13	THE STATE BOARD OF HEALTH TO MAKE RULES FOR THE SALE
14	OF LOCALLY PRODUCED WHOLE MILK THAT IS NOT
15	PASTEURIZED; AND FOR OTHER PURPOSES.

19	TO PROMOTE LOCAL MILK PRODUCTS; TO ALLOW
20	THE INCIDENTAL SALE OF WHOLE MILK THAT IS
21	NOT PASTEURIZED; AND TO ALLOW THE STATE
22	BOARD OF HEALTH TO MAKE RULES FOR THE
23	SALES.

26	BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ARKANSAS:
27	
28	SECTION 1. Arkansas Code § 20-59-248 is amended to read as follows:
29	20-59-248. Incidental sales of goat milk and whole milk that has not
30	<u>been</u> pasteurized not prohibited.
31	(a) For purposes of this section;:
32	(1) "incidental Incidental sales of goat milk and whole milk
33	that has not been pasteurized" are those sales where the average monthly
34	number of gallons sold does not exceed one hundred (100) five hundred
35	gallons <u>;</u>
36	(2) "Locally produced whole milk products" means whole milk that

1	has been produced on an Arkansas farm; and
2	(3)(A) "Whole milk" means the lacteal secretion obtained by the
3	complete milking of one (1) or more healthy cows, properly fed and kept, that
4	when offered for sale contains at least three and one-fourth percent (3 $\frac{1}{4}\%$) of
5	butterfat and eight and one-fourth percent (8½%) solids not fat.
6	(B) "Whole milk" does not include lacteal secretion
7	obtained within fifteen (15) days before or five (5) days after calving or a
8	longer period if necessary to render the milk practically colostrum free.
9	(b) The provisions of this subchapter shall not be construed to This
10	subchapter does not prohibit incidental sales of raw goat milk and whole milk
11	that has not been pasteurized directly to consumers at the farm where the
12	milk is produced or $ extstyle \Theta$ preclude the advertising of incidental sales of goat
13	milk and whole milk that has not been pasteurized.
14	(c) With respect to whole milk that has not been pasteurized, the
15	seller shall:
16	(1) Post at the point of sale a sign that is no smaller than two
17	feet (2') by four feet (4') that includes the following information in large,
18	clear text:
19	(A) The name and address of the farm with seller's contact
20	information; and
21	(B) The following statement:
22	"This product, sold for personal use and not for resale, is fresh whole
23	milk that has NOT been pasteurized. Neither this farm nor the milk
24	sold by this farm has been inspected by the State of Arkansas. The
25	consumer assumes all liability for health issues that may result from
26	the consumption of this product."; and
27	(2) Affix a label to the bottle or package that includes:
28	(A) The name and address of the farm; and
29	(B) The following statement:
30	"This product, sold for personal use and not for resale, is fresh whole
31	milk that has NOT been pasteurized. Neither this farm nor the milk
32	sold by this farm has been inspected by the State of Arkansas. The
33	consumer assumes all liability for health issues that may result from
34	the consumption of this product."
35	(d) A farmer who sells fresh whole unpasteurized milk shall permit
36	inspection of his or her cows and barns by his or her customers upon request.
