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1 the people of Arkansas and the nation by pursuing and arresting fugitives 2 from justice, sexual predators who prey on children, and other dangerous 3 criminals; and 4 5 WHEREAS, the United States Marshals Service administers the Department 6 of Justice Asset Forfeiture Program that converts assets seized from 7 criminals used in certain criminal enterprises to cash and returns millions of dollars to the victims of crime and to state and local law enforcement 8 9 agencies nationwide; and 10 WHEREAS, the United States Marshals Service has made 1,769 fugitive 11 12 arrests in Arkansas in the fiscal year for 2008 and 2,789 fugitive arrests in 13 the fiscal year for 2009; and 14 15 WHEREAS, the United States Marshals Service has returned \$3,196,673 to 16 state and local law enforcement agencies in Arkansas in the fiscal year for 17 2008 and \$5,259,827 in the fiscal year for 2009; and 18 19 WHEREAS, the U.S. Marshals Service promotes the administration of 20 justice by protecting members of the federal judiciary, transporting and 21 incarcerating federal prisoners, and protecting witnesses in high profile 22 criminal prosecutions, and more; and 23 24 WHEREAS, the U.
