17	TO AMEND THE MEMBERSHIP OF THE STATE

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23	BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ARKANSAS:
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25	SECTION 1. Arkansas Code § 6-1-101 is amended to read as follows:
26	6-11-101. Members.
27	(a) <u>(1)</u> The State Board of Education shall be composed of nine (9)
28	members, each of whom is elected in the manner required under the general
29	<u>election laws of this state as follows</u> :
30	<del>(1)<u>(</u>A)</del> Two (2) members <del>to be selected</del> <u>elected</u> from each of
31	the congressional districts of the state <del>as they exist on the July 31, 2007</del> ;
32	and
33	(2)(B) One (1) member to be appointed elected as a member
34 25	at large from within the state.
35	(2) A candidate shall file for office with the Secretary of
36	State in the manner required under the general election laws of this state.



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1	(b) <del>(1)</del> The term of office of a member of the state board <del>shall be for</del>
2	<del>a single term of seven (7) years<u>:</u></del>
3	(1)(A) Shall be four (4) years.
4	(B) The terms shall be staggered as follows:
5	(i) One (1) member from each congressional district
6	shall serve an initial term of two (2) years;
7	(ii) One (1) member from each congressional district
8	shall serve an initial term of four (4) years; and
9	(iii) The member-at-large shall serve an initial
10	term of four (4) years;
11	(2) Shall be limited to two (2) four-year terms; and
12	(3) Shall begin on January 1 and end on December 31.
13	<del>(2)(A) Any member appointed to the state board to fill a vacancy</del>
14	for an uncompleted term with less than three (3) years remaining on the
15	original term may be reappointed to an additional term of seven (7) years.
16	(B) No member serving three (3) or more years on the state
17	<del>board may be reappointed.</del>
18	<del>(3) No current or new member shall be allowed to resign in order</del>
19	to be appointed to a new term on the state board.
20	(4) Nothing in this section shall be construed to change the
21	terms of any member of the state board who was appointed prior to June 3,
22	<del>2004.</del>
23	(c) The membership of the state board shall reflect the diversity in
24	general education.
25	<del>(d)(l) No person may serve as a member of the state board unless he or</del>
26	she is a qualified elector and is a person of high moral standards and
27	recognized ability.
28	<del>(2)</del> (c) A member of the state board:
29	(1) Shall be a qualified elector who is twenty-five (25) years
30	<u>of age or older;</u>
31	(2) For a position representing a congressional district, shall
32	be a resident of the congressional district from which he or she is seeking
33	election for one (1) year preceding the election; and
34	(3) Shall not be:
35	<u>(A)</u> Neither the <u>The</u> Commissioner of Education nor any;
36	<u>(B) A</u> candidate for <u>any other</u> public office <del>,</del> ;

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1	<u>(C) The</u> holder of a public office in the state <del>,</del> ;
2	(D) schoolteacher <u>An employee of a public school or school</u>
3	district in this state <del>,</del> ;
4	(E) A county or city superintendent <del>,</del>
5	<u>(F) An</u> employee of a state-supported <del>college or</del>
6	<del>university,</del> <u>institution of higher education;</u> or
7	<u>(G) A</u> member of any board of trustees of <del>any state</del> <u>a</u>
8	state-supported institution of higher <del>learning shall serve as a member of the</del>
9	state board education in this state.
10	<del>(c)<u>(</u>d)</del> The members of the state board <del>shall be appointed by the</del>
11	Governor, subject to the confirmation of the Senate and shall take the oath
12	of office for officers prescribed by the Arkansas Constitution.
13	<del>(f)(l)(e)(l)</del> Whenever a vacancy occurs in the membership of the state
14	board by death, resignation, or removal from office, the Governor shall
15	appoint a successor who shall serve the remainder of the unexpired term of
16	the member <del>that</del> whom he or she succeeded, subject to all other provisions of
17	this section.
18	(2) Resignation, removal from the district from which he or she
19	is appointed, disqualification, incapacitation from mental or physical
20	disability or otherwise, or change in status from the eligibility
21	requirements for membership on the state board shall automatically create a
22	vacancy in the membership of the state board, and no such member shall
23	thereafter exercise any of the functions of membership on the state board
24	<del>even though his or her successor has not been appointed</del> <u>The Governor shall</u>
25	fill a vacancy with a person who meets the qualifications for the position
26	<u>vacated</u> .
27	<del>(g)(l) Members of the state board shall be subject to removal from</del>
28	office by the Governor when the actions or condition of a member shall be
29	considered as sufficient cause for removal.
30	(2) However, before a member may be removed for cause, this
31	cause must have been accepted as true, good, and sufficient by a majority
32	written vote of all members of the state board after a formal hearing at a
33	regular or special session of the state board.
34	(h)(f) The members of the state board shall serve without remuneration
35	but may receive expense reimbursement and stipends in accordance with § 25-
36	16-901 et seq., as follows:

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1	(1) Actual expenses while attending regular and special meetings
2	of the state board; and
3	(2) A per diem allowance when in attendance at regular or
4	special meetings of the state board.
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6	SECTION 2. <u>TEMPORARY LANGUAGE. DO NOT CODIFY.</u>
7	(a) The first election of members of the State Board of Education
8	under this act shall be the 2014 general election.
9	(b)(1) The term of a person who is a member of the state board on the
10	effective date of this act or who is appointed to the state board after the
11	effective date of this act and before the 2014 general election shall expire
12	on December 31, 2014.
13	(2) A person who is a member of the state board before the 2014
14	general election and who meets all other qualifications for members under
15	this act is eligible to be a candidate for a position on the state board in
16	the 2014 general election.
17	(c) At the first regular meeting of the state board following the
18	election, the members representing each of the four (4) congressional
19	districts shall draw for staggered terms as provided under this act.
