22	BE IT RESOLVED BY THE SENATE OF THE EIGHTY-EIGHTH GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE
23	STATE OF ARKANSAS:

25	WHEREAS, the For Inspiration and Recognition of Science and Technology
26	(FIRST®) program, was founded in 1989 to inspire the youth of today to
27	participate in science and technology, that will carry forward to tomorrow;
28	and
29	
30	WHEREAS, FIRST® inspires young people to be science and technology
31	leaders, by encouraging them to participate in mentor-based programs that
32	build science, engineering, and technology skills, using their imaginations,
33	and build life skills, such as self-confidence and communication; and
34	
35	WHEREAS, nearly fifty (50) teams from across the State of Arkansas are
36	participating in FIRST®LEGO League and recently competed at the Arkansas

1	State FIRST®LEGO League Championship Tournament & Junior FIRST®LEGO League
2	Expo in Mountain Home, Arkansas; and
3	
4	WHEREAS, Baxter Healthcare Corporation has sponsored the Arkansas
5	FIRST®LEGO League Championship Tournament for twelve (12) years and the
6	FIRST® Robotics Competition Hall of Fame Team #16, the Bomb Squad, for
7	sixteen (16) years in Mountain Home, Arkansas; and
8	
9	WHEREAS, FIRST® is organized in "Regions" across the country, but due
10	to lack of high school participation, Arkansas does not belong to a region;
11	and
12	
13	WHEREAS, Arkansas has the opportunity to claim at least one hundred
14	thirty-three thousand dollars (\$133,000) in grant funds to encourage high
15	school FIRST® Robotics teams to form and participate; and
16	
17	WHEREAS, a high school-level regional FIRST® Robotics Competition would
18	be an excellent opportunity for Arkansas students; and
19	
20	WHEREAS, there are currently three (3) FIRST® Robotics high school
21	teams in Arkansas, and at least seven (7) more are needed in order to hold a
22	regional tournament in Arkansas; and
23	
24	WHEREAS, the J.C. Penney Company has agreed to sponsor sixteen (16)
25	FIRST® Robotics teams in Arkansas with a nine-thousand-five-hundred-dollar
26	(\$9,500) grant available per team; and
27	
28	WHEREAS, we the people of Arkansas want to applaud and commend the
29	students, volunteers, and sponsors who cultivate a love of science and
30	technology among our youth by participating in the FIRST® Robotics program;
31	and
32	
33	WHEREAS, we want to enlist the support of other generous corporations
34	and organizations in Arkansas to sponsor FIRST® Robotics teams at Arkansas
35	high schools and endeavor to celebrate the students' work at an Arkansas
36	FIRST® Robotics Competition; and

2	WHEREAS, we want to encourage the FIRST® Robotics program to hold a
3	regional FIRST® Robotics Tournament in Arkansas for high school students,
4	
5	NOW THEREFORE,
6	BE IT RESOLVED BY THE SENATE OF THE EIGHTY-EIGHTH GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE
7	STATE OF ARKANSAS:

9	That Arkansas resolves to applaud and support the students, volunteers,
10	and sponsors who participate in the FIRST® Robotics Program, and to hold a
11	regional FIRST® Robotics Tournament in Arkansas for high school students.
12	
13	BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that upon adoption of this resolution, an
14	appropriate copy shall be provided to Walter P. Havenstein, FIRST® Chairman
15	of the Board; CEO, Science Applications International Corporation (SAIC) and
16	to Meredith Novak, Operational Partner for the Arkansas FIRST®LEGO League
17	program.
