To that end he or she may call upon the citizens to assist him or her to apprehend all persons in the act of committing any offense against the laws of the state or the ordinances of the city, and he or she shall bring them immediately before the proper authority for examination or trial.
  - (d) The chief of police shall have <u>has</u> power to pursue or arrest any person fleeing from justice in any part of the state and to receive and execute any proper authority for arrest and detention of criminals fleeing or escaping from any other place or state.
  - (e) The chief of police shall have has, in the discharge of his or her proper duties, like powers, and shall be is subject to like responsibilities as sheriffs and constables in similar cases, and shall be is required by the city council to give a bond for the faithful performance of his or her duties, in such a sum as such the council may require.
