17	BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ARKANSAS:

19	SECTION 1. Arkansas Code Title 17 is amended to add an additional	
20	chapter to read as follows:	
21	<u>Chapter 108 — NATUROPATHIC PRACTITIONERS</u>

23	<u>Subchapter 1 — General Provisions</u>	
24	17 100 101	
25	<u>17-108-101.</u>	
26	This chapter shall be known and may be cited as the "Naturopathic	
27	<u>Practitioner Act".</u>	
28	17-108-102. Findings and purpose.	
29 30		
30 31	(a) The General Assembly finds that: (1) A significant number of the citizens of this state are	
32	turning to naturopathic practitioners for their healthcare needs; and	
33	(2) Naturopathy is a distinct health care profession that	
34	affects the public health, safety, and welfare and provides the public with	
35	freedom of choice in health care.	
36	(b) This chapter is intended to:	
	7. \	

1	(1) Provide standards for the licensing and regulation of
2	naturopathy to protect the public health, safety, and welfare; and
3	(2) Provide a means of identifying qualified naturopathic
4	practitioners.
5	
6	17-108-103. Definitions.
7	As used in this chapter:
8	(1) "Approved naturopathic college" means a college or university
9	granting the degree of Doctor of Naturopathy, Doctor of Naturopathic Health
10	Care, or Doctor of Nutritional Science that:
11	(A) Is accredited by the federal government or accredited and
12	approved by a nationally recognized accreditation and certification board
13	such as the Council on Naturopathic Medical Education or American Association
14	of Naturopathic Medical Colleges;
15	(B) Has candidate-for-accreditation status with the accrediting
16	agency; or
17	(C) Has been approved by the Naturopathic Practitioners Advisory
18	Committee after the college was investigated and found to meet education
19	standards equivalent to those established by the accrediting agency;
20	(2) "Natural antibiotics" means antimicrobial, antifungal, and
21	antiprotozoal agents that are naturally occurring substances or manufactured
22	substances that are substantially identical to the naturally occurring
23	substances;
24	(3) "Natural medicines" means food, food extracts, and dietary
25	supplements as defined by the Federal Food, Drug, and Cosmetic Act, 21
26	<u>U.S.C.</u> , Chapter 9, as in effect January 1, 2013, homeopathic remedies, plant
27	substances that are not designated as prescription drugs or controlled
28	substances, over-the-counter medications, and substances prepared according
29	to the official Homeopathic Pharmacopoeia of the United States, as in effect
30	January 1, 2013;
31	(4) "Naturopathic medicine" means a system of health care practiced by
32	naturopathic practitioners for the prevention, evaluation, and care of human
33	health conditions that uses education, natural substances, and remedies to
34	support and stimulate the individual's intrinsic self-healing processes;
35	(5)(A) "Naturopathic physical modality" means the use of the physical
36	agents of air, water, heat, cold, sound, light, and electromagnetic non-

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ionizing radiation and the physical modalities of electrotherapy, 1 2 biofeedback, diathermy, ultraviolet light, ultrasound, hydrotherapy, and 3 exercise. 4 (B) "Naturopathic physical modality" does not include the 5 practice of physical therapy, acupuncture, or chiropractic, unless the 6 naturopath is qualified and has passed an examination approved by an 7 appropriate board to practice in physical therapy, acupuncture, or 8 chiropractic; 9 (6) "Naturopathic practitioner" means a person who is licensed by the 10 Arkansas State Board of Acupuncture and Related Techniques and Naturopathic 11 Medicine to practice naturopathy; 12 (7) "Practice of naturopathy" means a system of health care for the 13 prevention and care of human conditions, injuries, and diseases that uses 14 education, natural substances, and natural therapies to support and stimulate 15 the patient's intrinsic self-healing processes; and 16 (8) "Topical preparations" means over-the-counter preparations for 17 application to the skin. 18 19 17-108-104. Exceptions. 20 (a) This chapter does not: 21 (1) Prevent any other professional who is licensed, certified, 22 or registered under the laws of this state from providing services consistent 23 with the professional's scope of practice; 24 (2) Apply to a student of naturopathy who is currently enrolled 25 in an approved naturopathic course of study and who gratuitously evaluates human conditions under the direct supervision of a naturopathic physician 26 27 regulated under the laws of this state if the student's activities are within 28 the scope of practice of the supervising naturopathic practitioner and are 29 limited to activity consistent with the scope of practice authorized by this 30 ch<u>apter;</u> 31 (3) Prohibit or restrict a person engaged in the sale of 32 vitamins, health foods, dietary supplements, herbs, or other products of 33 nature not otherwise prohibited under state or federal law; 34 (4) Prohibit a person from providing nutritional advice, giving

advice concerning proper nutrition, or giving information as to the use and

role of food and food ingredients, including dietary supplements, except that

1	providing nutritional advice under this subdivision does not include the
2	authority to:
3	(A) Practice medicine or surgery;
4	(B) Undertake the treatment or cure of a disease, pain,
5	injury, deformity, or physical or mental condition; or
6	(C) State that a product might cure a disease, pain,
7	injury, deformity, or other condition; or
8	(5) Apply to a naturopathic practitioner who is licensed in
9	another state, a territory of the United States, or the District of Columbia
10	if the state, territory, or the District of Columbia requires credentials
11	equivalent to those of this chapter and who is called into this state for
12	consultation with another naturopathic practitioner licensed in this state.
13	(b) This chapter does not apply to:
14	(1) The activities and services of members of other professions
15	<u>licensed</u> or certified by the state performing counseling consistent with the
16	laws of this state, their training, and any code of ethics of their
17	professions, if they do not represent themselves by any title or description
18	in the manner prescribed by § 17-108-303, including without limitation:
19	(A) Physicians;
20	(B) Registered nurses;
21	(C) Psychologists;
22	(D) Social workers;
23	(E) Marriage and family therapists;
24	(F) Chemical dependency counselors;
25	(G) Physician assistants;
26	(H) Occupational therapists;
27	(I) Optometrists;
28	(J) Christian Science practitioners; or
29	(K) Other recognized religious practitioners;
30	(2) The activities, services, titles, and descriptions of
31	persons licensed to practice law;
32	(3)(A) A student in training in a medical school approved by the
33	State Board of Health while performing the duties assigned in the course of
34	training if the duties are performed under the supervision of a licensed
35	practitioner;
36	(B) However, medical residents, interns, and fellows shall

1	be required to register and be subject to the other applicable provisions of
2	this chapter; or
3	(4) A physician licensed in another state who is in this state
4	for consultation with a naturopathic practitioner licensed in this state but
5	does not:
6	(A) Have an office in this state; or
7	(B) Appoint a place in this state for seeing, examining,
8	or treating patients.
9	
10	Subchapter 2 — The Naturopathic Practitioner Act — Arkansas State Board
11	of Acupuncture and Related Techniques and Naturopathic Medicine
12	
13	17-108-201. Powers and duties of the Arkansas State Board of
14	Acupuncture and Related Techniques and Naturopathic Medicine.
15	(a) The Arkansas State Board of Acupuncture and Related Techniques and
16	Naturopathic Medicine shall adopt rules consistent with this
17	<u>chapter.</u>
18	(b) The board shall administer this chapter, investigate violations of
19	this chapter, prepare and administer examinations required by the board, and
20	perform other duties authorized by this chapter.
21	(c) The board shall adopt rules authorizing the use by naturopathic
22	practitioners of other evaluative procedures and other natural substances,
23	treatments, procedures, and therapies if the substances, treatments,
24	procedures, and therapies are taught in approved courses of study or used by
25	practitioners licensed by other entities of the state and are consistent with
26	this chapter.
27	
28	17-108-202. Naturopathic Practitioners Advisory Committee.
29	(a)(1) The Naturopathic Practitioners Advisory Committee is created as
30	an advisory committee to the Arkansas State Board of Acupuncture and Related
31	Techniques and Naturopathic Medicine, to be composed of nine (9) members
32	appointed by the board.
33	(2) The board shall appoint the members of the committee within
34	ninety (90) days of the effective date of this chapter.
35	(b)(1)(A) Six (6) members shall be acupuncturists licensed by the
36	board; and

1	(b) Inree (3) members shall be haturopathic practitioners
2	licensed under this chapter.
3	(2) In appointing the initial naturopathic practitioner members
4	of the Naturopathic Practitioners Advisory Committee, the board, in lieu of
5	appointing members who are naturopathic practitioners licensed under this
6	chapter, may appoint three (3) members who are otherwise qualified and have
7	applied for licenses as naturopathic practitioners under this chapter.
8	(c)(1) Members shall be appointed for staggered terms of four (4)
9	years.
10	(2) The initial members shall draw lots so that:
11	(A) Three (3) members serve three-year terms; and
12	(B) Four (4) members serve four-year terms.
13	(d) The board shall call the first meeting of the committee within
14	sixty (60) days of the effective date of this chapter.
15	(e) If a vacancy occurs on the committee, the board shall appoint a
16	person having the appropriate qualifications to serve the unexpired part of
17	the term.
18	(f) The committee may adopt rules for the conduct of its activities
19	and shall elect from among its members a chair who shall serve a term of one
20	(1) year.
21	(g) A majority of the members of the committee constitutes a quorum to
22	transact the business of the committee.
23	(h) The committee shall meet at least once each calendar year and
24	shall meet at other times at the call of the presiding officer as necessary
25	to transact its business.
26	(i) The members of the committee may not receive compensation but may
27	receive expense reimbursement in accordance with § 25-16-902.
28	(j) The committee shall:
29	(1) Recommend to the board rules to implement standards adopted
30	under this chapter;
31	(2) Perform other duties assigned by the board; and
32	(3) Recommend to the board examinations required by this
33	<u>chapter.</u>
34	(k) A naturopathic practitioner member of the committee may be
35	licensed as a member of another health profession regulated or licensed by
36	the state.

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2	17-108-203. Complaint procedure in general.
3	(a) The Arkansas State Board of Acupuncture and Related Techniques and
4	Naturopathic Medicine shall establish and keep current an information file
5	that contains a record for each complaint of:
6	(1) All persons contacted in relation to the complaint;
7	(2) A summary of findings made at each step of the complaint
8	process;
9	(3) An explanation of the legal basis and reason for a complaint
10	that is dismissed; and
11	(4) Other relevant information.
12	(b) If a written complaint is filed with the board that the board has
13	authority to resolve, the board, at least as frequently as quarterly and
14	until final disposition of the complaint, shall notify the parties to the
15	complaint of the status of the complaint unless the notice would jeopardize
16	an undercover investigation.
17	(c)(1) The board shall adopt a form to standardize information
18	concerning complaints made to the board.
19	(2) The board shall provide to a person who files a complaint
20	with the board a list and explanation of the required standardized
21	information.
22	(d) The board shall provide reasonable assistance to a person who
23	wishes to file a complaint with the board.
24	
25	17-108-204. Complaint investigation procedure.
26	(a) The Arkansas State Board of Acupuncture and Related Techniques and
27	Naturopathic Medicine shall adopt rules concerning the investigation of a
28	complaint filed under this chapter.
29	(b) The rules adopted under this section shall:
30	(1) Distinguish between categories of complaints;
31	(2) Ensure that complaints are not dismissed without appropriate
32	consideration;
33	(3) Require that the Naturopathic Practitioners Advisory
34	Committee be advised of a complaint that is dismissed and that a letter be
35	sent to the person who filed the complaint explaining the action taken on the
36	dismissed complaint; and

1	(4) Ensure that the person who filed the complaint has an
2	opportunity to explain the allegations made in the complaint.
3	(c) The board shall complete an investigation of each complaint in a
4	timely manner.
5	
6	17-108-205. Discipline of license holder.
7	(a) A license to practice naturopathy may be denied or, after notice
8	and hearing, suspended, probated, or revoked if the applicant for a license
9	or the holder of a license:
10	(1) Uses drugs or intoxicating liquors to an extent that affects
11	the professional competence of the applicant or license holder;
12	(2) Obtains or attempts to obtain a license by fraud or
13	deception;
14	(3) Is adjudged mentally incompetent by a court of competent
15	jurisdiction;
16	(4) Practices naturopathy in a manner detrimental to the public
17	health and welfare;
18	(5) Violates this chapter or a rule adopted under this chapter;
19	(6) Pleads guilty or nolo contendere to, or is found guilty of a
20	felony, a crime involving moral turpitude, or fraud of any kind; or
21	(7) Holds himself or herself out as a physician or surgeon or
22	any combination or derivative of those terms unless the person is also
23	licensed under the Arkansas Medical Practices Act, § 17-95-201 et seq.
24	(b) If a license suspension is probated, the Arkansas State Board of
25	Acupuncture and Related Techniques and Naturopathic Medicine may require the
26	license holder to:
27	(1) Report regularly to the board on matters that are the basis
28	of the probation;
29	(2) Limit practice to areas prescribed by the board; or
30	(3) Continue professional education until he or she attains a
31	degree of skill satisfactory to the board in those areas that are the basis
32	of the probation.
33	(c) A person whose application for a license is denied or whose
34	license is suspended or revoked is entitled to a hearing before the board if
35	the person submits a written request to the board.

1	Subchapter 3 - The Naturopathic Practitioner Act - Licensing
2	
3	17-108-301. License qualifications.
4	(a) A person is qualified to be licensed as a naturopathic
5	practitioner if the person:
6	(1) Completes and submits to the Arkansas State Board of
7	Acupuncture and Related Techniques and Naturopathic Medicine an application
8	accompanied by the appropriate fees;
9	(2) Is a graduate of an approved naturopathic college or
10	university under § 17-108-103;
11	(3) Has passed an examination prescribed or endorsed by the
12	Naturopathic Practitioners Advisory Committee covering the appropriate
13	naturopathic subjects; and
14	(4) Is of good moral character.
15	(b) A person is qualified to be licensed as a naturopathic
16	practitioner without examination if the applicant:
17	(1) Is licensed to practice naturopathy in another state, a
18	territory of the United States, or the District of Columbia under conditions
19	and circumstances that the board finds to be comparable to the requirements
20	of this state for obtaining a license to practice naturopathy, and the state,
21	the territory, or the District of Columbia requires the successful completion
22	of a professional examination for the issuance of a license;
23	(2) Has graduated from a naturopathic college or university
24	approved by the board or, if the applicant was licensed before a date
25	designated by board rule, the applicant graduated from a college or
26	university approved by the committee after the college or university was
27	investigated and found to meet the acceptable educational standards in
28	existence at the time of the applicant's graduation;
29	(3) Produces evidence satisfactory to the committee that the
30	applicant holds a valid, unsuspended, and unrevoked license;
31	(4) Has been actively engaged in the practice of naturopathy for
32	not less than one (1) year; and
33	(5) Is of good moral character.
34	(c) A person may sit for the examination prescribed or endorsed by the
35	committee under subsection (a) of this section and be eligible for licensure
36	as a naturopathic practitioner on the passage of the examination if, before

1	December 1, 2013, the person files a license application, pays the required
2	fees, and submits proof to the board that the person:
3	(1) Attended a naturopathic college or university and received a
4	doctorate degree in naturopathy from the college or university before January
5	1, 2013, and the college or university is subsequently approved by the
6	<pre>committee;</pre>
7	(2) Before May 1, 2013, provided in this state and on a regular
8	and ongoing basis health care services within the scope of practice of
9	naturopathic medicine for patients in this state; and
10	(3) Is of good moral character.
11	(d) A person is qualified to be licensed under this chapter without
12	taking the examination or meeting the requirements of subsections (a) and (b)
13	of this section if the person:
14	(1) Is a resident of the state;
15	(2) Is twenty-one (21) years of age or older;
16	(3) Provides proof acceptable to the committee that the person
17	has been actively engaged in the practice of naturopathic medicine and has
18	held himself or herself out to the public as a naturopathic practitioner for
19	at least three (3) years before January 1, 2013, or has accumulated not less
20	than three thousand eighty (3,080) patient contact hours before January 1,
21	<u>2013;</u>
22	(4) Is not licensed as a physician or chiropractor;
23	(5) Derives the majority of his or her earned income from the
24	practice of naturopathic medicine; and
25	(6) Applies for a license under this subsection before January
26	<u>1, 2014.</u>
27	(e) A person licensed under subsection (d) of this section may:
28	(1) Use the title "Naturopathic Practitioner" and any other
29	title permitted under § 17-108-303(a); and
30	(2) Practice naturopathic medicine only within the scope of
31	practice that reflects the limits of his or her training and experience.
32	(f)(l) The board may adopt rules providing for limitations on the
33	practice of a person licensed under subsection (d) of this section.
34	(2) However, the board may not require a person licensed under
35	subsection (d) of this section to be identified as a person whose practice is
36	limited.

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2	17-108-302. Examination.
3	(a)(1) The Naturopathic Practitioners Advisory Committee may prescribe
4	a nationally developed standard examination as part or all of the examination
5	prescribed or endorsed under § 17-108-301(a).
6	(2)(A) The Arkansas State Board of Acupuncture and Related
7	Techniques and Naturopathic Medicine shall promulgate rules to establish
8	criteria for passing the examination.
9	(B) The board may promulgate other rules necessary to the
10	administration of the examination.
11	(b) The board shall set the fees for the examination, reexamination of
12	the entire examination, and reexamination of separate components of the
13	examination in amounts necessary to cover the actual cost of the examination
14	and the expenses of administration.
15	
16	17-108-303. Use of titles - Penalty - Injunction.
17	(a) Only a naturopathic practitioner may use the title "Naturopathic
18	Practitioner", "Doctor of Naturopathy", "Naturopath", or "ND".
19	(b) A person not licensed under this chapter is guilty of a Class \underline{A}
20	misdemeanor and is subject to penalties applicable to the unlicensed practice
21	of naturopathic medicine if he or she:
22	(1) Holds himself or herself out as a person who practices
23	naturopathic medicine;
24	(2) Uses any combination or abbreviation of the terms described
25	in subsection (a) of this section without holding a license or while he or
26	she is on retired or inactive status; or
27	(3) Acts as a naturopathic practitioner.
28	(c) The Arkansas State Board of Acupuncture and Related Techniques and
29	Naturopathic Medicine may seek an injunction against a person who violates
30	this section in the circuit court of the county in which the violation
31	occurs.
32	
33	17-108-304. License fees.
34	The Arkansas State Board of Acupuncture and Related Techniques and
35	Naturopathic Medicine shall adopt an initial licensing fee and annual renewal
36	face in amounts necessary to cover the costs of administering this chanter

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2	17-108-305. License renewal.
3	(a) Annual renewal of a license to practice as a naturopathic
4	practitioner is required.
5	(b) To renew a license, a naturopathic practitioner shall submit to
6	the Arkansas State Board of Acupuncture and Related Techniques and
7	Naturopathic Medicine evidence of successful completion of the required hours
8	of continuing education from programs approved by the board.
9	(c) The board shall adopt rules establishing approved programs of
10	continuing education and the manner for verifying participation.
11	(d) The board may adopt other rules necessary for the administration
12	of license renewals.
13	
14	17-108-306. Continuing education.
15	(a) The Arkansas State Board of Acupuncture and Related Techniques and
16	Naturopathic Medicine shall require not fewer than fifteen (15) hours
17	annually of continuing education hours for all naturopathic practitioners.
18	(b)(1) A person who seeks to renew a license that expired within the
19	preceding year shall comply with the continuing education requirements for
20	the regular renewal of the license.
21	(2) A person seeking to renew a license that has been expired
22	for more than one (1) year must present evidence of completion of not less
23	than one-half $(1/2)$ of the required hours of approved continuing education
24	requirements during the year preceding the date of the application for
25	renewal.
26	
27	17-108-307. Inactive status — Retired status.
28	(a) To place a license on inactive status, the license holder shall
29	notify the Arkansas State Board of Acupuncture and Related Techniques and
30	Naturopathic Medicine at the time of renewal and pay a fee for inactive
31	status.
32	(b) To activate a license on inactive status, the license holder shall
33	pay the regular renewal fee and present evidence of having completed not less
34	than one-half $(1/2)$ of the required hours of approved continuing education
35	requirements during the year preceding the date of the application for
36	activation.

1	(c)(l) A license holder seeking to place a license on retired status
2	shall notify the board at the time of renewal.
3	(2) A license on retired status may not be reactivated.
4	(d) A license holder who holds a license that is on inactive or
5	retired status may not practice naturopathic medicine.
6	
7	Subchapter 4 - The Naturopathic Medicine Act - Naturopathic Practice
8	
9	17-108-401. Authorized activities.
10	(a) A person licensed as a naturopathic practitioner under this
11	chapter may use for preventive and therapeutic purposes the following
12	preparations and therapies:
13	(1) Natural medicines;
14	(2) Minor office procedures;
15	(3) Natural antibiotics;
16	(4) Topical preparations; and
17	(5) Naturopathic physical modality.
18	(b) A person licensed as a naturopathic practitioner under this
19	chapter may use the following for evaluation purposes, if the practitioner
20	has met the appropriate educational requirements and has obtained the
21	approval of the Arkansas State Board of Acupuncture and Related Techniques
22	and Naturopathic Medicine:
23	(1) Physical and orificial examinations;
24	(2) X-rays;
25	(3) Electrocardiograms;
26	(4) Therapeutic ultrasound;
27	(5) Phlebotomy;
28	(6) Clinical laboratory tests and examinations;
29	(7) Physiological function tests; and
30	(8) The noninvasive diagnostic procedures commonly used in
31	naturopathic medical practice.
32	
33	17-108-402. Specialty practice.
34	(a) A person licensed under this chapter as a naturopathic
35	practitioner shall comply with the requirements adopted by the Arkansas State
36	Board of Acupuncture and Related Techniques and Naturopathic Medicine for

1 issuance of the specialty certification that are equivalent to the minimum 2 requirements, including any examination required by the board, to obtain a 3 license to practice in this state a different specialty not covered under 4 this chapter. 5 (b) The Naturopathic Practitioners Advisory Committee may recommend a 6 national standardized examination in a requested specialty as constituting 7 the specialty examination. 8 9 17-108-403. Use of X-ray. 10 (a) A naturopathic practitioner licensed under this chapter may use an X-ray in the course of practice only if the naturopathic practitioner is 11 12 certified by the Arkansas State Board of Acupuncture and Related Techniques 13 and Naturopathic Medicine as qualified to perform X-ray procedures. 14 (b) The board shall adopt rules for the issuance of a certification 15 under this section that are equivalent to the requirements for other health 16 professionals to engage in the use of X-rays. 17 18 17-108-404. Prohibited acts. 19 A naturopathic practitioner shall not: 20 (1) Prescribe, dispense, or administer any legend drugs or 21 controlled substances; 22 (2) Perform X-ray procedures except those procedures authorized 23 by this chapter; 24 (3) Practice emergency care except as a Samaritan rendering 25 gratuitous services in the case of emergency, and except for the care of 26 minor injuries; or 27 (4) Claim to practice allopathic medicine or surgery, osteopathy, dentistry, podiatry, optometry, chiropractic, physical therapy, 28 29 acupuncture, or any other system or method of treatment not authorized by 30 this chapter. 31 32 17-108-405. Duties and responsibilities. A naturopathic practitioner has the same duty and responsibility as any 33 34 other licensed health care provider regarding public health laws, reportable diseases and conditions, communicable disease control and prevention, the 35 36 recording of vital statistics, health and physical examinations, and

1	competency examinations, except that the authority under this section is
2	limited to activity consistent with the scope of practice authorized by this
3	chapter.
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5	SECTION 2. Arkansas Code § 17-102-201, concerning the creation of the
6	Arkansas State Board of Acupuncture and Related Techniques and Naturopathic
7	Medicine, is amended to read as follows:
8	(a)(1)(A) There is created the Arkansas State Board of Acupuncture and
9	Related Techniques and Naturopathic Medicine.
10	(B) The board shall consist of five (5) persons appointed
11	by the Governor as full members and one (1) person appointed by the Governor
12	as an ex officio member.
13	
14	SECTION 3. DO NOT CODIFY. The Arkansas Code Revision Commission shall
15	replace the name "Arkansas State Board of Acupuncture and Related Techniques"
16	in all appropriate sections of the Arkansas Code with the name "Arkansas
17	State Board of Acupuncture and Related Techniques and Naturopathic Medicine".
