10	AN ACT TO AMEND THE REQUIREMENTS FOR PUBLIC SCHOOL
11	EDUCATOR PROFESSIONAL DEVELOPMENT; TO DECLARE AN
12	EMERGENCY; AND FOR OTHER PURPOSES.

15	Subtitle
16	TO AMEND THE REQUIREMENTS FOR PUBLIC
17	SCHOOL EDUCATOR PROFESSIONAL DEVELOPMENT;
18	AND TO DECLARE AN EMERGENCY.
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20	
21	BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ARKANSAS:
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23	SECTION 1. Arkansas Code § 6-5-405 is repealed.
24	6-5-405. Professional development for higher education awareness.
25	(a) As used in this section, "state-supported student financial
26 2 <b>7</b>	assistance" means:
27	(1) A state-supported scholarship or grant awarded by the
28	Department of Higher Education; and
29	(2) A scholarship, grant, or tuition waiver awarded by an
30	institution of higher education in this state funded in whole or in part with
31	state funds.
32	(b) Beginning with the 2009 calendar year, professional development on
33	the availability of, eligibility requirements for, and the process of
34	applying for state-supported student financial assistance shall be required
35	for:
36	(1) All public school superintendents and assistant

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1	superintendents; and
2	(2) The following licensed personnel at a public school where
3	students are enrolled in grade seven through grade twelve (7-12):
4	(A) Principals;
5	(B) Assistant principals; and
6	(C) Guidance counselors.
7	(c)(1) The first course shall be a three-hour course to be taken
8	within calendar year 2009, or within the first year of employment.
9	(2) After the first three-hour course is completed, a one-hour
10	course is required to be completed annually.
11	(d) The professional development hours required under this section
12	shall be counted toward the sixty (60) hours of the professional development
13	required for licensed school personnel under the Standards for Accreditation
14	of Arkansas Public Schools and School Districts.
15	
16	SECTION 2. Arkansas Code $\S$ 6-17-703 is amended to read as follows:
17	6-17-703. Arkansas history in-service training.
18	(a) Every school district in this state A school district shall
19	provide two (2) hours of substantive and meaningful in-service training
20	professional development in Arkansas history each school year for
21	its teachers who provide instruction in Arkansas history <u>according to the</u>
22	professional development schedule under § 6-17-709.
23	(b) The school district may provide the professional development:
24	(1) contract By contracting with an education service cooperative
25	to provide the training; or
26	(2) By using the Arkansas Online Professional Development
27	<u>Initiative under § 6-17-707</u> .
28	(c) The in-service training professional development under this
29	section shall count toward satisfaction of requirements for professional
30	development in the Standards for Accreditation of Arkansas Public Schools and
31	School Districts.
32	
33	SECTION 3. Arkansas Code $\S$ 6-17-704(a), concerning a professional
34	development plan, is amended to read as follows:
35	(a) As used in this section, "professional development" means a $\underline{set}$ of
36	coordinated <del>set of</del> planned learning activities for teachers, administrators,

1	and <del>classified</del> <u>nonlicensed school</u> employees that <del>are standards-based and</del>
2	eontinuous:
3	(1) Is required by statute or the Department of Education; or
4	(2) Meets the following criteria:
5	(A) Is part of the minimum number of professional
6	development hours required by law or by the department;
7	(B) Improves the knowledge, skills, and effectiveness of
8	teachers;
9	(C) Improves the knowledge and skills of administrators
10	and paraprofessionals concerning effective instructional strategies, methods,
11	and skills;
12	(D) Leads to improved student academic achievement; and
13	(E) Is research-based and standards-based.
14	
15	SECTION 4. Arkansas Code § 6-17-704(c)(1), concerning a professional
16	development plan, is amended to read as follows:
17	(c)(1) Beginning with school year 2004-2005, each Annually, each
18	school district shall prepare a professional development plan.
19	
20	SECTION 5. Arkansas Code $\S$ 6-17-704(e), concerning a professional
21	development plan, is amended to read as follows:
22	(e)(1) The professional development offerings may meet the objectives
23	of subdivision (e)(2) of this section developed by the National Staff
24	Development Council and shall comply with the rules of the State Board of
25	Education governing professional development.
26	(2) Professional development that improves the learning of all
27	students:
28	(A) Requires skillful school and school district leaders
29	who guide continuous instructional improvement;
30	(B) Organizes educators into learning communities whose
31	goals are aligned with those of the school and school district;
32	(C) Provides resources to support educator learning and
33	collaboration;
34	(D) Uses disaggregated student data to determine educator
35	learning priorities, monitor progress, and help sustain continuous
36	improvements;

Ţ	(E) Uses multiple sources of information to guide educator
2	improvement and demonstrate its impact;
3	(F) Prepares educators to apply research to decision
4	making;
5	(G) Uses learning strategies appropriate to the intended
6	goal;
7	(H) Applies knowledge about human learning and change;
8	(I) Prepares educators to understand and appreciate all
9	students;
10	(J) Creates safe, orderly, and supportive learning
11	environments;
12	(K) Holds high expectations for the students' academic
13	achievement;
14	(L) Deepens educators' content knowledge;
15	(M) Provides educators with research-based instructional
16	strategies to assist students in meeting rigorous academic standards;
17	(N) Prepares educators to use various types of classroom
18	assessments appropriately;
19	(0) Provides educators with knowledge and skills to
20	appropriately involve families and other stakeholders in education;
21	(P) Provides educators with knowledge and skills needed to
22	teach students with disabilities, including without limitation autism; and
23	(Q) Provides educators with knowledge and skills needed to
24	teach culturally and linguistically diverse students.
25	(e) The professional development under this section:
26	(1) Shall comply with the Arkansas Department of Education Rules
27	Governing Professional Development; and
28	(2) May provide educators with knowledge and skills needed to
29	teach:
30	(A) Students with disabilities, including without
31	limitation autism; and
32	(B) Culturally and linguistically diverse students.
33	
34	SECTION $6$ . Arkansas Code $6-17-708$ is amended to read as follows:
35	6-17-708. Teen suicide awareness and prevention in-service training.
36	(a)(1) Beginning in the 2012-2013 school year, the The Department of

- 1 Education shall require two (2) hours of in-service training professional
- 2 development in teen suicide awareness and prevention one (1) time every five
- 3 (5) school years for licensed <u>public school</u> personnel <u>according to the</u>
- 4 professional development schedule under § 6-17-709.
- 5 (2) The <u>in-service training professional development</u> under this
- 6 section may be accomplished through self-review of suitable suicide
- 7 prevention materials approved by the department.
- 8 (b) The in-service training professional development under this
- 9 section shall count toward the satisfaction of requirements for professional
- 10 development in the Standards for Accreditation of Arkansas Public Schools and
- 11 School Districts and for licensure requirements for licensed personnel.

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- SECTION 7. Arkansas Code Title 6, Chapter 17, Subchapter 7, is amended to add an additional section to read as follows:
- 15 <u>6-17-709</u>. Professional development schedule.
- 16 (a) Beginning with the 2013-2014 school year, a school district or an
- 17 <u>open-enrollment public charter school shall make available to the appropriate</u>
- 18 <u>licensed personnel the following professional development:</u>
- 19 <u>(1) In the 2013-2014 school year and every fourth school year</u>
- 20 thereafter, the professional development for mandated reporters and licensed
- 21 elementary and secondary public school personnel required under § 6-61-133;
- 22 (2) In the 2014-2015 school year and every fourth school year
- 23 thereafter, the parental involvement professional development under § 6-15-
- 24 <u>1703</u>;
- 25 (3) In the 2015-2016 school year and every fourth school year
- 26 thereafter, the teen suicide awareness and prevention professional
- 27 development required under § 6-17-708; and
- 28 (4) In the 2016-2017 school year and every fourth school year
- 29 <u>thereafter</u>, the Arkansas history professional development required under § 6-
- 30 <u>17-703</u>.
- 31 (b)(1) Two (2) hours of the professional development required by
- 32 subsection (a) of this section shall be counted in one (1) school year toward
- 33 the minimum number of hours of professional development required for licensed
- 34 educators under the Arkansas Department of Education Rules Governing
- 35 <u>Professional Development.</u>
- 36 (2) If additional hours are obtained by a licensed educator, the

1	school district may count those hours as part of the minimum number of hours
2	of professional development required for licensed educators under the
3	Arkansas Department of Education Rules Governing Professional Development.
4	(c) Annually, the State Board of Education may require up to six (6)
5	hours of integrated professional development for licensed educators in
6	educational technology.
7	(d) The Department of Education shall establish the curriculum under
8	this section in collaboration with educational agencies and associations
9	including without limitation the:
10	(1) Department of Higher Education;
11	(2) Arkansas Association of Educational Administrators;
12	(3) Arkansas Education Association;
13	(4) Arkansas School Boards Association;
14	(5) Arkansas Association for Supervision and Curriculum
15	Development;
16	(6) Arkansas State Teachers Association; and
17	(7) Arkansas Rural Education Association.
18	(e)(1) The professional development under this subsection shall not
19	be provided by a school district but shall be provided by:
20	(A) The Department of Education;
21	(B) An institutions of higher education; or
22	(C) Providers approved by the Department of Education.
23	(2)(A) Before a person receives a building level administrator's
24	license, the person shall successfully complete the teacher evaluation
25	professional development program.
26	(B) A person who receives an initial building level
27	administrator's license shall complete the certification assessment for the
28	teacher evaluation professional development program before or after receiving
29	the initial building level administrator's license.
30	(3)(A) The Department of Education shall not issue an initial
31	teaching license until the applicant verifies that he or she has obtained the
32	required professional development concerning:
33	(A) Mandated reporters under § 6-61-133;
34	(B) Parental involvement under § 6-15-1703;
35	(C) Teen suicide awareness and prevention under § 6-
36	17-708; and

1	(D) Arkansas history under § 6-17-703.
2	(B) For a teaching license issued under the state's
3	reciprocity provisions to an out-of-state teacher, the Department of
4	Education shall issue a provisional license until the licensee obtains the
5	professional development identified in subdivision (e)(3)(A) of this section.
6	
7	SECTION 8. Arkansas Code $\S$ 6-17-2602(2), concerning the definition of
8	"professional development" for purposes of the lifetime teaching license, is
9	amended to read as follows:
10	(2) "Professional development" means a coordinated set of
11	planned, learning development activities for teachers that are standards-
12	based and that meet the focus areas for professional development required by
13	the department has the same meaning as the meaning given to the term under §
14	<u>6-17-704</u> ; and
15	
16	SECTION 9. Arkansas Code $\S$ 6-20-2303(15)(A), concerning the definition
17	of "professional development" for school funding purposes, is amended to read
18	as follows:
19	(15)(A) "Professional development" means a coordinated set of
20	planned learning activities for teachers and administrators that are
21	standards-based has the same meaning as the meaning given to the term under §
22	<u>6-17-704</u> .
23	
24	SECTION $10$ . Arkansas Code § 6-61-133(c), concerning professional
25	development for mandated reporters and licensed elementary and secondary
26	public school personnel, is amended to read as follows:
27	6-61-133. Training Professional development for mandatory mandated
28	reporters and licensed elementary and secondary public school personnel.
29	(a) As used in this section:
30	(1) "Child maltreatment" means the abuse, sexual abuse, neglect,
31	sexual exploitation, or abandonment of a child under the Child Maltreatment
32	Act, § 12-18-101 et seq.; and
33	(2) "Licensed school personnel" means a person who works with
34	students in an elementary or secondary public school, a public charter
35	school, a school district, or an education service cooperative for whom a
36	license issued by the State Board of Education is a condition of employment

1 including without limitation a: 2 (A) School or school district administrator; 3 (B) Teacher: 4 (C) Coach for a school athletics program; 5 (D) School counselor; 6 (E) School social worker; 7 (F) School psychologist; and 8 (G) School nurse. 9 (b) For each degree program at an institution of higher education in 10 this state that is a prerequisite for licensure or certification in a 11 profession in which the professional is a child maltreatment mandated 12 reporter under the Child Maltreatment Act, § 12-18-101 et seq., the 13 Department of Higher Education shall coordinate with all the institutions of 14 higher education to ensure that before receiving a degree, each graduate 15 receives the training professional development identified in subdivision 16 (d)(l) of this section. 17 (c) Licensed school personnel shall obtain the training professional 18 development identified in subsection (d) of this section within twelve (12) 19 months of: 20 (1) The Not more than one (1) year before the individual's initial licensure; and 21 22 (2) All subsequent renewals of the individual's license 23 According to the professional development schedule under § 6-17-709. (d)(1) The training professional development required under this 24 25 section shall include without limitation: 26 Recognizing the signs and symptoms of child 27 maltreatment; 28 (B) The legal requirements of the Child Maltreatment Act, 29 § 12-18-101 et seq., and the duties of mandated reporters under the act; and 30 (C) Methods for managing disclosures regarding child 31 victims. 32 (2) In addition to the training professional development 33 required under subdivision (d)(l) of this section, licensed school personnel 34 shall obtain training professional development in connecting a victim of 35 child maltreatment to appropriate in-school services and other agencies, 36 programs, and services needed to provide the child with the emotional and

1	educational support the child needs to continue to be successful in school.
2	(e)(l) The training professional development obtained by licensed
3	school personnel may be obtained as in-person or online training professional
4	<u>development</u> .
5	(2) The Arkansas Child Abuse/Rape/Domestic Violence Commission
6	shall approve the curriculum for the training professional development.
7	(3) Licensed school personnel shall document completed training
8	professional development according to the rules of the State Board of
9	Education.
10	(f) Licensed school personnel may substitute for the required number
11	of hours of staff development on parental involvement plans under § 6-15-1703
12	an equal number of hours of training obtained under this section.
13	
14	SECTION 11. EMERGENCY CLAUSE. It is found and determined by the
15	General Assembly of the State of Arkansas that it is the state's
16	constitutional obligation to provide a general, suitable, and efficient free
17	system of public schools in the state; that the professional development of
18	public school teachers and administrators is critical to the delivery of $\underline{a}$
19	constitutionally adequate education; and that this act is immediately
20	necessary for school districts and educators to prepare for the professional
21	development requirements needed for the 2013-2014 school year. Therefore, an
22	emergency is declared to exist, and this act being immediately necessary for
23	the preservation of the public peace, health, and safety shall become
24	effective on:
25	(1) The date of its approval by the Governor;
26	(2) If the bill is neither approved nor vetoed by the Governor,
27	the expiration of the period of time during which the Governor may veto the
28	bill; or
29	(3) If the bill is vetoed by the Governor and the veto is
30	overridden, the date the last house overrides the veto.
