2	ballot for sheriff without paying a filing fee may do so by filing a petition		
3	with the county clerk signed by at least one percent (1%) of the qualified		
4	electors residing within the county for which the candidate seeks office, but		
5	in no event shall more than two thousand (2,000) signatures be required.		
6	(B) In determining the number of qualified electors in the		
7	county under subdivision (e)(1)(A) of this section, the total number of all		
8	votes cast in the county for Governor in the immediately preceding general		
9	gubernatorial election shall be conclusive of the number of qualified		
10	electors residing within the county.		
11	(2) The petition shall be filed during the party filing period.		
12	(3) The county clerk shall verify the sufficiency of the		
13	petition within thirty (30) days of filing.		
14	(4) A candidate for sheriff shall file a political practices		
15	pledge, an affidavit of eligibility, and a notice of candidacy at the time of

23	or her name the title or an abbreviation of an elective public office the		
24	candidate currently holds.		
25	(ii) A candidate may only use as the prefix the

28	(C) A nickname shall not include a professional or		
29	honorary title.		
30	(g)(1) No votes for a write-in candidate in an election for sheriff		
31	shall be counted or tabulated unless the candidate or his or her agent gives		
32	notice in writing of his or her intention to be a write-in candidate for		
33	sheriff to the county board of election commissioners and the county clerk.		
34	(2) The written notice shall be given not later than ninety (90)

2	(h)(1) If no candidate for sheriff receives a majority of the votes
3	cast in the general election, the two (2) candidates receiving the highest
4	number of votes cast for the office to be filled shall be the nominees for
5	the respective offices, to be voted upon in a runoff election under § 7-5-
6	<u>106.</u>
7	(2) If the office of sheriff is unopposed, then the single
8	candidate for sheriff shall be printed on the general election ballot and the
9	votes for sheriff shall be tabulated as in all contested races.
