23	bachelor's degree in speech pathology or $\frac{1}{2}$ or $\frac{1}{2}$ individual who meets
24	minimum qualifications established by the board, which are less than those
25	established by this chapter as necessary for licensing as a speech-language
26	pathologist, and who provides services as prescribed, directed, and

Arkansas Code § 17-100-201(b)(2)(A), concerning the members 13 of the Board of Examiners in Speech-Language Pathology and Audiology, is 14 amended to read as follows: 15 (2)(A)(i) Seven (7) members of the board shall be appointed from 16 names submitted by the Arkansas Speech-Language-Hearing Association, the 17 American Academy of Audiology, or other professional groups or individuals. 18 (ii) Not less than thirty (30) days before the end 19 of each fiscal year, the association shall may recommend not more than three 20 (3) persons for each vacancy. 21 22 SECTION 4. Arkansas Code § 17-100-201(d), concerning the members of 23 the Board of Examiners in Speech-Language Pathology and Audiology, is amended 24 to read as follows: 25 (d)(1) In the event of a midterm vacancy, the association shall may 26 recommend as soon as practicable not more than three (3) persons to fill the 27 professional, consumer, or public representative vacancies. 28 (2) As soon thereafter as practicable after a recommendation 29 under subdivision (d)(1) of this section has been made, the Governor shall 30 appoint one (1) of these persons who shall fill the unexpired term. 31 32
