7	SENATE RESOLUTION
8	TO RECOGNIZE AND HONOR THE LIFE ACHIEVEMENTS OF
9	VICTOR VAUGHN.

13	TO RECOGNIZE AND HONOR THE LIFE
14	ACHIEVEMENTS OF VICTOR VAUGHN.

17	WHEREAS, at age 5, Victor Vaughn was admitted to St. Bernard's Hospital
18	for nine (9) months where he was diagnosed with polio during the height of
19	the epidemic. He was placed in an "iron lung" to help him breathe. His
20	parents were afraid to admit him to a polio ward, and the hospital was so far
21	away that they went to great strides to visit him often; and
22	
23	WHEREAS, an Ash Flat teacher, Ms. Bessie Martin, came to the Vaughn
24	home each Saturday with a week's worth of homework for Victor Vaughn,
25	sacrificing her Saturdays so that Victor could receive an education; and
26	
27	WHEREAS, Victor Vaughn began attending public school in the fourth
28	grade. The bus ride was a two-hour event, and his father, Victor Vaughn,
29	Sr., took a job as the bus driver so that Victor could attend school. Victor
30	Vaughn, Sr. would then wait in town for Victor to get out of school and make
31	the drive back to where he would work long after dark taking care of the
32	family's farm work; and
33	
34	WHEREAS, Victor Vaughn went on to graduate from high school in 1965 and
35	from Arkansas State University with a degree in business in 1969. He
36	married, had two children, and worked his way up to become the vice president



1	of finance of a manufacturing company with eighteen (18) divisions enabling
2	him to travel throughout the world; and
3	
4	WHEREAS, Victor Vaughn, known as "VTV" to his fan club, began playing
5	tennis as it was "prescribed" by his doctor. Ten years later he became the
6	nation's fifth-ranked wheelchair tennis player. Tennis is more than just
7	exercise to Mr. Vaughn; it is his passion. Playing tennis with his younger
8	brother, Steve, and winning tournaments are among his most cherished moments;
9	and
10	
11	WHEREAS, the matches Victor Vaughn participates in range from one to
12	two and a half (2 $1/2$ ) hours. The tournaments are sanctioned by the United
13	States Tennis Association, and the only difference in rules for wheelchair
14	competitors is that they are allowed two bounces instead of one. He plays
15	both singles and doubles with as many as one hundred and twenty (120)
16	competitors from all over the world; and
17	
18	WHEREAS, Victor Vaughn finished first in doubles and fifth in singles
19	in his most recent tennis season, and has brought home trophies from Atlanta,
20	GA, and Hilton Head, SC. He does not limit himself because of his
21	disabilities. He entered a 5K race in Memphis, TN, finishing in eighteen
22	(18) minutes, thirty (30) seconds; and
23	
24	WHEREAS, the Vaughn family history dates back to 1852 in Fulton County,
25	Arkansas. Victor Vaughn bought his grandfather's farm approximately seven
26	(7) years ago and hired a contractor to transform the one-thousand acre
27	cattle farm homestead that was in need of major repair back to its original
28	condition. The home, which was originally completed in 1860, is now listed
29	historically as the oldest frame home in Fulton County; and
30	
31	WHEREAS, Victor Vaughn served under governors Mike Huckabee and Mike
32	Beebe as a member of the Arkansas Independent Living Council; and
33	
34	WHEREAS, Victor Vaughn has taken a strong interest in public service
35	and seeing progress in his home district of Fulton County, Arkansas; and

1	whereas, at sixty-four (64) years young, vincent vaughn continues to
2	play in wheelchair tennis tournaments and pursue his interests in public
3	service,
4	
5	NOW THEREFORE,
6	BE IT RESOLVED BY THE SENATE OF THE EIGHTY-EIGHTH GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE
7	STATE OF ARKANSAS:
8	THAT the Senate recognizes and honors the life achievements of Mr.
9	Victor Vaughn.

11	BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED THAT upon adoption of this resolution, a copy be
12	mailed by the Secretary of the Senate to Mr. Victor Vaughn.
