disorder and compulsive gambling disorder.		
6	(b) The Arkansas Lottery Commission shall provide an annual amount of		
7	at least two hundred thousand dollars (\$200,000) three million dollars		
8	(\$3,000,000) for:		
9	(1) Compulsive gambling disorder treatment programs; and		
10	(2) Compulsive gambling disorder educational programs.		
11	(1) Programs for the treatment and prevention of gambling		
12	disorders; and		
13	(2) Educational programs for adults and adolescents that provide		
14	statewide ongoing public awareness of gambling disorders.		
15	(c)(l) The prevention, treatment, and educational programs provided		
16	under this section shall be designed and implemented independent of the		
17	commission or the Arkansas State Lottery.		
18	(b)(1) The commission shall work together with the Department of Human		
19	Services to implement the compulsive gambling disorder treatment_programs and		
20	the compulsive gambling disorder educational programs under this section.		
21	(2) The commission $\frac{\text{may}}{\text{shall}}$ contract with the $\frac{\text{department}}{\text{department}}$		
22	Department of Human Services for administering and providing all services		
23	related to and administration of the compulsive gambling disorder treatment		
24	programs and the compulsive gambling disorder educational treatment programs

27	(d)(1) Funding for age-appropriate educational programs shall be made		
28	available to public and private schools enrolling students in kindergarten		
29	through grade twelve (K-12).		
30	(2) The funding provided under this subsection is in addition to		
31	funding received by public and private schools enrolling students in		
32	kindergarten through grade twelve (K-12) for educational programs to address		
33	alcohol, drug, and tobacco abuse.		
34	(e) The prevention, treatment, and educational programs funded under		
35	this section shall be provided free of charge to the public.		
36	(3)(f) The department may promulgate rules to:		

1	(1) administer the compulsive gambling disorder treatment
2	programs and the compulsive gambling disorder educational programs Administer
3	the prevention, treatment, and educational programs established under this
4	section; and
5	(2) Provide grants to public entities and nonprofit private
6	entities, including without limitation those that currently provide services
7	in mental health and substance abuse treatment and prevention, to provide
8	services related to the prevention, treatment, and educational programs
9	established under this section.
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
