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19	WHEREAS, Mr. Lloyd George of Birta, Arkansas, died on Saturday,
20	February 25, 2012, at the age of eighty-five (85) years; and
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22	WHEREAS, Mr. George was a lifelong and proud resident of Yell County,
23	Arkansas, a stand-out athlete and graduate of Ola High School and a
24	basketball letterman, track letterman, and graduate of Hendrix College, and
25	later a graduate student at the University of Arkansas in Fayetteville; and
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27	WHEREAS, Mr. George possessed a lifelong passion for education and for
28	educating, serving the young people of Arkansas as a teacher and coach in
29	Fourche Valley, Ola, Morrilton, and Gillette; and
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31	WHEREAS, Mr. George was a small businessman in his local community,
32	opening a butane gas company in Danville, Arkansas, a community he would come
33	to call his home, a place where he raised a family with his wife Betty Sue,
34	and where he remained active in sports, playing on independent basketball and
35	baseball teams throughout the 1950s; and
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1 WHEREAS, Mr. George provided for a family that would eventually grow to 2 include four (4) children and nine (9) grandchildren; and 3 4 WHEREAS, Mr. George began his illustrious political career by being 5 elected as Mayor of Danville, Arkansas, and in 1962 was elected to his first 6 term as a member of the House of Representatives in the Arkansas General 7 Assembly, a career that eventually spanned four (4) decades; and 8 9 WHEREAS, as a member of the Arkansas General Assembly, Mr. George 10 demonstrated a passion for the citizens of Arkansas as he served as Chairman 11 of the Arkansas Legislative Council, Chairman of the Joint Auditing 12 Committee, House Speaker Pro Tempore, and Chairman of the Southwest Energy 13 Council; and 14 15 WHEREAS, Mr. George worked tirelessly and ultimately successfully in 16 the rebuilding of the Lodge at Mount Magazine where the people of Arkansas 17 recognized his contributions to this state by naming the west wing of the \$35 18 million facility in his honor; and 19 20 WHEREAS, following his retirement from public life, Mr. George returned 21 to his beloved farm in Yell County where he continued to follow and be active 22 in all aspects of political and community life; and 23 24 WHEREAS, Mr. George proudly watched as his family continued to prosper 25 and his eldest son, Nathan, was elected to the same legislative seat held by 26 Mr. George; and 27 28 WHEREAS, the House of Representatives wishes to publicly recognize Mr. 29 George's contributions to the State of Arkansas and his local community, 30 31 NOW THEREFORE, 32 BE IT RESOLVED BY THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES OF THE EIGHTY-EIGHTH GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ARKANSAS: 33 34 35 THAT the House of Representatives recognizes Lloyd George's commitment, 36 hard work, dedication, and years of service to the State of Arkansas and his
