18	SECTION 4. Arkansas Code § 6-20-2507(g), concerning compliance dates	
19	for approved projects under the Academic Facilities Partnership Program, is	
20	amended to read as follows:	
21	(g)(1) The Except as provided under subsection (h) of this section,	
22	the commission shall establish compliance dates for the:	
23	(A) Execution of the partnership agreement;	
24	(B) Start of the project design; and	
25	(C) Start and ending of construction.	
26	(2) Projects not meeting the compliance dates may be cancelled	
27	by the commission, and the state's financial participation, in whole or in	
28	part, may be declared void after the school district has been provided:	
29	(A) A notice of the failure to meet compliance dates; and	
30	(B) An opportunity for a hearing before the commission.	
31	(h)(l)(A) A school district shall be allowed to replace a system in	
32	stages if the system is part of the warm, safe, and dry requirements of the	
33	Academic Facilities Partnership Program rules and the following conditions	
34	are met:	
35	(i) The replacement schedule applies to a	
36	replacement of an entire system:	

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1	(ii) The replacement schedule does not exceed three

10	construction of an approved project when the approved project involves a
11	space requirement established by the Program of Requirements.
12	(B) The division shall not withhold funding or project
13	approval for a project based:
14	(i) Solely on the sequence of construction decided
15	by the school district; or
16	(ii) On the division's determination that certain
17	required academic spaces shall be funded and constructed before other
18	required academic spaces may be funded and constructed.
19	(C) The division may require that all missing or
20	materially inadequate components included in a list of required academic
21	spaces under the Program of Requirements be completed before the school
22	district will qualify for state participation in the funding for a gymnasium
23	<u>or auditorium.</u>
