Arkansas Code § 17-81-314 is amended to read as follows: 20 17-81-314. Reinstatement. 21 (a) A chiropractic license which that has been revoked for repeated 22 violation of any of the causes enumerated in § 17-81-313 shall not be § 17-23 81-313(a) or that has been revoked under § 17-81-313(b) is not eligible for 24 reinstatement. 25 26 SECTION 3. Arkansas Code § 17-81-311(c), regarding renewal fees for 27 chiropractor licenses, is amended to read as follows: 28 (c)(1) A renewal fee will be considered "paid" pursuant to this 29 section if it is received in the board office or postmarked on or before the 30 date the fee is due. 31 (2) If a license expires and is forfeited because the renewal 32 fee is not paid on time, the license may be reinstated upon payment of the 33 delinquent fee due, payment of a penalty of two hundred dollars (\$200), and 34 complying with the continuing education and federal and state criminal 35 background check requirements of § 17-81-312. 36

1 SECTION 4. Arkansas Code § 17-81-312 is amended to read as follows: 2 17-81-312. Renewal - Education requirement - Criminal background 3 check. 4 (a)(1) The Arkansas State Board of Chiropractic Examiners shall not 5 renew the license of any a person actively engaged in practice within the 6 State of Arkansas unless the person presents to the board evidence of 7 attendance during the preceding twelve (12) months at: 8 (1)(A) An approved educational session or sessions of not 9 less than twenty-four (24) hours' duration conducted by an approved 10 chiropractic institution of learning or by some association approved by the 11 board for the teaching of chiropractic philosophy and scientific courses 12 pertaining to the profession; or 13 (2) (B) An educational course conducted by the board. 14 (b)(1)(2)(A) The board may waive the requirement upon being 15 presented a certificate from the doctor in charge that the license holder was 16 physically unable on account of sickness or injury, or upon a showing that 17 the license holder was in military service, when the course was conducted 18 within this state during the preceding twelve (12) months. 19 (2) (B) The board may waive the requirement for any other 20 valid reason. 21 (3)(C) Any person who is initially licensed in January 22 shall be required to complete twenty-four (24) hours of continuing education 23 by December 31 of that year, and each year thereafter comply with subdivision 24 (a)(1) of this section this subsection (a). 25 (4)(D) Any person who is initially licensed in July shall 26 submit a certificate of attendance of a minimum of twelve (12) hours of 27 continuing education program approval by the board. Each year thereafter the 28 doctor shall submit a certificate of attendance of completion of twenty-four 29 (24) hours of continuing education seminars by December 31 of each year. 30 (c) (3) The presentation of a fraudulent or forged evidence of 31 attendance at an educational session shall be a cause for suspension or 32 revocation of the holder's license. 33 (b)(1) The board shall require a federal and state criminal background 34 check for the renewal of each license at least one (1) time every five (5) 35 years. 36 (2) The board shall begin to require the federal and state

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1	background check in 2014 and shall implement the background checks with at		
2	least twenty percent (20%) of the licensees for that year and each following		
3	year so that each licensee has a background check at least one (1) time every		
4	five (5) years.		
5	(3) The cost of the federal and state criminal background check		
6	shall be added to the fees for license renewal and paid at the same time as		
7	the fees for license renewal.		
8	(4) A chiropractor who does not submit to a federal and state		
9	background check as required under this subsection shall be accompanied by ar		
10	assistant whenever the chiropractor interviews or treats a patient.		
11	(5) The board shall not renew the license of a chiropractor who		
12	refuses to submit to a federal and state criminal background check as		
13	required under this subsection (b).		
14	(5) The board shall act on the results of the federal and state		
15	criminal background check as provided under § 17-81-313.		
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17	SECTION 5. Arkansas Code § 17-81-317(a), concerning reactivation of		
18	lapsed license, is amended to read as follows:		
19	(a) Any A licensee who allows his or her license to lapse by failing		
20	to renew the license as provided under § 17-81-311 may apply to the Arkansas		
21	State Board of Chiropractic Examiners for a reinstatement of his or her		
22	license and must submit to the board a reinstatement fee of twenty-five		
23	dollars (\$25.00) together with all back fees, plus proof of compliance with		
24	the continuing education and federal and state background check requirements		
25	of § 17-81-312.		
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
