- 7 the holder or applicant, as the case may be, has committed or is found guilty
- 8 by the board of any of the following acts or offenses set forth:
- 9 (1) That the The person is guilty of fraud, deceit, or
- 10 misrepresentation in the practice of pharmacy;
- 11 (2) That the The person is unfit or incompetent to practice
- 12 pharmacy by reason of negligent performance of his or her duties;
- 13 (3) That the The person has been found guilty or pleaded guilty
- 14 or nolo contendere in a criminal proceeding, regardless of whether or not the
- 15 adjudication of guilt or sentence is withheld, by a court of this state,
- 16 another state, or the federal government for:
- 17 (A) Any felony;
- 18 (B) Any act involving moral turpitude, gross immorality,
- 19 or which is related to the qualifications, functions, and duties of a
- 20 licensee; or
- 21 (C) Any violation of the pharmacy or drug laws or rules of
- 22 this state or rules and regulations pertaining thereto, or of the pharmacy or
- 23 drug statutes, rules, and regulations of any other state or of the federal
- 24 government;
- 25 (4) That the The person has become insane or has been adjudged
- 26 by a court of competent jurisdiction to be of unsound mind physically or
- 27 mentally incompetent to practice pharmacy to such an extent as to endanger

- 30 abetted the practice of pharmacy by a person not authorized to practice

8	adulterated any drugs, chemical, or medical preparations and offered such

10	(11) That the $\underline{\text{The}}$ person had his or her license to practice		
11	pharmacy certificate of licensure, license, registration, or permit revoked,		
12	suspended, or had other disciplinary action taken, or had his or her		
13	application for a license certificate of licensure, license, registration, or		
14	permit refused, revoked, or suspended, or had voluntarily or otherwise		
15	surrendered his or her license certificate of licensure, license,		
16	registration, or permit after a disciplinary action was instituted by a duly		
17	authorized professional disciplinary agency of another state.		
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19	SECTION 4. Arkansas Code § 17-92-313(a)(1), concerning revocation of		
20	pharmacist's licenses, is amended to read as follows:		
21	(a)(1) Before revoking the $\frac{1}{1}$		
22	certificate of licensure, license, registration, or permit, the Arkansas		
23	State Board of Pharmacy shall give the person ten (10) days' notice in		
24	writing to appear before the board, at such the time and place as the board		
25	may direct, to show cause why his or her certificate should not be revoked.		
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27	SECTION 5. Arkansas Code § 17-92-313(c), concerning revocation of		
28	pharmacist's licenses, is amended to read as follows:		
29	(c) If the board finds after a hearing that the certificate or license		
30	of the person of licensure, license, registration, or permit should be		
31	revoked, it shall be done forthwith <u>immediately</u> .		
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
