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24	WHEREAS, Clean Line Energy Partners, LLC, has submitted to the United
25	States Department of Energy an application for its Plains & Eastern Clean
26	Line transmission project to construct and operate a transmission line
27	throughout various states, including Arkansas; and
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29	WHEREAS, the project will not provide energy to the citizens of this
30	state or benefit consumers of energy within this state; and
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32	WHEREAS, in addition to federal regulatory approval, Clean Line Energy
33	Partners, LLC, is required to obtain a certificate of public convenience and
34	necessity from the Arkansas Public Service Commission to enable Clean Line
35	Energy Partners, LLC, to operate as a public utility in the State of Arkansas
36	before it can construct and operate a transmission facility within the State

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3 WHEREAS, the route of the proposed corridor for the transmission line 4 would travel through the bottleneck of the Mississippi Flyway within the 5 State of Arkansas, an important national staging area for water fowl 6 migration; and 7 8 WHEREAS, The Mississippi Flyway includes parts of fourteen (14) states 9 from Canada to the Gulf of Mexico, and the bottleneck area provides great 10 economic benefit to the region and the State of Arkansas due to the favorable 11 conditions it provides for water fowl and duck hunting; and 12 13 WHEREAS, the proposed transmission line would pass through numerous 14 Arkansas counties, including Crawford, Franklin, Johnson, Pope, Conway, Van 15 Buren, Faulkner, Cleburne, White, Jackson, Poinsett, and Mississippi, and 16 would be extremely detrimental to the state's water fowl, duck hunting, 17 agriculture and related businesses, and the property values in these areas; 18 and 19 20 WHEREAS, the state is best served by denying permission to go forward 21 with the project or, if permitted, requiring the transmission lines to be 22 placed underground; and 23 24 WHEREAS, the United Stated Department of Energy should reject the 25 application of Clean Line Energy Partners, LLC, for its Plains & Eastern 26 Clean Line transmission project in its entirety or, at a minimum, require 27 that the transmission lines be buried underground; and

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WHEREAS, to protect the state's agriculture industry, property values, duck hunting, and water fowl, in and around numerous counties within the State, the Arkansas Public Service Commission should reject the application of Clean Line Energy Partners, LLC, for a certificate of environmental compatibility and public need,

36 BE IT RESOLVED BY THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES OF THE EIGHTY-NINTH GENERAL

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1 ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ARKANSAS:

THAT the House of Representatives encourages the United States Department of Energy to reject the application of Clean Line Energy Partners, LLC, for its Plains & Eastern Clean Line transmission project in its entirety or require that the line be buried underground. BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED THAT the House of Representatives encourages the Arkansas Public Service Commission to reject the application of Clean Line Energy Partners, LLC, for a certificate of public convenience and necessity to operate as a public utility within the State of Arkansas. BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED THAT upon adoption of this resolution, the Chief Clerk of the House of Representatives shall transmit a copy to the United States Department of Energy, the Arkansas Public Service Commission, the Arkansas Congressional delegation, the Governor, and the President of the United States.
