21	WHEREAS, Hugh McClain of Buford, Arkansas, is being recognized by the								
22	Arkansas State Chamber of Commerce and Arkansas Farm Bureau for his work in								
23	Arkansas agriculture; and								
24									
25	WHEREAS, on March 11, 2011, Mr. McClain, 76, will take his place in the								
26	Arkansas Agriculture Hall of Fame alongside such agricultural notables as								
27 28	U.S. Sens. Dale Bumpers and David Pryor; the late poultry magnate Don Tyson;								
20 29	Tommy B. Lewis, owner and operator of the state's largest livestock market; and Richard Bell of Stuttgart, Arkansas, longtime chief executive officer of								
30	Riceland Foods Inc.; and								
31	Arceland Foods Inc., and								
32	WHEREAS, "God has been watching over me," McClain said. "I've had a lot								
33	of help from so many good and loyal friends and coworkers."; and

35	WHEREAS, Mr. McClain came home to Baxter County in 1969 after a decade								
36	of work with turkey growers across the Midwest as a sales and service

1 representative for Cargill Inc., an international producer and marketer of 2 all kinds of agricultural and industrial products and services for farmers; 3 and he said he had accumulated \$4,400 and a good understanding of the 4 business of growing commercial turkeys; and 5 6 WHEREAS, in the space of forty (40) years thereafter, Mr. McClain would 7 earn distinction as Arkansas' biggest independent turkey producer, a 8 cattleman, landowner, and banker; and 9 10 WHEREAS, at the height of Mr. McClain's turkey operations, he held 11 hands with forty-two (42) growers in Baxter, Marion, and Boone counties; and 12 though he divested a portion of his turkey operations in 2002, he continues to grow about five hundred thousand (500,000) turkeys a year to market weight 13 14 in fifteen (15) houses on his farm at Buford, Arkansas; and 15 16 WHEREAS, Baxter County Farm Bureau Federation chairman James Rhein said he and the Arkansas Farm Bureau nominated Mr. McClain because of his 17 contribution to north-central Arkansas in terms of enhancements to the 18 19 region's property tax base, jobs, and the general movement of agricultural products in north-central Arkansas that might otherwise not have happened, 20 21 saying, "There are many places in north-central Arkansas today that are worth 22 more because of Hugh McClain. He started from scratch more than once, and he 23 deserves this recognition."; and 24 25 WHEREAS, Arkansas State University - Mountain Home Chancellor Ed 26 Coulter said he has heard the story of McClain's success many times and has 27 encountered people across the United States who also have heard the McClain 28 story, 29 30 NOW THEREFORE, 31 BE IT RESOLVED BY THE SENATE OF THE EIGHTY-EIGHTH GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE 32 STATE OF ARKANSAS: 33 34 THAT the Senate commends Hugh McClain on his induction into the 35 Arkansas Agriculture Hall of Fame. 36
