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19	BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ARKANSAS:	
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21	SECTION 1. Arkansas Code Title 20, Chapter 19, is amended to add an	
22	additional subchapter to read as follows:	
23	<u>Subchapter 6 — Personal Possession of Primates</u>	
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25	<u>20-19-601. Definition.</u>	
26	As used in this subchapter, "wildlife sanctuary" means a nonprofit	
27	organization described in Section 170(b)(1)(A)(vi), Internal Revenue Code	
28	1986 as it existed on January 1, 2011, that operates a place of refuge whe	<u>ere</u>
29	abused, neglected, unwanted, impounded, abandoned, orphaned, or displaced	
30	exotic animals are provided care for their lifetime or are released back	<u>to</u>
31	their natural habitat, and with respect to any animal owned by the	
32	organization, does not:	
33	(1) Conduct any activity that is not inherent to the animal'.	<u>s</u>
34	<u>nature;</u>	
35	(2) Use the animal for any type of entertainment;	
36	(3) Sell, trade, or barter the animal or the animal's body

2	(4) Breed the animal.
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4	20-19-602. Permit for personal possession.
5	(a) A person may possess a primate only if the person:
6	(1) Was in possession of the primate and was the legal possessor
7	of the primate on or before August 12, 2011; and
8	(2)(A) Not more than ninety (90) days after the effective date
9	of this subchapter, applies for a permit for personal possession for each
10	primate in the person's possession under this subchapter; or
11	(B) Within two (2) years after the effective date of this
12	subchapter can prove that:
13	(i) The person s had possession of a primate on or
14	before August 12, 2011; and
15	(ii) Provides proof of ownership of the primate on
16	or before August 12, 2011 with one (1) or more of the following documents:
17	(a) A United States Department of Agriculture
18	transfer document;
19	(b) An Arkansas State Game and Fish Commission
20	translocation permit;
21	<u>(c) A health certificate;</u>
22	(d) A veterinarian's record;
23	(e) A bill of sale; or
24	(f) Any other legal documentation.
25	(b)(1) A new permit for personal possession of a primate shall not be
26	issued after August 12, 2013.
27	(2) A permit for personal possession of a primate may be
28	transferred to a person who meets the criteria under subdivision (a)(2)(B)
29	(i) and (ii) of this section.
30	<u>(c) A person who brings a primate into Arkansas shall possess</u>
31	documentation signed by a licensed veterinarian that shows the primate to
32	free of:
33	<u>(1) Ebola virus;</u>
34	(2) Hepatitis; and
35	(3) Any other incurable disease known to be carried by primates.
36	(d)(1) An applicant shall file on forms designed and provided by the

1	Simian Society of Arkansas, LLC, an application to receive a permit for
2	personal possession of a primate with the sheriff's department of the county
3	<u>in which the primate is kept.</u>
4	(2) The application shall include:
5	(A) The name, address, and telephone number of the
6	applicant;
7	(B) A description of the primate, including without
8	limitation the name, gender, age, color, weight, and distinguishing marks or
9	coloration that would aid in the identification of the primate;
10	(C) A photograph of the primate; and
11	(D) The location at which the primate is kept and a
12	photograph of the location.
13	(3) The application shall be signed by the veterinarian who is
14	expected to provide veterinary care to the primate and shall include the
15	veterinarian's name, address, and telephone number.
16	(e) A county sheriff shall issue a permit for an application that
17	meets the criteria under subsection (a) of this section.
18	(f) A county sheriff's office shall not grant an initial permit
19	<u>unless:</u>
20	(1) The application is accompanied by an initial permit fee of
21	two hundred dollars (\$200) for one (1) primate and ten dollars (\$10.00) for
22	<u>each additional primate owned by a person;</u>
23	(2) The applicant is eighteen (18) years of age or older;
24	(3) The applicant has not pleaded guilty to or been found guilty
25	of in the past ten (10) years a violation of a law prohibiting animal
26	<u>cruelty;</u>
27	(4) The facility and the conditions in which the primate is kept
28	comply with this subchapter; and
29	(5) The applicant has obtained the liability insurance coverage
30	for the primate required under this subchapter.
31	<u>(g)(l) A person who holds a permit for personal possession of a</u>
32	primate under subsection (a) of this section shall renew the permit for
33	personal possession one (1) time every two (2) years.
34	(2) An application for renewal of a permit for personal
35	possession of a primate shall be accompanied by a renewal fee of twenty-five
36	dollars (\$25.00) for one (1) primate and ten dollars (\$10.00) for each

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1	additional primate owned by a person.
2	(h)(1) The county sheriff's department shall keep a record of each
3	person issued a permit for personal possession of a primate.
4	(2) A permit holder shall notify the county sheriff's department
5	of a change of the permit holder's information, including without limitation
6	the death of the primate.
7	(3)(A) The county sheriff's department shall provide to the
8	Department of Health a copy of the record of the issuance of and each change
9	to a permit for personal possession of a primate to the Department of Health.
10	(B) The Department of Health shall compile and maintain an
11	electronic database of each personal possession of a primate issued and
12	active in the state.
13	(i)(l) Except for nonhuman primates on the endangered species list, a
14	primate possessed in this state shall not be bred.
15	(2) A primate on the endangered species list may be bred only
16	<u>by:</u>
17	(A) An institution accredited by or certified by the
18	American Zoo and Aquarium Association; or
19	(B) A facility or person that holds a current signed
20	memorandum of participation with an Association of Zoos and Aquariums species
21	survival plan.
22	(j) Fees levied and collected for permits of personal possession of a
23	primate under this section shall be deposited into the county treasury to be
24	used by the county sheriff's department to offset the cost of issuing permits
25	of personal possession of a primate, for any costs involved in controlling
26	primates located within the county, and for any other animal control costs.
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28	<u>20-19-603. Insurance.</u>
29	<u>A possessor of a primate shall maintain liability insurance coverage on</u>
30	personal assets to cover any damage caused by the primate.
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32	<u>20-19-604. Inspection.</u>
33	The possessor of a primate shall allow an official of the county
34	sheriff's department, an animal control officer, or a law enforcement officer
35	of the municipality or county in which the primate is kept to enter the
36	premises to ensure compliance with this subchapter.

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2	20-19-605. Public contact — Warnings of escape.
3	(a)(l) A possessor of a primate shall not bring a primate to a retail
4	establishment unless the possessor is bringing the primate to a veterinary
5	<u>clinic.</u>
6	(2) A primate may be brought to a:
7	(A) Veterinary clinic;
8	(B) A meeting of the Simian Society of Arkansas, LLC; or
9	(C) A private rented space.
10	(b)(1) If a primate escapes or is released, the possessor of the
11	primate shall contact immediately the sheriff of the county in which the
12	possessor resides to report the escape or release.
13	(2) The possessor is liable for all expenses associated with
14	efforts to recapture the primate.
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16	20-19-606. Confiscation.
17	(a) A primate may be confiscated immediately by a county sheriff's
18	<u>department if:</u>
19	(1) The possessor does not have a permit for personal possession
20	<u>issued under this subchapter;</u>
21	(2) The possessor does not have the liability insurance coverage
22	<u>required under this subchapter;</u>
23	(3) The conditions under which the primate is kept are directly
24	or indirectly dangerous to human health and safety; or
25	(4) The caging violates requirements of the Arkansas cruelty to
26	<u>animals statutes.</u>
27	(b)(1) If a primate is confiscated, the possessor is liable for the
28	costs of placement and care for the primate from the time of confiscation
29	until the time the primate has been relocated to an alternative facility.
30	(2) The county sheriff's department shall seek to place the
31	confiscated primate with a wildlife sanctuary, the Simian Society of
32	Arkansas, LLC; or an institution accredited by the American Zoo and Aquarium
33	Association.
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35	20-19-607. Disposition of confiscated primate.
36	(a) If the possessor of a confiscated primate cannot be located or if

1	a confiscated primate remains unclaimed, the sheriff's office shall:
2	(1) Request that the primate be taken by:
3	(A) A wildlife sanctuary;
4	(B) An institution accredited by the American Zoo and
5	Aquarium Association; or
6	(C) The Simian Society of Arkansas, LLC; or
7	(2) Allow the animal to be adopted by a person who currently
8	possesses a permit under this subchapter.
9	(b) A primate may be returned to the possessor only if the possessor
10	of the primate:
11	(1) Holds a valid permit under this subchapter;
12	(2) Has corrected the conditions resulting in the confiscation;
13	(3) Has paid the cost of placement and care of the animal while
14	under the care and control of the sheriff's office; and
15	(4) Has not had a primate previously confiscated by the
16	sheriff's office.
17	(c) If the sheriff's office cannot relocate the primate under
18	subsection (a) of this section or return the primate to the possessor under
19	subsection (b) of this section, the sheriff's office shall request the
20	prosecuting attorney to seek a court order to have the animal euthanized if
21	the court decides that the best interests of the animal or that the public
22	health and safety would be best served by euthanizing the animal based on the
23	sworn testimony of a licensed veterinarian or animal control office.
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25	<u>20-19-608. Penalties.</u>
26	(a) If a person who possesses a primate fails to apply for a personal
27	possession permit under this subchapter, the person is subject to:
28	(1) The initial permit fee under § 20-19-602(f), the biannual
29	renewal fee, and a fine of one hundred dollars (\$100); or
30	(2) Confiscation of the primate.
31	(b) The sheriff's office shall revoke a permit for personal possession
32	of a primate held by a possessor who has had a primate confiscated more than
33	<u>one (1) time.</u>
34	<u>(c) A person who violates this subchapter is guilty of a misdemeanor</u>
35	and on conviction is subject to a fine not exceeding one thousand dollars
36	<u>(\$1,000).</u>

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2	20-19-609. Exemptions.
3	This subchapter does not apply to:
4	(1) An institution accredited by the American Zoo and Aquarium
5	Association or under mentorship through the American Zoo and Aquarium
6	Association;
7	(2) An incorporated nonprofit animal protection organization
8	housing a wild and exotic animal at the written request of a law enforcement
9	agency;
10	(3) A law enforcement agency or officer acting under this
11	<u>subchapter;</u>
12	(4)(A) A person who is licensed by the Arkansas State Game and
13	Fish Commission to rehabilitate native wildlife.
14	(B) A person is exempt under subdivision (4)(A) of this
15	section only for the native wildlife that the person possesses;
16	(5) A licensed veterinary hospital or clinic treating wild and
17	<u>exotic animals; or</u>
18	(6) A wildlife sanctuary.
