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28	BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ARKANSAS:
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30	SECTION 1. <u>DO NOT CODIFY</u>
31	(a) The purpose of this act is to create a study to:
32	(1) Explore how to maximize the use of the Arkansas Economic
33	Development Commission, rural services, economic development districts, other
34	public agencies and organizations, and the private sector in addressing:
35	(A) Quality-of-life issues in underserved areas, including
36	without limitation:



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1	(i) Access to housing;
2	(ii) Access to social and recreational outlets, both
3	indoor and outdoor;
4	(iii) Access to comprehensive healthcare;
5	(iv) Access to a variety of high-quality, healthy
6	food choices;
7	(v) Access to shopping choices;
, 8	(vi) Deliberate development of community across
9	boundaries of race, ethnicity, gender, religion, socioeconomic status, age,
10	geography, and other barriers;
11	(vii) Local plans to support restorative justice;
12	(viii) Plans for expansive, inclusive civic
13	participation; and
14	(ix) Access to transportation;
15	(B) Promotion of economic opportunity in underserved
16	areas;
17	(C) Capacity-building issues across traditional lines of
18	race, ethnicity, gender, socioeconomic status, age, geography, and other
19	boundaries, including without limitation:
20	(i) Leadership building;
21	(ii) Deliberate and sustained power-sharing;
22	(iii) Planning; and
23	<u>(iv) Capitalism literacy;</u>
24	(D) Internet marketing; and
25	(E) Other opportunities for exploration, including without
26	<u>limitation:</u>
27	(i) Implementation of differentiated diagnosis and
28	response to discover and support economic opportunity;
29	(ii) Evaluation of efforts by public agencies and
30	both the private and nonprofit sectors to initiate and support economic
31	<u>opportunities;</u>
32	(iii) Assessment of cooperative efforts among areas
