2	HENDERSON STATE UNIVERSITY AND COLLEGE OF THE OUACHITAS COOPERATIVE
3	AGREEMENT.
4	(a) The General Assembly finds that:
5	(1) Henderson State University and College of The Ouachitas are
6	two institutions of Higher Education with a long history of cooperation and
7	mutual support for the pursuit of their missions to serve the residents of
8	their overlapping service areas;
9	(2) These institutions have entered into an agreement to
10	continue the goodwill that has been established between them and throughout
11	the communities they serve, and to enhance the level of services to the
12	residents of Clark County without duplicating efforts; and
13	(3) Working strategically, the institutions can meet the needs
14	of the residents of Clark County in a manner that fosters partnership and
15	<u>collaboration</u> .
16	(b) Based upon the agreement of the parties:
17	(1) College of The Ouachitas shall:
18	(A) Limit any offerings in Clark County to non-academic,
19	technical courses and programs that are not offered at Henderson State
20	<u>University;</u>
21	(B) Not offer any academic courses or programs, including
22	<u>remediation, in Clark County;</u>
23	(C)(i) Notify, meet, and discuss with Henderson State
24	<u>University prior to offering any new credit-bearing technical programs in</u>
25	<u>Clark County.</u>
26	(ii) To minimize confusion, any such offering will be
27	delivered in conjunction with the Community Education Center; and
28	<u>(D) Only establish a physical presence in Clark County in</u>
29	partnership with Henderson State University's Community Education Center; and
30	(2)(A) Henderson State University shall offer to College of The
31	Ouachitas the first right of refusal for the instruction of technical
32	training courses and programs requested by business and industry that cannot
33	<u>be provided directly by Henderson State University.</u>
34	(B) The courses and programs shall be provided at the
35	<u>Community Education Center or within Clark County.</u>
36	(c) The provisions of this section shall be in effect only from July

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1, 2013, through June 30, 2014.

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SECTION 8. COMPLIANCE WITH OTHER LAWS. Disbursement of funds 3 4 authorized by this act shall be limited to the appropriation for such agency 5 and funds made available by law for the support of such appropriations; and 6 the restrictions of the State Procurement Law, the General Accounting and 7 Budgetary Procedures Law, the Revenue Stabilization Law, the Regular Salary 8 Procedures and Restrictions Act, the Higher Education Expenditures 9 Restrictions Act, or their successors, and other fiscal control laws of this 10 State, where applicable, and regulations promulgated by the Department of 11 Finance and Administration, as authorized by law, shall be strictly complied 12 with in disbursement of said funds.

14 SECTION 9. LEGISLATIVE INTENT. It is the intent of the General 15 Assembly that any funds disbursed under the authority of the appropriations 16 contained in this act shall be in compliance with the stated reasons for 17 which this act was adopted, as evidenced by the Agency Requests, Executive 18 Recommendations and Legislative Recommendations contained in the budget 19 manuals prepared by the Department of Finance and Administration, letters, or 20 summarized oral testimony in the official minutes of the Arkansas Legislative 21 Council or Joint Budget Committee which relate to its passage and adoption. 22

23 SECTION 10. EMERGENCY CLAUSE. It is found and determined by the 24 General Assembly, that the Constitution of the State of Arkansas prohibits 25 the appropriation of funds for more than a one (1) year period; that the 26 effectiveness of this Act on July 1, 2013 is essential to the operation of 27 the agency for which the appropriations in this Act are provided, and that in the event of an extension of the legislative session, the delay in the 28 effective date of this Act beyond July 1, 2013 could work irreparable harm 29 30 upon the proper administration and provision of essential governmental programs. Therefore, an emergency is hereby declared to exist and this Act 31 32 being necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health 33 and safety shall be in full force and effect from and after July 1, 2013. 34 35 /s/Joint Budget Committee

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
