3	7-11-105. Special elections to be held on the second Tuesday of a
4	month — Exceptions — Separate ballots.
5	(a) Except as provided in this chapter, $rac{all}{a}$ special $rac{elections}{all}$
6	election to fill vacancies a vacancy in office and the associated special
7	primary $\frac{\text{elections}}{\text{election}}$ shall be held on the second Tuesday of $\frac{\text{any}}{\text{a}}$
8	month.
9	(b) A special election or special primary election scheduled to occur
10	in a month in which the second Tuesday of the month is a legal holiday shall
11	be held on the third Tuesday of the month.
12	(c) A special election or special primary election called in June of
13	an even-numbered year shall be held on the fourth Tuesday of the month.
14	(d) <del>(1)</del> Special elections <u>or special primary elections</u> held in months
15	in which a preferential primary election or general election is scheduled to
16	occur shall be held on the date of the preferential primary election or

3	7-11-107. Unopposed candidates.
4	(a) If only one (1) candidate qualifies for a political party's
5	nomination in a special primary election for an office, the candidate shall
6	be certified as the nominee of the political party without being placed on a
7	ballot, and the special primary election for the office shall not be held.
8	(b) If there is only one (1) candidate after all deadlines for filing
9	as a candidate have passed in a special election or special primary election
10	to fill a vacancy and if no other office or issue is on the ballot, the
11	candidate shall be declared the nominee and county board of election
12	commissioners may provide that:
13	(1) Polling places shall not be open on election day and the
14	election shall be conducted by absentee ballot and early voting only; or
15	(2) Only one (1) polling place shall be open and that polling
16	place may be at the courthouse and may be staffed by the county clerk or as
17	many poll workers as the county board deems necessary.
18	(b)(c) In a county that uses voting machines or an electronic vote
19	tabulating device, the county board may:
20	(1) Choose to use paper ballots counted by hand for the
21	election; and
22	(2)(A) Provide that no voting machines shall be used in the
23	election.
24	(B) If the county board chooses to provide that no voting
25	machines shall be used in the election, any other provision in Arkansas law
26	requiring the use of a voting machine shall not apply to this section.
