## For An Act To Be Entitled

AN ACT TO MAKE AN APPROPRIATION FOR PERSONAL  
SERVICES AND OPERATING EXPENSES FOR THE  
DEPARTMENT OF EDUCATION - ARKANSAS SCHOOL FOR THE  
BLIND FOR THE FISCAL YEAR ENDING JUNE 30, 2013;  
AND FOR OTHER PURPOSES.

## Subtitle

AN ACT FOR THE DEPARTMENT OF EDUCATION -  
ARKANSAS SCHOOL FOR THE BLIND APPROPRIATION  
FOR THE 2012-2013 FISCAL YEAR.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ARKANSAS:

SECTION 1. REGULAR SALARIES. There is hereby established for the  
Department of Education - Arkansas School for the Blind for the 2012-2013  
fiscal year, the following maximum number of regular employees.

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27       SECTION 2. EXTRA HELP. There is hereby authorized, for the Department  
 28 of Education - Arkansas School for the Blind for the 2012-2013 fiscal year,  
 29 the following maximum number of part-time or temporary employees, to be known  
 30 as "Extra Help", payable from funds appropriated herein for such purposes:  
 31 seventeen (17) temporary or part-time employees, when needed, at rates of pay  
 32 not to exceed those provided in the Uniform Classification and Compensation  
 33 Act, or its successor, or this act for the appropriate classification.

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35       SECTION 3. APPROPRIATION - STATE OPERATIONS. There is hereby  
 36 appropriated, to the Department of Education - Arkansas School for the Blind,

to be payable from the School for the Blind Fund Account, for personal services and operating expenses of the Department of Education - Arkansas School for the Blind - State Operations for the fiscal year ending June 30, 2013, the following:

There is hereby appropriated, to the Department of Education - Arkansas School for the Blind, to be payable from cash funds as defined by Arkansas Code 19-4-801 of the Department of Education - Arkansas School for the Blind, for operating expenses of the Department of Education - Arkansas School for the Blind - Cash Operations for the fiscal year ending June 30, 2013, the following:

SECTION 6. APPROPRIATION - BRAILLE AND LARGE PRINT TEXTBOOKS. There is hereby appropriated, to the Department of Education - Arkansas School for the Blind, to be payable from the School for the Blind Fund Account, for purchasing, copying, and shipping Braille and large print textbooks for the blind and visually impaired students attending the public schools in Arkansas by the Department of Education - Arkansas School for the Blind - Braille and Large Print Textbooks for the fiscal year ending June 30, 2013, the following:

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2 SECTION 7. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS  
3 CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW. TRANSFER  
4 PROVISION. Upon approval from the Chief Fiscal Officer of the State, the  
5 Arkansas School for the Blind shall transfer appropriation from Item No.(08)  
6 Summer Projects, in Section 3 of this Act, to Item No. (01) through Item No.  
7 (05) in Section 3 of this Act, to compensate staff who work during the summer  
8 months on summer projects, and to cover other expenses of summer project  
9 activities. The Summer Projects line item may also be used for the annual  
10 cost related to the compensation of eligible staff for shift differential pay  
11 as well as compensation of employees for performance of duties assigned as  
12 referenced in Section 8 of this Act. Such additional compensation shall not  
13 be construed as exceeding the maximum salary authorized for said employees.

14 The provisions of this section shall be in effect only from July 1,  
15 ~~2010~~ 2012 through June 30, ~~2011~~ 2013.  
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17 SECTION 8. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS  
18 CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW. SPECIAL  
19 ALLOWANCE. The Arkansas Schools for the Deaf and Blind may make special  
20 allowances available to any employee who performs one of the following duties  
21 in addition to their normal duties:

- 22 1) Teaching adult education classes, parent training, student tutorial  
23 services on weekends or evenings
- 24 2) Coaching one or more sports
- 25 3) Sponsoring a club or organization that involves additional hours  
26 outside of the normal working day
- 27 4) Interpretive Services

28 Compensation for additional duties may not exceed \$3,500 per school  
29 term for any one employee during each fiscal year. Such pay shall not be  
30 construed as exceeding the maximum salary authorized for said position.

31 The provisions of this section shall be in effect only from July 1,  
32 ~~2010~~ 2012 through June 30, ~~2011~~ 2013.  
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34 SECTION 9. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS  
35 CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW.  
36 ADDITIONAL SALARY/COMPENSATION PROVISION. No employee drawing a salary or

1 other form of compensation from the Arkansas Schools for the Deaf or Blind  
2 shall be paid an additional salary or receive additional compensation, other  
3 than reimbursement for actual expenses, from that agency, nor from any other  
4 agency or institution of higher education, except from the Superintendent's  
5 written certification to and approval by the Chief Fiscal Officer of the  
6 State that the work performed by the employee for the other position does not  
7 interfere with the proper and required performance of the employee's primary  
8 duties, and that the combined salary payments from both positions will not  
9 exceed the maximum annual salary for whichever of the two positions has the  
10 higher authorized maximum annual salary.

11 Any employee knowingly violating the provisions of this section shall  
12 be subject to immediate termination and shall be barred from employment by  
13 any agency or institution of the State of Arkansas for a period of not less  
14 than three (3) years or until such employee shall repay to the State of  
15 Arkansas any sums received by such employee in violation of this section,  
16 together with interest at a rate of ten percent (10%) per annum.

17 The provisions of this section shall be in effect only from July 1,  
18 ~~2010~~ 2012 through June 30, ~~2011~~ 2013.

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20 SECTION 10. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS  
21 CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW. SHARED  
22 SERVICES. The Chief Fiscal Officer of the State and the State Treasurer are  
23 authorized to establish a joint paying account in the State Treasury, upon  
24 direction of the Board of Trustees for the Arkansas School for the Blind and  
25 the Arkansas School for the Deaf. The Board may transfer positions, funds  
26 and appropriations to the paying account from either school to serve both  
27 schools in the areas of Accounting, Personnel, Inventory, Safety and Health  
28 Services.

29 Funding and appropriations for this account will be from transfers from  
30 the fund accounts and appropriations of each agency and shall be divided  
31 proportionately from each agency based on student population. Said funds  
32 shall be payable from the joint account as if the positions and other  
33 budgetary line items of appropriation had originally been established in the  
34 joint account. Supervision of this account and supervision of the positions  
35 within may come from either school as determined by the Board of Trustees.

36 The provisions of this section shall be in effect only from July 1,

~~2010~~ 2012 through June 30, ~~2011~~ 2013.

SECTION 11. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW. BRAILLE AND LARGE PRINT TEXTBOOKS. The State Board of Education shall make reasonable rules and regulations to implement the Braille and Large Print Textbooks appropriation and is hereby authorized to negotiate directly with publishers of Braille and Large Print Textbooks for the purchase of such textbooks. The Arkansas School for the Blind (ASB) is authorized to use funds from this account for costs associated with providing Braille Textbooks and Large Print Textbooks to public schools.

The provisions of this section shall be in effect only from July 1, ~~2010~~ 2012 through June 30, ~~2011~~ 2013.

SECTION 12. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW. SUMMER SCHOOL EMPLOYEES. Employees who, in addition to working during the regular school term, also work during summer months shall be authorized as additional compensation an amount not to exceed 1/12 of their annual salary for each month or part thereof worked. Such additional compensation shall not be construed as exceeding the maximum salary authorized for said employees. Payment of additional compensation shall be limited to employees in the following classifications:

The provisions of this section shall be in effect only from July 1, ~~2010~~ 2012 through June 30, ~~2011~~ 2013.

SECTION 13. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW. CERTIFIED MASTERS OR BACHELOR TEACHERS ENTERING STATE SERVICE. Upon the superintendent's certification to the State Personnel Administrator of prior

1 service at an educational institution, the salary of teachers entering state  
 2 service as teachers for the sensory impaired may be adjusted to a rate of pay  
 3 closest to but not less than the annual salary they would have received from  
 4 their previous employer, effective upon employment at ASB.

5 The provisions of this section shall be in effect only from July 1,  
 6 ~~2010-2012~~ through June 30, ~~2011~~ 2013.

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 8 SECTION 14. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS  
 9 CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW. TEACHER  
 10 SALARY INCREASE. In the event that an act is enacted in which the public  
 11 schools receive funds from the General Assembly to raise the salaries of  
 12 teachers employed in the public school districts, the Arkansas School for the  
 13 Deaf and the Arkansas School for the Blind shall be included.

14 The provisions of this section shall be in effect only from July 1,  
 15 ~~2010~~ 2012 through June 30, ~~2011~~ 2013.

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 17 SECTION 15. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS  
 18 CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW. SPECIAL  
 19 RATES OF PAY. Due to the need to meet the minimum compensation schedule as  
 20 established by Act 74 of the 2nd Extraordinary Session of the 84th General  
 21 Assembly, or its successor, for public school teachers, counselors, and  
 22 librarians and other education professionals as listed in subsection (a)  
 23 below, the Arkansas School for the Blind is authorized to adjust current or  
 24 new employees to at least the minimum level of compensation for public school  
 25 employees.

26 For current or new employees in the positions listed in subsection (a)  
 27 below, the Arkansas School for the Blind may implement salary adjustments to  
 28 maintain equity between their teacher salaries and those of Central Arkansas  
 29 Public School Systems only after a plan for determining and implementing  
 30 those adjustments has been reviewed by the Office of Personnel Management and  
 31 by the Personnel Committee of the Arkansas Legislative Council and approved  
 32 by the Chief Fiscal Officer of the State.

33 For purposes of implementing the plan, the Arkansas School for the  
 34 Blind is authorized special rates of pay up to the maximum of the assigned  
 35 grade for classifications listed in subsection (a) below.

10 Funding for the minimum compensation provided for in this section that  
 11 is supported in whole or in part from general revenues, shall, if required,  
 12 be provided by a transfer from the Merit Adjustment Fund to the proper fund  
 13 or fund account and in such amounts as determined by the Chief Fiscal Officer  
 14 of the State. The Arkansas School for the Blind shall, in addition to the  
 15 funds provided in this Act for Annual Career Service Recognition Payments  
 16 from the Merit Adjustment Fund, make available any funding generated from  
 17 agency salary savings for such purposes from the funds or fund accounts as  
 18 provided by law.

19 The provisions of this section shall be in effect only from July 1,  
 20 ~~2010~~ 2012 through June 30, ~~2011~~ 2013.

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 22 SECTION 16. COMPLIANCE WITH OTHER LAWS. Disbursement of funds  
 23 authorized by this act shall be limited to the appropriation for such agency  
 24 and funds made available by law for the support of such appropriations; and  
 25 the restrictions of the State Procurement Law, the General Accounting and  
 26 Budgetary Procedures Law, the Revenue Stabilization Law, the Regular Salary  
 27 Procedures and Restrictions Act, or their successors, and other fiscal  
 28 control laws of this State, where applicable, and regulations promulgated by  
 29 the Department of Finance and Administration, as authorized by law, shall be  
 30 strictly complied with in disbursement of said funds.

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 32 SECTION 17. LEGISLATIVE INTENT. It is the intent of the General  
 33 Assembly that any funds disbursed under the authority of the appropriations  
 34 contained in this act shall be in compliance with the stated reasons for  
 35 which this act was adopted, as evidenced by the Agency Requests, Executive  
 36 Recommendations and Legislative Recommendations contained in the budget

1 manuals prepared by the Department of Finance and Administration, letters, or  
2 summarized oral testimony in the official minutes of the Arkansas Legislative  
3 Council or Joint Budget Committee which relate to its passage and adoption.  
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5 SECTION 18. EMERGENCY CLAUSE. It is found and determined by the  
6 General Assembly, that the Constitution of the State of Arkansas prohibits  
7 the appropriation of funds for more than a one (1) year period; that the  
8 effectiveness of this Act on July 1, 2012 is essential to the operation of  
9 the agency for which the appropriations in this Act are provided, and that in  
10 the event of an extension of the legislative session, the delay in the  
11 effective date of this Act beyond July 1, 2012 could work irreparable harm  
12 upon the proper administration and provision of essential governmental  
13 programs. Therefore, an emergency is hereby declared to exist and this Act  
14 being necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health  
15 and safety shall be in full force and effect from and after July 1, 2012.  
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
