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1 public authorities or for placement with private agencies or persons; 2 (d) "Placement" means: (1) The arrangement for the care of a child in a family, free or 3 4 boarding home or in a child-caring agency or institution but does not include 5 any institution caring for the mentally ill, mentally defective or epileptic 6 or any institution primarily educational in character, and any hospital or 7 other medical facility; and 8 (2) The arrangement for the care of a child in the home of his 9 or her parent, other relative, or non-agency guardian in a receiving state 10 when the sending agency is any entity other than a parent, relative, guardian 11 or non-agency guardian making the arrangement for care as a plan exempt under 12 Article VIII(a) of the compact. (e)(1) "Foster care" means the care of a child on a twenty-four-hour-13 14 a-day basis away from the home of the child's parent or parents. The care may 15 be by a relative of the child, by a non-related individual, by a group home, 16 or by a residential facility or any other entity. 17 In addition, if twenty-four-hour-a-day care is provided by (2) 18 the child's parents by reason of a court ordered placement and not by virtue 19 of the parent-child relationship, the care is foster care. 20 (3) "Foster care" shall not include placement in a residential facility by a parent if a child welfare agency or court is not involved with 21 22 the parent or child through an open case or investigation. 23 (f)(1) "Priority placement" means whenever a court, upon request or on 24 its own motion or where court approval is required, determines that a 25 proposed priority placement of a child from one (1) state into another state is necessary because placement is with a relative and: 26 27 (A) The child is under $\frac{1}{100}$ four (4) years of age, including older siblings sought to be placed with the same proposed 28 29 placement; 30 The child is in an emergency shelter placement; or (B) 31 The court finds that the child has spent a substantial (C) 32 amount of time in the home of relationship with the proposed placement recipient. resource; or 33 34 (D) An unexpected dependency due to a sudden or recent 35 incarceration, incapacitation, or death of a parent or guardian. 36 The state agency has thirty (30) days to complete a request (2)

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for a priority placement. (3) Requests for placement shall not be expedited or given priority except as outlined in this subsection. (g) "Home study" means a written report that is obtained after an investigation of a household and that may include a criminal background check, including a fingerprint-based criminal background check in the national crime information database and a local criminal background check on any person in the household sixteen (16) years of age and older. /s/Broadaway
