8	AN ACT TO ALLOW ELIGIBLE SURVIVORS TO RECEIVE
9	BENEFITS FROM THE ARKANSAS TEACHER RETIREMENT SYSTEM
10	FROM THE DATE THAT AN APPLICATION FOR SURVIVOR
11	BENEFITS IS FILED WITH THE SYSTEM; TO CLARIFY THE
12	DATE ON WHICH A SURVIVING SPOUSE MAY BEGIN RECEIVING
13	BENEFITS; TO DECLARE AN EMERGENCY; AND FOR OTHER
14	PURPOSES.

18	TO ALLOW ELIGIBLE SURVIVORS TO RECEIVE
19	BENEFITS FROM THE DATE AN APPLICATION FOR
20	SURVIVOR BENEFITS IS FILED; TO CLARIFY
21	SURVIVING SPOUSE BENEFITS; AND TO DECLARE
22	AN EMERGENCY.
23

25	BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ARKANSAS:
26	
27	SECTION 1. Arkansas Code § 24-7-710(a), concerning survivor annuity
28	benefits, is amended to read as follows:
29	(a) $\underline{(1)}$ If an active member with five (5) or more years of actual $\frac{1}{2}$
30	reciprocal service, including credited service for the year immediately
31	preceding his or her death, dies before the receipt of retirement benefits
32	from the Arkansas Teacher Retirement System, then the benefits provided in
33	this section shall be paid to eligible survivors.
34	(2) An immediately eligible survivor is entitled to receive monthly
35	benefits beginning the month after the death of the member if the survivor
36	application is filed with the system within three (3) months of the death of

1	the member, otherwise the monthly benefits shall begin the month that the
2	survivor application is filed with the system.
3	
4	SECTION 2. Arkansas Code § 24-7-710(b)(1)(B) and (C), concerning
5	survivor annuity benefits, is amended to read as follows:
6	(B) The surviving spouse's benefits shall begin in the
7	month following the month of the member's death If a surviving spouse is
8	immediately eligible to receive a monthly benefit immediately after the death
9	of a member, the immediately eligible surviving spouse is entitled to receive
10	monthly benefits beginning the month after the death of the member if the
11	survivor application is filed with the system within three (3) months of the
12	death of the member, otherwise the monthly benefits shall begin the month
13	that the survivor application is filed with the system if at the time of the
14	member's death the member had:
15	(i) Accumulated twenty-five (25) years or more of
16	credited service and qualified as eligible to receive a retirement annuity
17	under §§ 24-7-701 and 24-7-702; or
18	(ii) Reached sixty (60) years of age and qualified
19	as eligible to receive a retirement annuity under § 24-7-707.
20	(C) If the surviving spouse in not <u>immediately</u> eligible to
21	receive $\underline{monthly}$ benefits under subdivision (b)(1)(B) of this section, the
22	surviving spouse's benefits shall begin $\frac{1}{100}$ the $\frac{1}{100}$ the $\frac{1}{100}$ the $\frac{1}{100}$ month
23	following the date the member would have been eligible to receive benefits
24	had the member survived or the date that an application for a surviving
25	spouse's benefits is filed with the system.
26	
27	SECTION 3. Arkansas Code § 24-7-710(e), concerning survivor annuity
28	benefits, is repealed.
29	(e) Annuities payable under this section shall begin the first day of
30	the calendar month following the date the survivor annuity is payable as
31	provided in this section.
32	
33	SECTION 4. EMERGENCY CLAUSE. It is found and determined by the
34	General Assembly of the State of Arkansas that provisions of the Arkansas
35	Teacher Retirement System Act are in need of revision and updating to
36	maintain the act in conformance with sound public pension policy; that the

1	Arkansas Teacher Retirement System operates on a July 1 to June 30 fiscal
2	year; and that these provisions are necessary to provide proper
3	administration to benefits to begin on the first day of the fiscal year; that
4	such revisions and updating are of great importance for actuarial purposes
5	and to protect the benefits for members of the Arkansas Teacher Retirement
6	System. Therefore, an emergency is declared to exist, and this act being
7	necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health, and safety shall
8	become effective on July 1, 2013.
