2 SECTION 6. APPROPRIATION - PUBLIC SCHOOL ATHLETIC TRAINER PILOT PROGRAM 3 GRANTS. There is hereby appropriated, to the Department of Education, to be 4 payable from the Department of Education Public School Fund Account, for 5 Public School Athletic Trainer Pilot Program grants for personal services to 6 provide access to athletic trainers in public schools and to promote the 7 health and safety of students by the Department of Education for the fiscal 8 year ending June 30, 2013, the sum of......\$200,000.

10 SECTION 7. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS 11 CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW. FUND 12 ALLOCATION. The appropriation for the Isolated Funding line item in Section 1 13 of this Act may be fully funded. Any funding and appropriation for Isolated 14 Funding that is not utilized shall be transferred to the appropriation for 15 Special Needs Isolated Funding in Section 1 of this Act and shall be used 16 there for fully funding each subsection (c) through (f) of Arkansas Code 17 §6-20-604 on a pro rata basis until the available funds are exhausted. Pro 18 rata basis is defined as providing each district qualifying for additional 19 funding under subsections (c) through (f) a proportionate share based on how 20 each district's additional funding amount bears to the total additional 21 funding amounts for all qualifying districts. If any funding and 22 appropriation remains after funding each subsection (c) through (f) of 23 Arkansas Code §6-20-604 the remaining balance shall be used to fund the 24 provisions of Arkansas Code §6-20-604 (h) on an equal basis until the 25 available funds are exhausted.

26 The provisions of this section shall be in effect only from July 1, 27 <u>2010</u> 2012 through June 30, 2011 2013.

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SECTION 8. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS 29 30 CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW. GRANTS TO 31 SCHOOL DISTRICTS. For the purposes of distributing the Grants To School Districts appropriation in Section 1 of this Act, "school district" means a 32 33 school district which contracts with a school district in an adjoining state 34 for the education of some of the pupils within the Arkansas school district 35 because the portion of the school district wherein such pupils live is 36 completely separated from the remainder of the school district by a reservoir

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1 covering at least 12,000 acres at normal water level, and where to attend 2 school in their own district, the pupils of said portion would be required to 3 travel or to be transported a distance (measured by the nearest highway or 4 road route) of more than 35 miles round trip and pass through another school 5 district or districts. The Department of Education shall distribute the 6 monies appropriated for Grants to School Districts in Section 1 of this Act 7 to such school districts as reimbursement for expenses incurred in educating 8 the pupils residing in the separated portion of the school district. The 9 payments are to be limited to the amount of available appropriation. Such 10 school districts shall file a request for reimbursement with the Department 11 of Education and provide the Department of Education with such documentation 12 as is deemed necessary.

13 The provisions of this section shall be in effect only from July 1, 14 2010 2012 through June 30, 2011 2013.

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16 SECTION 9. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS 17 CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW. SPECIAL 18 EDUCATION SERVICES. The funds appropriated in the line item "Special 19 Education Services" in Section 1 of this Act shall be used to provide 20 extended year summer programs for handicapped students in need of such 21 services, to provide special education services to foster children who are 22 wards of the State, and to provide funds for the payment of salaries of 23 special education supervisors. The Department of Education shall distribute 24 such funds in the manner necessary to carry out the intent of this Section. 25 The provisions of this section shall be in effect only from July 1, 26 2010 2012 through June 30, 2011 2013.

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28 SECTION 10. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS 29 CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW. 30 DESEGREGATION EXPENSES. (A) For the fiscal year ending June 30, and for each 31 fiscal year thereafter, the Department of Education shall from time to time 32 as needed, certify to the State Treasurer and the Chief Fiscal Officer of the 33 State, the amount of funds disbursed or approved to be disbursed by the 34 Department of Education for desegregation expenses under any "Desegregation 35 Settlement Agreement". Upon the receipt of such certification, the State 36 Treasurer, after making those deductions as set out in Arkansas Code 19-5-

1 202(b)(2)(B), shall also deduct from the net general revenues the amount 2 certified and transfer this amount to the Department of Education Public 3 School Fund Account there to be used exclusively for payment of or 4 reimbursement for expenses incurred from the Department of Education Public 5 School Fund Account under any "Desegregation Settlement Agreement". 6 7 SECTION 11. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS 8 CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW. 9 CONSOLIDATION INCENTIVE. The appropriation contained herein for Consolidation Incentive shall be allocated in accordance with rules and regulations 10 11 established by the State Board of Education. 12 The provisions of this section shall be in effect only from July 1, 13 2010 2012 through June 30, 2011 2013. 14 15 SECTION 12. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS 16 CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW. 17 RESIDENTIAL CENTERS/JUVENILE DETENTION. The funds appropriated herein for 18 Residential Centers/Juvenile Detention shall be allocated in accordance with 19 rules and regulations established by the State Board of Education. 20 The provisions of this section shall be in effect only from July 1, 21 2010 2012 through June 30, 2011 2013. 22 23 SECTION 13. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW. TRANSFER 24 25 AUTHORITY. The Commissioner of the Department of Education, with the approval 26 of the Chief Fiscal Officer of the State and after approval by the Arkansas 27 Legislative Council or Joint Budget Committee, is hereby authorized to 28 request necessary appropriation transfers and any other budget related 29 adjustments necessary within the Department of Education. Provided, however, 30 that the Department of Education shall be limited to submitting no more than 31 two transfer requests during any fiscal year.

Determining the maximum number of employees and the maximum amount of appropriation and general revenue funding for a state agency each fiscal year is the prerogative of the General Assembly. This is usually accomplished by delineating such maximums in the appropriation act(s) for a state agency and the general revenue allocations authorized for each fund and fund account by

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1 amendment to the Revenue Stabilization law. Further, the General Assembly 2 has determined that the Department of Education may operate more efficiently 3 if some flexibility is provided to the Commissioner of the Department of 4 Education authorizing broad powers under the Transfer Authority provision 5 herein. Therefore, it is both necessary and appropriate that the General 6 Assembly maintain oversight by requiring prior approval of the Legislative 7 Council or Joint Budget Committee as provided by this section. The 8 requirement of approval by the Legislative Council or Joint Budget Committee 9 is not a severable part of this section. If the requirement of approval by 10 the Legislative Council or Joint Budget Committee is ruled unconstitutional 11 by a court jurisdiction, this entire section is void.

12 The provisions of this section shall be in effect only from July 1, 13 2010 2012 through June 30, 2011 2013.

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15 SECTION 14. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS 16 CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW. AETN 17 DOCUMENTED QUIZ BOWL COSTS. Of the total amount of appropriation and funds 18 authorized herein to the Department of Education - for the Quiz Bowl each 19 fiscal year, an amount not to exceed forty thousand dollars (\$40,000) each 20 fiscal year may be made available to the Department of Education -21 Educational Television Division for its documented costs associated with the 22 Quiz Bowl.

23 The provisions of this section shall be in effect only from July 1,
24 <u>2010</u> <u>2012</u> through June 30, 2011 <u>2013</u>.

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26 SECTION 15. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS 27 CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW. 28 INTERVENTION BLOCK GRANTS FUNDING RESTRICTION. The Department of Education 29 shall make available from the Intervention Block Grants appropriation 30 authorized by this Act, one hundred thousand dollars (\$100,000) each fiscal 31 year for the annual expenses of the Quiz Bowl, thirteen thousand five hundred 32 dollars (\$13,500) each fiscal year for Creativity in Arkansas, Inc. for 33 grants up to \$1,000 each for students and chaperones, thirteen thousand five 34 hundred dollars (\$13,500) each fiscal year for Destination Imagination, and 35 one hundred thousand dollars (\$100,000) each fiscal year for the State 36 History Day Competition, and seventy-five thousand dollars (\$75,000) each

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1 fiscal year for a grant to the Arkansas Science Fair Association for grants 2 to regional and the state science fairs. The Department of Education shall 3 allocate General Revenue funding totaling no less than three hundred two 4 thousand dollars (\$302,000) each fiscal year from the Department of Education 5 Public School Fund Account to support the annual expenses of the Quiz Bowl, 6 the Creativity in Arkansas, Inc. for grants up to \$1,000 each for students 7 and chaperones, Destination Imagination, the State History Day Competition, 8 and the Arkansas Science Fair Association for grants to regional and state 9 science fairs. The Department shall either expend or have committed for 10 expenditure the monies allocated for the Quiz Bowl, Creativity in Arkansas, 11 Inc., Destination Imagination, the State History Day Competition, and 12 Arkansas Science Fair Association grants as authorized herein in order to 13 fulfill the provisions of this section.

14 The provisions of this section shall be in effect only from July 1, 15 <u>2010</u> <u>2012</u> through June 30, 2011 <u>2013</u>.

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17 SECTION 16. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS CODE 18 NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW. EAST FUNDING 19 PROVISION. Of the total amount appropriated for Technology Grants each fiscal 20 year, an amount of not less than two million dollars (\$2,000,000) or eighteen 21 percent (18%), whichever is greater each fiscal year, shall be awarded 22 through a grant or professional services contract for EAST infrastructure, 23 personnel, and operating expenses. The EAST infrastructure grant or contract 24 for personal services and operating expenses shall be awarded to an entity 25 that has personnel or experience, or both, in implementing the EAST 26 Initiative.

27 The provisions of this section shall be in effect only from July 1, 28 2010 2012 through June 30, 2011 2013.

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30 SECTION 17. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS 31 CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW. CENTER 32 FOR QUALITY TEACHING AND LEARNING FUNDING PROVISION. Of the total 33 appropriation authorized by this Act for Technology Grants the Department of 34 Education shall make available one hundred eighty-seven thousand five hundred 35 seventy-five dollars (\$187,575) each fiscal year for Center for Quality 36 Teaching and Learning initiatives to teach students computer repair in a

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hands-on environment. The Department of Education shall allocate General Revenue funding totaling no less than one hundred eighty-seven thousand five hundred seventy-five dollars (\$187,575) each fiscal year from the Department of Education Public School Fund Account to support the Center for Quality Teaching and Learning. The Department shall either expend or have committed for expenditure the monies allocated for the Center for Quality Teaching and Learning in order to fulfill the provisions of this section.

8 The provisions of this section shall be in effect only from July 1,
9 <u>2010</u> <u>2012</u> through June 30, <u>2011</u> <u>2013</u>.

10

11 SECTION 18. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS 12 CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW. DISTRESSED SCHOOL DISTRICT SUPPORT. The funds appropriated in the line item 13 14 "Distressed School District Support" in Section 1 of this Act may be used for 15 technical assistance offered by the Department of Education to school 16 districts in academic distress that can include, but is not limited to, 17 teacher specialists, principal specialists, and other personnel assigned by 18 the department. These funds may also be used for alternative research-based 19 technical assistance or programs. Criteria for selecting and approving 20 alternative research-based technical assistance or programs are to be 21 promulgated as a rule by the State Board of Education, provided that 22 alternative staffing and/or compensation programs for teachers shall be 23 approved by at least a majority of the teachers in the school, schools, or 24 school district participating in the program.

25 The provisions of this section shall be in effect only from July 1, 26 <u>2010</u> 2012 through June 30, 2011 2013.

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SECTION 19. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW. PROFESSIONAL DEVELOPMENT. Of the total amount appropriated for Professional Development Funding, four million dollars (\$4,000,000) may be authorized by the Commissioner of the Department of Education to be used by the Department of Education to develop and implement statewide professional development support systems for teachers that will benefit student achievement.

35 The provisions of this section shall be in effect only from July 1, 36 2010 2012 through June 30, 2011 2013.

2 SECTION 20. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW. 3 4 RETIREMENT MATCHING. Beginning with the 1996-97 school year, Local School 5 Districts shall pay the teacher retirement employer contribution rate for any 6 eligible employee in accordance with rules and regulations established by the 7 Teacher Retirement Board of Directors. The appropriation contained herein for 8 Teacher Retirement Matching each fiscal year shall be used to provide the 9 employer matching for employees of the Cooperative Education Services Areas, 10 Vocational Centers, Arkansas Easter Seals and the school operated by the 11 Department of Correction.

12 The provisions of this section shall be in effect only from July 1,
13 2010 2012 through June 30, 2011 2013.

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15 SECTION 21. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS
 16 CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW. OPEN 17 ENROLLMENT VIRTUAL CHARTER SCHOOL FUNDING RESTRICTIONS.

Regardless of any provision of law to the contrary, no school district shall receive state funding for the 2010-2011 <u>2012-2013</u> school year for those students who are included in the district's average daily membership for the previous school year but who are attending any open-enrollment charter school that uses internet, long-distance, or virtual technology as the primary method of teaching.

27 SECTION 22. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS 28 CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW. BETTER 29 CHANCE PROGRAM ADMINISTRATIVE FEES. The Department of Education is hereby 30 authorized to expend a maximum of two percent (2%) of available funds for 31 administration of the Better Chance Program. Up to 1.8% of available funds 32 shall be used to administer the program and to monitor program grantees to 33 ensure compliance with programmatic standards. Prior to the utilization of 34 the remaining 0.2% of available funds, the Department of Education shall seek 35 prior review and approval of the Arkansas Legislative Council or Joint Budget 36 Committee by providing a written request to include the following: a) the

Department's reason(s) for the use of the funds and b) the amount of funds
 that will be expended. The Department may contract with the Division of Child
 Care and Early Childhood Education to administer the program.

4 Determining the maximum number of employees and the maximum amount of 5 appropriation and general revenue funding for a state agency each fiscal year 6 is the prerogative of the General Assembly. This is usually accomplished by 7 delineating such maximums in the appropriation act(s) for a state agency and 8 the general revenue allocations authorized for each fund and fund account by 9 amendment to the Revenue Stabilization law. Therefore, it is both necessary 10 and appropriate that the General Assembly maintain oversight by requiring 11 prior approval of the Legislative Council or Joint Budget Committee as 12 provided by this section. The requirement of approval by the Legislative 13 Council or Joint Budget Committee is not a severable part of this section. 14 If the requirement of approval by the Legislative Council or Joint Budget 15 Committee is ruled unconstitutional by a court of competent jurisdiction, 16 this entire section is void.

The Arkansas Department of Education is requested to 23 calculate Average Teacher Salary in the Department's Annual Statistical 24 Report to not include extra duty funds. Specifically, the Department is 25 requested to calculate the Average Teacher Salary amount using the National 26 Education Association definitions for Average Salary for Classroom Teachers. 27 The Arkansas Department of Education shall submit this data annually to the 28 National Education Association in accordance with that organization's 29 deadlines for submission for their report "Rankings and Estimates" which 30 includes state-by-state teacher salary comparisons.

32 SECTION 24. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS 33 CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW. CARRY 34 FORWARD. Any unexpended balance of monies allocated for the Arkansas Better 35 Chance for School Success Program remaining on June 30, 2011 <u>2013</u>, in the 36 Department of Education Public School Fund Account shall be designated and

1 retained for the Arkansas Better Chance for School Success Program.

2 Any carry forward of unexpended balance of funding as authorized 3 herein, may be carried forward under the following conditions:

4 (1) Prior to June 30, 2011 2013 the Agency shall by written statement
5 set forth its reason(s) for the need to carry forward said funding to the
6 Department of Finance and Administration Office of Budget;

7 (2) The Department of Finance and Administration Office of Budget 8 shall report to the Arkansas Legislative Council all amounts carried forward 9 by the September Arkansas Legislative Council or Joint Budget Committee 10 meeting which report shall include the name of the Agency, Board, Commission 11 or Institution and the amount of the funding carried forward, the program 12 name or line item, the funding source of that appropriation and a copy of the 13 written request set forth in (1) above;

PUBLIC 31 SCHOOL RETIREE HEALTH INSURANCE. The Employee Benefits Division of the 32 Department of Finance and Administration may use up to eleven dollars and 33 twenty cents (\$11.20) from each contribution made under Arkansas Code 34 §6-17-1117 (a) to offset the cost of health insurance premiums to eligible 35 members electing to participate in the public school employees' health insurance program as a retiree. 36

2 SECTION 26. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW. 3 4 ARKANSAS/STRIVE PROGRAM TRANSFER. The Chief Fiscal Officer of the State 5 shall transfer on his books and those of the State Treasurer and the State 6 Auditor, the sum of two hundred thousand dollars (\$200,000) during each 7 fiscal year from the Department of Education Public School Fund Account to 8 the University of Arkansas at Little Rock Fund, specifically to provide 9 funding for the Arkansas/STRIVE Program. HEALTH 17 The appropriation contained herein for Public School Employee INSURANCE. 18 Insurance each fiscal year shall be used to provide the state contribution 19 for insurance premiums for employees of the Cooperative Education Services 20 Areas, Vocational Centers, and the school operated by the Department of 21 Correction who participate in the Arkansas Public School Life and Health 22 Insurance Program.

23 The provisions of this section shall be in effect only from July 1,
24 <u>2010</u> <u>2012</u> through June 30, 2011 <u>2013</u>.

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SECTION 28. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW. ALTERNATIVE LEARNING ENVIRONMENT. The Department of Education may provide funding for Alternative Learning Environment Programs in excess of the regulatory limitation of six (6) hours per day for those programs that operate more than twelve hours per day, in a proportionate manner and upon special request to the Department of Education.

The provisions of this section shall be in effect only from July 1,
2010 2012 through June 30, 2011 2013.

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SECTION 29. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS

CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW. STATE
 FUND RESTRICTIONS. No state funds shall be used for abortion referral in
 public schools, or for abortion services. Funds shall be expended in
 accordance with Arkansas Code Annotated §6-18-703.

5 The provisions of this section shall be in effect only from July 1,
6 2010 2012 through June 30, 2011 2013.

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8 SECTION 30. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS 9 CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW. 10 ADDITIONAL PUBLIC SCHOOL EMPLOYEE HEALTH INSURANCE FUNDING PROVISION. 11 Effective for the plan year beginning October 1, 2010 2012, if ninety-eight 12 percent (98%) of the uniform rate of tax used in the calculation of State 13 Foundation Funding Aid for fiscal year 2010-2011 2012-2013 exceeds nine 14 hundred twenty million seven hundred thirty-one thousand eight hundred 15 nineteen dollars (\$920,731,819), the Department of Education shall pay up to 16 fifteen million dollars (\$15,000,000) of the total increase over the nine 17 hundred twenty million seven hundred thirty-one thousand eight hundred 18 nineteen dollars (\$920,731,819) to the Employee Benefits Division of the 19 Department of Finance and Administration in additional health insurance 20 contributions for eligible employees electing to participate in the public 21 school employees' health insurance program administered by the State and 22 Public School Life and Health Insurance Board.

The Department of Education shall make the contributions by transferring funds to the division in quarterly installments. Funds provided by the Department of Education to the division under this section shall be administered by the board for the benefit of the employee participants of the public school employees' health insurance program.

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31 SECTION 31. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. Arkansas Code § 6-20-604(e) reads as 32 follows:

(e)(1) Except as provided in subdivision (e)(2) of this section, a school district meeting the requirements of subsection (b) of this section shall receive an amount equal to ten percent (10%) of the foundation funding received by the school district under § 6-20-2305(a)(2) based on the three-

quarter average daily membership of the isolated school area under § 6-20-2305(a)(2) if the school district has school facilities open for kindergarten through grade twelve (K-12) in one (1) or more isolated schools meeting the requirements of subsection (b) of this section.

5 (2) A school district shall receive an amount equal to ten percent 6 (10%) of the foundation funding received by the school district under § 6-20-7 2305(a)(2) based on the three-quarter average daily membership of the 8 isolated school area under § 6-20-2305(a)(2) if:

9 (A) The school district has school facilities serving students 10 in any grade in kindergarten through grade twelve (K-12) in one (1) or more 11 isolated schools meeting the requirements of subsection (b) of this section; 12 and

13 (B) The school district closed an isolated facility serving
14 students in grades seven (7) through twelve (12) between January 1, 2008, and
15 July 1, 2008.

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17 SECTION 32. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS 18 CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW. 19 SUPPLEMENTAL TRANSPORTATION. The Department of Education shall budget, 20 allocate and commit for expenditure five hundred thousand dollars (\$500,000) 21 for the appropriation made herein for "Supplemental Transportation". The 22 Department shall use such funding to address extraordinary transportation 23 needs of public school districts. The State Board of Education shall 24 promulgate such rules and regulations as may be necessary to implement this 25 provision, which shall be reviewed by the House and Senate Interim Committees 26 on Education.

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28 SECTION 33. COMPLIANCE WITH OTHER LAWS. Disbursement of funds 29 authorized by this act shall be limited to the appropriation for such agency 30 and funds made available by law for the support of such appropriations; and 31 the restrictions of the State Procurement Law, the General Accounting and Budgetary Procedures Law, the Revenue Stabilization Law, the Regular Salary 32 33 Procedures and Restrictions Act, or their successors, and other fiscal 34 control laws of this State, where applicable, and regulations promulgated by 35 the Department of Finance and Administration, as authorized by law, shall be 36 strictly complied with in disbursement of said funds.

SECTION 34. LEGISLATIVE INTENT. It is the intent of the General Assembly that any funds disbursed under the authority of the appropriations contained in this act shall be in compliance with the stated reasons for which this act was adopted, as evidenced by the Agency Requests, Executive Recommendations and Legislative Recommendations contained in the budget manuals prepared by the Department of Finance and Administration, letters, or summarized oral testimony in the official minutes of the Arkansas Legislative Council or Joint Budget Committee which relate to its passage and adoption. SECTION 35. EMERGENCY CLAUSE. It is found and determined by the General Assembly, that the Constitution of the State of Arkansas prohibits the appropriation of funds for more than a one (1) year period; that the effectiveness of this Act on July 1, 2012 is essential to the operation of the agency for which the appropriations in this Act are provided, and that in the event of an extension of the legislative session, the delay in the effective date of this Act beyond July 1, 2012 could work irreparable harm upon the proper administration and provision of essential governmental programs. Therefore, an emergency is hereby declared to exist and this Act being necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health and safety shall be in full force and effect from and after July 1, 2012.
