2	(b) The private college or university for which the law enforcement	
3	officer is employed shall:	
4	(1) Pay any necessary transportation cost in traveling to and	
5	from the academy; and	
6	(2) Reimburse the Arkansas Commission on Law Enforcement	
7	Standards and Training for any cost associated with the private college or	
8	university law enforcement officer's training or instruction at the academy.

13	Law Enforcement Agencies for Private Colleges and Universities

15	<u>Subchapter 1</u>	
16	General Provisions	
17		
18	<u>12-19-101. Definitions.</u>	
19	As used in this chapter:	
20	(1) "Control" means that a private college or university is maintained	
21	on the property or rents or leases the property to facilitate events or	
22	functions of the private college or university;	
23	(2) "Executive head" means the president or governing board of a	
24	private college or university;	
25	(3) "Private college or university" means a college, university, or	
26	teaching hospital that has all of the following characteristics:	
27	(A) Is not owned or controlled by the state or a political	
28	subdivision of the state;	
29	(B) Provides a program of education in residence leading to a	
30	baccalaureate degree or provides a program of education in residence for	
31	which the baccalaureate degree is a prerequisite, leading to an academic or	
32	professional degree; and	
33	(C) Is accredited by the North Central Association of Colleges	
34	and Schools or another nationally recognized agency that accredits private	
35	colleges and universities; and	
36	(D) Has its principal place of business located in the state.	

1	(4) "Property" means both real property and personal property owned by
2	or under the control of the private college or university and includes
3	without limitation all highways, streets, alleys, and rights-of-way that are
4	contiguous or adjacent to real property owned by or under the control of the
5	private college or university.
6	
7	<u>12-19-102. Applicability - Cumulative effect.</u>
8	(a) This chapter applies to the property of each private college or
9	university.
10	(b) This chapter does not mean that a private college or university is
11	an agent of the State of Arkansas.
12	(c) This chapter is cumulative to any remedies that each private
13	college or university may possess for enforcing its rules and regulations,
14	including its rights to impose sanctions through fees and charges and its
15	rights to discipline, deny service, and expel.
16	
17	12-19-103. Enforcement.
18	The prosecuting attorney or the city attorney, as may be appropriate,
19	shall appear and prosecute in court all criminal offenses arising under this
20	<u>chapter.</u>
21	
22	<u>Subchapter 2</u>
23	Law Enforcement Officers
24	
25	12-19-201. Appointment and removal of private college or university
26	law enforcement officers.
27	(a) An executive head of a private college or university may appoint
28	one (1) or more of the employees of the private college or university as a
29	private college or university law enforcement officer for the private college
30	or university, who shall exercise law enforcement officer authority under the
31	laws of this state.
32	(b) A private college or university law enforcement officer shall:
33	(1) Have all the powers, duties, and obligations provided under
34 25	the law for municipal police departments and county sheriffs, to be exercised
35	as required for the protection of the private college or university, together
36	with any other duties that may be assigned by the employing private college

1	or university; and
2	(2) Meet the requirements for certification set out by the
3	Arkansas Commission on Law Enforcement Standards and Training in addition to
4	any private college or university requirements.
5	(c)(l) The jurisdictional powers or responsibilities of a county
6	sheriff or municipal police department over the property of a private college
7	or university or a person on the property of a private college or university
8	are not ceded to a private college or university law enforcement officer.
9	(2) The appointment or designation of private college or
10	university law enforcement officers does not supersede the authority of the
11	Department of Arkansas State Police, a county sheriff, or a municipal police
12	department of the jurisdiction within which the property of the private
13	college or university, or portions of it, is located.
14	(d)(1) A private college or university law enforcement officer shall
15	be identified by a shield or badge bearing the name of the private college or
16	university.
17	(2) The private college or university shall issue an
18	identification card bearing the photograph of the private college or
19	university law enforcement officer who shall carry it on his or her person at
20	all times when on duty and display it upon request.
21	(e)(1) A private college or university law enforcement officer's
22	authorization to have and to exercise the powers provided by law for law
23	enforcement officers shall be further evidenced by a letter of appointment
24	issued under the seal of the private college or university.
25	(2) The executive head of the private college or university
26	shall maintain a file containing each private college or university law
27	enforcement officer's letter of appointment and all other certificates and
28	information consistent with the rules of the commission.
29	(3)(A) The executive head of the private college or university
30	or the department may revoke in writing the appointment to serve as a private
31	college or university law enforcement officer for the private college or
32	university.
33	(B) Upon revocation as described in subdivision (e)(3)(A)
34	of this section, the person shall not possess or exercise the authority of a
35	private college or university law enforcement officer.
36	(C) A copy of all revocations shall be placed into the

1	file described in subdivision (e)(2) of this section.
2	(D) A private college or university employing a private
3	college or university law enforcement officer shall notify the commission of
4	any change in the private college or university law enforcement officer's
5	status within three (3) days.
6	(f) A private college or university law enforcement officer shall not
7	be reimbursed with state funds for any training he or she receives or be
8	eligible to participate in any state or municipal retirement system.
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10	12-19-202. Private college or university law enforcement officer's
11	duties and powers.
12	(a) A private college or university law enforcement officer's primary
13	jurisdiction is the private college or university employing him or her, and
14	except to the extent otherwise limited by the executive head of the private
15	college or university appointing him or her, the private college or
16	university law enforcement officer shall:
17	(1) Protect property;
18	(2) Preserve and maintain proper order and decorum;
19	(3) Prevent unlawful assemblies, disorderly conduct, and
20	trespass;
21	(4) Exclude and eject persons detrimental to the well-being of
22	the private college or university; and
23	(5) Regulate the operation and parking of motor vehicles upon
24	property of the private college or university.
25	(b)(1) A private college or university law enforcement officer shall
26	exercise police supervision on behalf of the private college or university
27	and may arrest any person in the private college or university law
28	enforcement officer's primary jurisdiction who is committing an offense
29	against any law of the State of Arkansas or against the ordinances of the
30	city or county in which the private college or university is located.
31	(2) A private college or university law enforcement officer may
32	summon a posse comitatus if necessary to complete an arrest under subdivision
33	(b)(1) of this section.
34	(c) A private college or university law enforcement officer may make
35	an arrest for an offense against any law of the State of Arkansas outside his
36	or her primary jurisdiction if the private college or university law

1	enforcement officer is:
2	(1) Summoned by another law enforcement agency to provide
3	assistance;
4	(2) Assisting another law enforcement agency;
5	(3) Exercising his or her police powers in accordance with a
6	written mutual aid agreement or memorandum of understanding between the
7	private college or university and the municipality or county within which the
8	private college or university is located; or
9	(4)(A) Traveling to or from any location in the state on
10	official business.
11	(B) As used in subdivision (c)(4)(A) of this section,
12	"official business" includes without limitation:
13	(i) Engaging in intelligence-gathering activity
14	relating to security on the property of the private college or university
15	employing him or her;
16	(ii) Investigating a crime committed on the property
17	of the private college or university employing him or her;
18	(iii) Transporting money, valuables, securities, or
19	other valuables on behalf of the private college or university employing him
20	<u>or her;</u>
21	(iv) Providing security or protective services for
22	officials or visiting dignitaries to the private college or university
23	employing him or her; or
24	(v) Continuously and immediately pursuing a person
25	for an offense committed on the property of the private college or university
26	employing him or her or in the private college or university law enforcement
27	officer's eyesight.
28	(d)(1) When a private college or university law enforcement officer
29	makes an arrest outside his or her primary jurisdiction, the private college
30	or university law enforcement officer shall promptly notify the law
31	enforcement agency with jurisdiction and forward a written report to the law
32	enforcement agency with jurisdiction no later than the next working day.
33	(2) The law enforcement agency having jurisdiction may choose to
34	conduct the investigation or allow the private college or university law
35	enforcement officer to conduct the investigation.
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1	Subchapter 3
2	Motor Vehicle Regulation
3	
4	12-19-301. Rules and regulations for motor vehicles on private college
5	or university grounds.
6	(a)(l) Each private college or university may promulgate and amend
7	rules and regulations for the operation and parking of motor vehicles on its
8	property as its governing board deems necessary if the rules and regulations
9	do not conflict with governing state law or a city or county ordinance.
10	(2) The rules and regulations described in subdivision (a)(1) of
11	this section may be submitted to the city or county where the property of the
12	private college or university is located for adoption as ordinances,
13	including without limitation ordinances that:
14	(A) Limit the rate of speed; and
15	(B) Enforce other traffic rules, including control and
16	direction of traffic.
17	(b) Speed limits shall be posted at reasonable intervals, and traffic
18	and parking directions and prohibitions shall be indicated by signs.
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
