3	(c)(l) An applicant shall file on forms provided by the sheriff's		
4	department an application to receive a permit for personal possession of a		
5	primate with the sheriff's department of the county in which the primate is		
6	<u>kept.</u>		
7	(2) The application shall include:		
8	(A) The name, address, and telephone number of the		
9	applicant;		
10	(B) A description of the primate, including without		
11	limitation the scientific classification, name, gender, age, color, weight,		
12	and distinguishing marks or coloration that would aid in the identification		
13	of the primate;		
14	(C) A photograph of the primate;		
15	(D) The location at which the primate is kept and a		
16	photograph of the location; and		
17	(E) The name, address, and telephone number of the person		
18	from whom the applicant obtained the primate, if known.		
19	(3) The application shall be signed by the veterinarian who is		
20	expected to provide veterinary care to the primate and shall include the		
21	veterinarian's name, address, and telephone number.		
22	(d) The county sheriff's department shall not grant a permit unless:		
23	(1) An annual permit fee of two hundred fifty dollars (\$250) for		
24	each primate accompanies the application;		
25	(2) The applicant is eighteen (18) years of age or older;		
26	(3) The applicant has not pleaded nolo contendere or guilty to		
27	or been found guilty of in the past ten (10) years:		
28	(A) A violation of a law prohibiting animal cruelty; or		
29	(B) A felony offense for possession, sale, or use of a		
30	controlled substance;		
31	(4) The facility and the conditions in which the primate is kept		
32	complies with this subchapter; and		
33	(5) The applicant has obtained the liability insurance coverage		
34	for the primate required under this subchapter.		
35	(e)(1) The county sheriff's department shall keep records of persons		
36	issued a permit for personal possession of a primate and shall provide a cop		

1 of the record to the Arkansas State Game and Fish Commission when each permit

2	is issued.		
3	(2) A permit holder shall notify the county sheriff's department		
4	of a change of the permit holder's information, including without limitation		
5	the death of the primate.		
6	(f)(1) A primate possessed in this state shall be spayed, neutered, or		
7	sterilized before a permit is issued to the possessor unless a veterinarian		
8	confirms that spaying and neutering or sterilization would endanger the		
9	primate.		
10	(2) The permit holder shall keep a record of the primate's being		
11	spayed, neutered or sterilized by a veterinarian.		
12	(g) Fees levied and collected for permits of personal possession of a		
13	primate under this section shall be deposited into the county treasury to be		
14	used by the county sheriff's department to offset the cost of issuing permits		
15	of personal possession of a primate, for any costs involved in controlling		
16	primates located within the county, and for any other animal control costs.

18	20-19-602. Insurance — Signs — Notification.		
19	(a)(l) A possessor of a primate shall maintain liability insurance		
20	coverage of not less than one hundred thousand dollars (\$100,000) for each		
21	occurrence for liability damages for destruction of or damage to property and		
22	for death or bodily injury to a person caused by the primate.		
23	(2) The possessor of a primate shall provide a copy of the		
24	policy for liability insurance to the county sheriff's department on an		
25	annual basis to obtain or renew a permit.		
26	(b)(l) The possessor of a primate shall post and display a sign at		
27	each possible entrance on the premises where a primate is kept.		
28	(2) The sign shall be clearly legible and easily readable by the		
29	public.		
30	(3) The sign shall warn that there is a primate on the premises.		
31			
32	20-19-603. Inspection.		
33	The possessor of a primate shall allow an official of the county		
34	sheriff's department, an animal control officer, the Arkansas State Game and		
35	Fish Commission Wildlife Officer, or a law enforcement officer of the		
36	municipality or county in which the primate is kept to enter the premises to		

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1	ensure compliance with this subchapter.		
2			
3	20-19-604. Public contact - Warnings of escape.		
4	(a) A possessor of a primate shall not bring a primate to a commercial		
5	or retail establishment unless the possessor is bringing the primate to a		
6	veterinarian clinic.		
7	(b)(1) If a primate escapes or is released, the possessor of the		
8	primate shall contact immediately the Arkansas State Game and Fish Commission		
9	and law enforcement officials of the city or county in which the possessor		
10	resides to report the escape or release.		
11	(2) The possessor is liable for all expenses associated with		
12	efforts to recapture the primate.		
13			
14	20-19-605. Confiscation.		
15	(a) A primate may be confiscated immediately by a county sheriff's		
16	department if:		
17	(1) The possessor does not have a permit for personal possession		
18	issued under this section;		
19	(2) The possessor does not have the liability insurance coverage		
20	required under this subchapter;		
21	(3) The conditions under which the primate is kept are directly		
22	or indirectly dangerous to human health and safety; or		
23	(4) The caging violates requirements of the Arkansas cruelty to		
24	animals statutes.		
25	(b)(1) If a primate is confiscated, the possessor is liable for the		
26	costs of placement and care for the primate from the time of confiscation		
27	until the time the primate has been relocated to an alternative facility.		
28	(2) The county sheriff's department shall seek to place the		
29	confiscated primate with a wildlife sanctuary, humane society, or an		
30	institution accredited by the American Zoo and Aquarium Association.
