20	SECTION 1. Arka	ansas Code Title 6, Chapter 1, is a	amended to add an
21	additional subchapter	to read as follows:

26	6-1-601. Legis:	lative intent.	
27	The General Asso	embly finds that:	
28	(1) Educa	ators have two (2) primary responsi	ibilities to students
29	and to society:		
30	<u>(A)</u>	To instruct students in the skill	ls and knowledge
31	needed for success in	life; and	
32	<u>(B)</u>	To fairly and impartially evaluat	ce and record
33	students' mastery of	skills and knowledge so that studer	nts, parents, other
34	educational institution	ons, and prospective employers are	able to understand
35	how a particular stude	ent compares to others;	
36	(2) Grade	e inflation is unfair to all studer	nts. When an educator

1	awards grades that indicate higher than actual level of mastery of skills and		
2	knowledge, it is unfair to:		
3	(A) A student receiving an inflated grade, because the		
4	student will have a false impression of his or her actual level of mastery of		
5	skills and knowledge; and		
6	(B) A student who has mastered the skills and knowledge		
7	but is in a class of students receiving inflated grades, because the		
8	student's performance will be undervalued;		
9	(3) Grade inflation is a difficult state policy to govern by		
10	legislative mandate, such as, requiring that a school that has inflated		
11	grades reduce the grade averages; and		
12	(4) State policy is better served by requiring comparative		
13	information concerning the grades of other students in the same class as the		
14	student identified on a report card or transcript because:		
15	(A) Students and parents will have the information needed		
16	to understand how the individual student compares to others in the class; and		
17	(B) Reporting of the grade distribution will highlight		
18	poor grading practices, such as awarding a high proportion of exceptional		
19	grades or failing to distinguish between above-average, average, and below-		
20	average mastery of the knowledge and skills of students in a class.		
21			
22	6-1-602. Definitions.		
23	As used in this subchapter:		
24	(1) "Assigned educator" means the teacher or faculty member who:		
25	(A) Is responsible for supervising a student's work in a		
26	course being reported under this subchapter on a report card or transcript;		
27	<u>and</u>		
28	(B) Assigns the student's grade;		
29	(2) "Public school" means a public elementary school, middle		
30	school, or secondary school or an open-enrollment public charter school; and		
31	(3)(A) "State-supported institution of higher education" means		
32	an institution of higher education in this state funded in whole or in part		
33	with state funds.		
34	(B) "State-supported institution of higher education" does		
35	not include a privately owned or operated institution of higher education		
36	that receives funds on behalf of a student with a state-funded scholarship.

2	6-1-603. Reporting of grades on report cards and transcripts.
3	(a)(1) By August 1, 2015, a public school or state-supported
4	institution of higher education shall include on a student's report card or
5	transcript of grades the distribution of grades assigned to all students who
6	were:
7	(A) Taught the same material in the same semester,
8	quarter, or equivalent time frame by the same assigned educator; and
9	(B) Evaluated on the same basis as the student identified
10	on the report card or transcript of grades.
11	(2) For institutions of higher education, this section applies
12	to undergraduate courses only.
13	(b) This distribution of grades may be reported as:
14	(1) For a grading system using standard letter grades with or
15	without pluses and minuses, the number of students in the class:
16	(A) Earning each grade under the grading system; and
17	(B) Withdrawing from the course, if applicable; or
18	(2)(A) For a grading system that allows an assigned educator to
19	report a large number of different grades or scores and that would result in
20	an unreasonably long report card or transcript, the number of students:
21	(i) In each specific range of scores using a
22	reasonable and uniform size for each score range and a reasonable number of
23	ranges; and
24	(ii) Withdrawing from the course, if applicable.
25	(B) If a distribution of grades or scores is reported
26	using ranges under this subdivision (b)(2), the full detail of the
27	distribution of scores or grades for a class shall be made available upon
28	request to anyone who otherwise has the right to the transcript or report
29	card.
30	(c)(l) A report card or transcript required to report the distribution
31	of grades under this section shall include the following notice:
32	"Arkansas state law requires that the distribution of grades in each class be
33	reported in order to allow students, parents, educators, and others with
34	legitimate need the means to compare a student's performance to others
35	studying the same material in a similar time frame with a particular
36	instructor. In some cases, such as classes with limited enrollment,

3	(2) Additional explanatory material may be added at the		
4	discretion of the public school or state-supported institution of higher		
5	education.		
6			
7	6-1-604. Reporting of grades in teacher evaluations.		
8	(a) A public school shall include in a teacher evaluation under the		
9	Teacher Excellence and Support System, § 6-17-2801 et seq., a review of the		
10	distribution of grades of classes in which the teacher is the assigned		
11	educator.		
12	(b) A state-supported institution of higher education shall include a		
13	review of the distribution of grades of classes in which an instructor or		
14	faculty member is an assigned educator in the instructor's or faculty		
15	<pre>member's:</pre>		
16	(1) Annual evaluation materials;		
17	(2) Tenure materials; and		
18	(3) Promotion materials.		
19	(c) For the purpose of this section, a person evaluating the materials		
20	<pre>shall:</pre>		
21	(1) Consider whether the distribution of grades for classes in		
22	which the instructor or faculty member is the assigned educator demonstrate		
23	good grading practices; and		
24	(2) Require a teacher to explain an unusual grade distribution		
25	or unusual number of high or low grades in a class.		
26			
27	6-1-605. Reporting of grade distribution on the annual school		
28	performance report.		
29	(a) A public school shall report the distribution of grades for the		
30	school by grade level and subject on the annual school performance report		
31	under § 6-15-1402.		
32	(b) A state-supported institution of higher education shall report the		
33	distribution of grades for the institution by course to the Department of		
34	Higher Education for inclusion in the Comprehensive Arkansas Higher Education		
35	Annual Report under § 6-60-704.		

T	6-1-606. Compliance with privacy laws.
2	(a) A public school or state-supported institution of higher education
3	shall comply with the standards under § 6-15-415 in reporting the
4	distribution of grades earned by students other than a student identified on
5	a report card or transcript under this subchapter.
6	(b) To prevent a violation of state or federal privacy laws, a public
7	school or state-funded institution of higher education may:
8	(1) Establish a reasonable minimum number students in a class or
9	in a grade distribution as twenty (20) or less to be reported under this
10	section:
11	(A) On a report card;
12	(B) On a transcript of grades; or
13	(C) In publically available records; or
14	(2) For purposes of the grade reporting required under this
15	subchapter, combine classes or sections of classes in which students were:
16	(A) Taught the same material in the same semester,
17	quarter, or equivalent time frame by the same assigned educator; and
18	(B) Evaluated on the same basis.
19	(c) No grade distribution shall be reported on a report card,
20	transcript of grades, or other publicly available material if all students in
21	the class received the same grade.
22	(d) The restrictions on privacy under this section do not apply to
23	grade distribution information provided to the evaluator under § 6-1-604.
24	
25	SECTION 3. Arkansas Code § 6-15-1402(b)(2), concerning the school
26	performance report for elementary schools, is amended to add an additional
27	subdivision to read as follows:
28	(C) Include the distribution of student grades by subject
29	as required under § 6-1-605.
30	
31	SECTION 4. Arkansas Code § 6-15-1402(b)(3), concerning the school
32	performance report for middle schools, junior high schools, and high schools,
33	is amended to add an additional subdivision to read as follows:
34	(C) Include the distribution of student grades by subject
35	as required under § 6-1-605.
