19	SECTION 1. Arkansas Code § 20-7-135(a), concerning nutrition and	
20	physical activity standards for public schools, is amended to read as	
21	follows:	
22	(a) After having consulted the Child Health Advisory Committee and the	е
23	State Board of Health, the State Board of Education shall promulgate	
24	appropriate rules and regulations to ensure that nutrition and physical	
25	activity standards and body mass index for age assessment protocols are	
26	implemented to provide students with the skills, opportunities, and	
27	encouragement to adopt healthy lifestyles.

29	SECTION 2. Arkansas Code § 20-7-135(b)(4), concerning nutrition and	
30	physical activity standards for public schools, is amended to read as	
31	follows:	
32	(4) Assign all community health nurses under its supervision to	
33	work with schools to assure that body mass index for age assessment protocol	s
34	are followed by school employees or their designees who conduct body mass	
35	index for age assessments and other student health screenings; and

1	SECTION 3. Arkansas Code § 20-7-135(c), concerning nutrition and
2	physical activity standards for public schools, are amended to read as
3	follows:
4	(c) Every school district shall:
5	(1) Prohibit for elementary school students in-school access to
6	vending machines offering food and beverages; and
7	(2) Require schools to include as part of the annual report to
8	parents and the community the amounts and specific sources of funds received
9	and expenditures made from competitive food and beverage contracts;
10	(3) Beginning with kindergarten and then in even-numbered
11	grades, require schools to include as a part of a student health report to
12	parents a body mass index percentile by age for each student; and
13	(4)(A) Permit any parent to refuse to have his or her child's
14	body mass index percentile for age assessed and reported, by providing a
15	written refusal to the school.
16	(B) Students in grades eleven through twelve (11-12) are
17	exempt from any policy or requirement of a public school or the state for
18	measuring or reporting body mass index.
