28	SECTION 1. Arka	nsas Code § 6-85-212(e)(1)(A), concerning scholarship	
29	award amounts for the A	Arkansas Academic Challenge Scholarship Program, Part	
30	2, is amended to read	as follows:

11	(2)(A)(i) The department shall award an aggregate amount of		
12	scholarship awards to nontraditional students beginning with the 2010-2011		
13	academic year of twelve million dollars (\$12,000,000).		
14	(ii) Beginning with the 2014-2015 academic year, the		
15	department shall award an aggregate amount of scholarship awards to		
16	nontraditional students of sixteen million (\$16,000,000).

18	SECTION 3. Arkansas Code § 6-85-212(e)(3), concerning scholarship		
19	award amounts under the Arkansas Academic Challenge Scholarship Program, Par		
20	2, to students attending two-year institutions of higher education, is		
21	amended to read as follows:		
22	(3) The scholarship award <u>for an academic year</u> for a full-time		
23	student enrolled in one (1) of the following institutions of higher educatio		
24	is one-half $(rac{1}{2})$ of the scholarship award amount for a full-time undergraduat		
25	student enrolled in a four-year approved institution of higher education <u>two</u>		
26	thousand dollars (\$2,000):		
27	(A) A two-year approved institution of higher education;		
28	(B) A branch campus of a four-year approved institution of

30	(C) An approved nursing school.

32	SECTION 4. EMERGENCY CLAUSE. It is found and determined by the		
33	General Assembly of the State of Arkansas that increasing the number of		
34	Arkansans obtaining postsecondary credentials is critical to the economic		
35	health of the state and its citizens; that the Arkansas Scholarship Lottery		
36	provides the opportunity for tens of thousands of Arkansans to obtain

1	postsecondary education; that the deadline for scholarship applications is		
2	June 1; that the financial integrity of the Arkansas Scholarship Lottery is		
3	critical to the continued existence of the scholarships; and that this act is		
4	immediately necessary because the Department of Higher Education must		
5	promulgate rules to implement this act well before June 1, 2013, in order to		
6	provide eligible Arkansans the opportunity to apply for the scholarship.		
7	Therefore, an emergency is declared to exist and this act being immediately		
8	necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health, and safety shall		
9	become effective on:		
10	(1) The date of its approval by the Governor;		
11	(2) If the bill is neither approved nor vetoed by the Governor,		
12	the expiration of the period of time during which the Governor may veto the		
13	bill; or		
14	(3) If the bill is vetoed by the Governor and the veto is		
15	overridden, the date the last house overrides the veto.
