16	(b) The owner of a cat or dog is exempt from this subchapter if he or

18	(1) An owner of a purebred dog or cat of a breed that is		
19	recognized and currently registered by a professional registering		
20	<u>organization.</u>		
21	(2) An owner of a dog that is documented as having been

33	(a)(l) The county clerk of each county in Arkansas shall administer a		
34	certification program to allow owners of dogs or cats that are over the age		
35	of six (6) months to obtain an intact-animal license.		
36	(2) Except for an animal that is exempt under § 20-19-602(b), an

I	owner of a dog or cat that is over the age of six (6) months shall apply for		
2	an intact-animal license by:		
3	(A) Submitting a request for the license to the county		
4	clerk of the county where the animal resides that includes:		
5	(i) Proof of current rabies vaccination; and		
6	(ii) A statement that the owner is in compliance		
7	with this subchapter; and		
8	(B) Payment of an annual fee of fifty dollars (\$50.00);		
9	(3) An intact-animal license is valid for twelve (12) months		
10	from the date of issue.		
11	(4) A license under this section may be denied or revoked by any		
12	appropriate government entity having adjudication powers over local, city,		
13	county, or state affairs.		
14	(b) A license fee paid under subdivision (a)(2)(B) of this section is		
15	disbursed as follows:		
16	(1) Twenty-five dollars (\$25.00) of each fee shall be retained		
17	in the county of issuance to cover the costs of administering and managing		
18	the license program; and		
19	(2) Twenty-five dollars (\$25.00) of each fee shall be utilized		
20	to fund a sterilization program within the county of issuance.

22	20-19-604. Violations.		
23	(a) Upon conviction of a violation of this subchapter, an owner shall		
24	be fined not less than one hundred dollars (\$100) and not more than five		
25	hundred dollars (\$500) for each offense.		
26	(b) The court may, in lieu of a fine, require the sterilization of a		
27	dog or cat.		
28			
29	20-19-605. Enforcement.		
30	(a) This subchapter may be enforced by animal control officers, law		
31	enforcement officers, wildlife officers, code officers, health officials, or		
32	any other authorized agency.		
33	(b) A person who does not meet the requirements of subsection (a) of		
34	this section and knowingly provides enforcement for violations of this		
35	subchapter, on conviction is guilty of a class D misdemeanor.
