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1	SECTION 2. EMERGENCY CLAUSE. It is found and determined by the		
2	General Assembly of the State of Arkansas that some Arkansas graduates are a		
3	a disadvantage under the current weighting system for the Arkansas Governor's		
4	Scholars Program; that the Department of Higher Education shall ensure that		
5	the weighting system used by the department does not put home-schooled		
6	students at a disadvantage; and that this act is immediately necessary to		
7	ensure that the Arkansas Governor's Scholars Program awards granted for the		
8	2013-2014 school year incorporate the revised weighting criteria developed by		
9	the department. Therefore, an emergency is declared to exist and this act		
10	being immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health		
11	and safety shall become effective on:		
12	(1) The date of its approval by the Governor;		
13	(2) If the bill is neither approved nor vetoed by the Governor,		
14	the expiration of the period of time during which the Governor may veto the		
15	bill; or		
16	(3) If the bill is vetoed by the Governor and the veto is		
17	overridden, the date the last house overrides the veto.
