3	(1) The Commissioner of Education, or his or her designee;		
4	(2) The Director of the Division of Children and Family Services		
5	of the Department of Human Services, or his or her designee;		
6	(3) The Director of the Department of Arkansas State Police, or		
7	<u>his or her designee;</u>		
8	(4) One (1) member appointed by the Governor;		
9	(5) One (1) member appointed by the Speaker of the House of		
10	<u>Representatives;</u>		
11	(6) One (1) member appointed by the President Pro Tempore of the		
12	<u>Senate;</u>		
13	(7) The Executive Director of the Arkansas Association of		
14	Educational Administrators, or his or her designee;		
15	(8) The Executive Director of the Arkansas School Boards		
16	Association, or his or her designee;		
17	(9) The Executive Director of the Arkansas Education		
18	Association, or his or her designee;		
19	(10) The Executive Director of the Arkansas Rural Education		
20	Association, or his or her designee;		
21	(11) A representative from Arkansas Advocates for Children and		
22	Families;

32	(e)(1) The task force shall meet at the times and places that the		
33	chair deems necessary but not less than four (4) times per year.		
34	(2) Seven (7) members of the task force shall constitute a		
35	guorum for the purpose of transacting business.		
36	(3) All actions of the task force are by quorum.		

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1	(f) The Department of Education shall staff the task force.	
2	(g) All members of the task force may receive expense reimbursement as	
3	provided under § 25-16-902 to be paid by the Department of Education if funds	
4	are available.	
5	(h)(1) By October 1, 2014, the chair of the task force shall provide a	
6	report to the Governor, the Speaker of the House of Representatives, the	
7	President Pro Tempore of the Senate, and the State Board of Education.	
8	(2) The report shall identify:	
9	(A) Findings of the task force concerning the prevalence	
10	<u>of child sexual abuse in Arkansas;</u>	
11	(B) Recommendations of the task force toward adopting and	
12	implementing age-appropriate curricula for students in kindergarten through	
13	grade five (K-5) concerning child sexual abuse prevention;	
14	(C) Recommendations of the task force concerning the	
15	training of licensed and classified school personnel on the prevention and	
16	detection of child sexual abuse;	
17	(D) Recommendations of the task force concerning the	
18	training of parents and guardians on the warning signs of child sexual abuse;	
19	(E) Recommendations for the publication of counseling,	
20	assistance, services, and other resources for students affected by child	
21	sexual abuse; and	
22	(F) Recommendations of the task force for the emotional	
23	and educational support for a victim of child sexual abuse.	
24	(i) The task force shall expire on May 1, 2015.	
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
