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I	(c) The purpose of the program is to address the educational and		
2	career training of students who:		
3	(1) May desire a career path other than the traditional		
4	enrollment in postsecondary education as a first-time full-time freshman; or		
5	(2) Have left high school and want to return to complete their		
6	secondary education.		
7	(d)(1) When a student enrolls in the program, the school, the Adult		
8	Education Section of the Department of Career Education, the student, and the		
9	parent jointly shall develop an education plan for the participating student		
10	that:		
11	(A) Includes learning opportunities, vocational-technical		
12	training, tutoring, and mentoring designed to meet the participating		
13	student's needs;		
14	(B) Includes meetings with a guidance counselor;		
15	(C) Is not based entirely on traditional credit-based		
16	instruction;		
17	(D) May provide for a minimum number of hours of adult		
18	education programming based on:		
19	(i) The educational needs of the participating		
20	student; and		
21	(ii) The employment of the student, if applicable;		
22	<u>and</u>		
23	(E) May include without limitation transitional courses		
24	and courses for concurrent credit.		
25	(e) In developing the program, the Department of Education and the		
26	Department of Career Education may include without limitation:		
27	(1) Exempting the student from the compulsory attendance

30	services identified under the student's education plan;		
31	(3) Flexibility in the number of instructional hours required to

33	(4) An alternative or dual high school diploma.		
34	(f) The State Board of Education and the State Board of Career		
35	Education may promulgate rules as necessary to implement this section.
