7	(6) "Pen" means a fenced enclosure sufficient for preventing a
8	dog or cat from escaping or another dog from entering;
9	(7) "Sterilized" means to permanently render an animal incapable
10	of reproduction.

12	20-19-602. License required.
13	(a) A dog or cat over the age of six (6) months shall be sterilized
14	unless the owner of the dog or cat qualifies for an intact animal license
15	<u>under § 20-19- 603.</u>
16	(b) The owner of a cat or dog is exempt from this subchapter if:
17	(1) An owner of a purebred dog or cat of a breed that is
18	recognized and currently registered by a professional registering
19	organization including:
20	(A) The American Kennel Club;
21	(B) The United Kennel Club;
22	(C) The Cat Fanciers' Association; or
23	(D) The International Cat Association;
24	(2) An owner of a dog that is documented as having been
25	appropriately trained and that is being used for public law enforcement
26	activities, military activities, or for search-and-rescue activities;
27	(3)(A) A person acting as a custodian of a dog or cat housed
28	within:
29	(i) Municipal or county animal shelters;
30	(ii) Humane societies or other organizations that
31	are:
32	(a) Staffed by personnel who are certified
33	through an accredited animal control association or an accredited
34	governmental agency;
35	(b) Operated in a nonresidential area; and
36	(c) Designated as a nonprofit organization as

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1	defined by the Internal Revenue Code, 26 U.S.C. § 501(c)(3); or
2	(iii) Veterinary hospitals.
3	(B) A member of a rescue organization with noncertified
4	personnel operating from their own residential property or the residential
5	property of another person are not exempt from this subchapter;
6	(4) The owner of a dog or cat that has been determined by a
7	veterinarian to be unfit for sterilization because the surgery would endanger
8	the life of the animal; and
9	(5)(A) Owners of dogs that are specifically trained as service
10	dogs or used for hunting or field-trial competition.
11	(B) Dogs used for hunting or field-trial competitions
12	shall be kept in appropriate pens at all times except when actually engaged
13	in hunting, field-trial competitions, or related activities.
14	(C) An owner of a dog used for hunting or field-trial
15	competition shall present on request a state issued hunting license from the
16	most recent hunting season.
17	(D) If the dog is used to hunt waterfowl, the hunting
18	license shall contain a federal and state waterfowl stamp.
19	(E) An owner of a dog that are used for field-trial
20	competition shall present on request documentation proving participation in
21	field-trial activities within the past twelve (12) months.
22	(F) Dogs that are specifically trained and used as service
23	dogs include guide dogs or assistance dogs for the hearing impaired.
24	(c)(l) An owner has the burden of proving that the intact animal is:
25	(A) A dog or cat that meets the criteria in subsection (b)
26	of this section;
27	(B) Sterilized; or
28	(C) Registered with a registered organization as listed in
29	subdivision (b)(1) of this section.
30	(2) The registration shall include:
31	(i) A registration number issued by the registering
32	organization; and
33	(ii) At least a three-generation pedigree.
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35	20-19-603. Application - Fee.
36	(a)(l) The county clerk of each county in Arkansas shall administer a

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1	certification program to allow owners of dogs or cats that are over the age
2	of six (6) months to obtain an intact-animal license.
3	(2) Except for an animal that is exempt under § 20-19-602(b), an
4	owner of a dog or cat that is over the age of six (6) months shall apply for
5	an intact-animal license by:
6	(A) Submitting a request for the license to the county
7	clerk of the county where the animal resides that includes:
8	(i) Proof of current rabies vaccination; and
9	(ii) A statement that the owner is in compliance
10	with this subchapter; and
11	(B) Payment of an annual fee of fifty dollars (\$50.00);
12	(3) An intact-animal license is valid for twelve (12) months
13	from the date of issue.
14	(4) A license under this section may be denied or revoked by any
15	appropriate government entity having adjudication powers over local, city,
16	county, or state affairs.
17	(b) A license fee paid under subdivision (a)(2)(B) of this section is
18	disbursed as follows:
19	(1) Twenty-five dollars (\$25.00) of each fee shall be retained
20	in the county of issuance to cover the costs of administering and managing
21	the license program; and
22	(2) Twenty-five dollars (\$25.00) of each fee shall be utilized
23	to fund a sterilization program within the county of issuance.
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25	20-19-604. Violations.
26	(a)(1) It is a violation of this section:
27	(A) For an owner to allow an intact dog or cat to be at-
28	large and in direct contact with other intact dogs or cats; or
29	(B) If an owner of any dog or cat is found to be in
30	violation of the Rabies Control Act, § 20-19-301 et seq.
31	(2)(A) Upon conviction, an owner shall be fined not less than
32	five dollars (\$5.00) nor more than twenty-five dollars (\$25.00) for each
33	offense.
34	(B) Except for a violation of subdivision $(a)(1)(B)$, the
35	court may, in lieu of a fine, require the sterilization of a dog or cat.
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1	20-19-605. Enforcement.
2	(a) This section may be enforced by:
3	(1) Animal control officers, law enforcement officers, wildlife
4	officers, code officers, health officials, or any other authorized agency;
5	and
6	(2) Investigators or officers of humane societies who are
7	certified at a level one (1) certification by the National Animal Control
8	Association may also enforce this subchapter if they are certified through an
9	accredited animal control association or an accredited governmental agency.
10	(b) A person who does not meet the requirements of subsection (a) of
11	this section and knowingly provides enforcement for violations of this
12	subchapter, on conviction is guilty of a class D misdemeanor.
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
