- 1 (1) Initial the back of the ballot;
- 2 (2) Remove the ballot stub; and
- 3 (3) Place the stub into the stub box provided.
- 4 (e)(b)(1)(A) Upon receiving his or her ballot, the voter shall proceed to mark it by placing an appropriate mark.
- 6 (B) A voter shall not be allowed more than five (5)
- 7 minutes to mark his or her ballot.
- 8 (2) The voter shall then personally deposit the  $\underline{\text{marked}}$  ballot 9 into the ballot box provided.
- 10 (d)(1)(c) The voter shall not be required to sign, initial, or in any
  11 way identify himself or herself with the ballot, the ballot stub, or the list
  12 of voters other than in the manner set forth provided in this section.
- 13 <del>(2) However, a</del>
- 14 <u>(d) A</u> poll worker may inspect the back of the ballot before the voter 15 deposits it to see if it has been initialed by an election official.
- 16 (e) After having voted or <del>having</del> declined to <del>do so</del> <u>vote</u>, the voter 17 shall immediately depart from the polling site.
- 18 (f) A person shall not be permitted to carry a ballot outside of the polling place.
- 20 (g)(1) If a paper ballot is left at a voting booth or anywhere else in 21 the polling site without being inserted into outside of the ballot box by 22 after the voter before departing the polling site has departed, a poll worker 23 shall:
- 24 (A) Write "Abandoned" on the face of the paper ballot;

14	SECTION 2. Arkansas Code § 7-5-310(a), concerning privacy in voting		
15	booths, is amended to read as follows:		
16	(a)(1) Each voter shall be provided the privacy to mark his or her		
17	ballot. Privacy shall be provided by the poll workers at each polling site or		
18	by the county clerk, if the county clerk conducts early voting, to ensure		
19	that a voter desiring privacy is not singled out.		
20	(2)(A) In a county that uses paper ballots, the county board of		
21	election commissioners shall:		
22	(i) Provide voting booths at a polling site; and		
23	(ii) Determine the appropriate number of voting		
24	booths at a polling site.		
25	(B) A voting booth shall be:		
26	(i) Constructed to permit the voter to prepare his		
27	or her ballot screened from observation;		
28	(ii) Furnished with supplies and conveniences that		
29	will enable the voter to prepare his or her ballot; and		
30	(iii) Situated in the plain view of a poll worker.		
31	(C) If a person is not a poll worker and is not casting a		
32	ballot, he or she shall not be within six feet (6') of the voting booths,		
33	unless:		
34	(i) The person is authorized by an election judge;		
35	<u>and</u>		
36	(ii) The person's presence is necessary to keep		

1	order or enforce the law.		
2	(3) A person may not enter a polling place on election day		
3	during voting hours unless the person is:		
4	(A) An election official;		
5	(B) An authorized poll watcher;		
6	(C) A voter present to cast his or her ballot;		
7	(D) A person in the care of a voter if the person:		
8	(i) Does not disrupt or interfere with the normal		
9	voting procedures; and		
10	(ii) Is not eligible to vote in that election;		
11	(E) A person lawfully assisting the voter;		
12	(F) A law enforcement officer or emergency service		
13	personnel who are acting in the line of duty;		
14	(G) A monitor authorized by the State Board of Election		
15	Commissioners or observer authorized by a federal agency with the authority		
16	to place the observer at the polling place;		
17	(H)(i) A person with business in the polling place that is		
18	not connected to the election.		
19	(ii) A person with business in the polling place		
20	that is not connected to the election shall remain outside of the voting room		
21	except to pass through or by the voting room with the purpose to conduct his		
22	or her business;		
23	(I) A person that the county board of election		
24	commissioners has authorized to assist in conducting the election; and		
25	(J) A person authorized by the State Board of Election		
26	Commissioners or county board of election commissioners.		
27	(4) A person shall not use photographic, electronic monitoring,		
28	recording, or cellular devices in a polling place to take a picture of a		
29	voter's marked ballot.
