EMERGENCY CLAUSE. It is found and determined by the 23 General Assembly of the State of Arkansas that certain provisions of the Arkansas Teacher Retirement System statutes are urgently in need of revision 24 25 and updating to bring them into conformance with sound public pension policy; that revision and updating is of great importance to members of the Arkansas 26 27 Teacher Retirement System and to other citizens of the State of Arkansas; that the school year calendar has historically been expanding with the 28 29 addition of teacher service requirements and other legislative initiatives 30 while the number of days of service has remained unchanged since the 1970s; that this legislation is necessary to account for the changes in teacher 31 32 service requirements and to make the retirement system more reflective of the 33 actual number of days of service; and that this act is necessary to maintain 34 an orderly system of benefits for the members of the Arkansas Teacher Retirement System.
