6	information regarding the quality and effectiveness of teacher preparation
7	programs in the state by evaluating teacher preparation programs using

11	(2) Improve student learning;
12	(3) Encourage teacher preparation programs to continually assess and
13	improve practices; and
14	(4) Improve teacher recruitment and retention efforts.

17	(a) Beginning on July 1, 2014, and each July 1 thereafter, the
18	Department of Education shall prepare a report on the effectiveness of all
19	teacher preparation programs in the state using data collected from each
20	teacher in his or her first five (5) years of placement as a teacher of
21	record in a school district.
22	(b) The report shall include, without limitation, the correlation
23	between different teacher preparation programs in the state and:
24	(1) Student academic achievement;
