provisional license to any teacher who seeks Arkansas licensure and is
trained in and licensed by a state other than Arkansas <u>if the teacher has</u>
<u>been in good standing during the most recent three (3) years of teaching in</u>
another state.

7 (b)(1) Any <u>A</u> person who has not successfully completed the licensure 8 examination <u>tests</u> designated by the state board under §-6-17-601 et seq. 6-9 <u>17-402</u> and who has not previously held an Arkansas license but meets degree, 10 course work, and experience requirements for a standard license and who 11 otherwise qualifies to teach in the public schools of this state may receive 12 a one-year nonrenewable provisional license and be employed by any public 13 school district in this state for a period not to exceed one (1) year.
