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| 20 | WHEREAS, public policy such as the Morrill Act of 1862 and the G.I. |
| 21 | Bill of 1944 set a precedent in the United States that broadened the access |
| 22 | to higher education in order to allow for upward economic, social, and |
| 23 | intellectual mobility for all Americans, which made the United States the |
| 24 | envy of the world; and |
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| 26 | WHEREAS, we live in a time when access to and completion of a |
| 27 | postsecondary education is increasingly important to the economic viability |
| 28 | of our state and the quality of life of its citizens; and |
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| 30 | WHEREAS, Arkansas ranks near the bottom of the United States in |
| 31 | percentage of adults with college degrees, and Arkansas Governor Mike Beebe |
| 32 | has charged lawmakers, business leaders, and higher education institutions to |
| 33 | promote policies that will dramatically increase the number of Arkansans with |
| 34 | postsecondary degrees by the year 2025; and |
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| 36 | WHEREAS, the cost to students for a quality postsecondary education |



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1 continues to rise as enrollment growth has far outpaced increases in state 2 funding for Arkansas's institutions of higher education; and 3 4 WHEREAS, Governor Beebe and the General Assembly have remained 5 supportive of funding higher education during difficult economic times in 6 which other states have dramatically reduced funding; and 7 8 WHEREAS, because of job and family obligations, thousands of Arkansans 9 are unable to access or complete the educational programs provided on the 10 state's existing two-year and four-year college and university campuses; and 11 12 WHEREAS, advancements in modern technology make it possible to deliver 13 high-quality, affordable, postsecondary courses and degree programs to anyone 14 with access to a computer or even a mobile device; and 15 16 WHEREAS, these technological advances are being utilized across the 17 world to help lower the cost of higher education and improve the retention 18 and completion rates of students; and 19 20 WHEREAS, the Board of Trustees of the University of Arkansas has passed 21 a resolution charging its president and campus leadership to explore the 22 coordination and expansion of quality, affordable, accessible, online courses 23 and degree programs, 24 25 NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES OF THE EIGHTY-26 NINTH GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ARKANSAS: 27 28 THAT the House of Representatives applauds the efforts of the Board of 29 Trustees of the University of Arkansas and the leadership of the University 30 of Arkansas System and its campuses to further develop strategies and methods 31 of delivery that will utilize innovative technologies to allow Arkansas 32 students to graduate on time and provide greater access to those unserved and 33 underserved Arkansans who require flexible, convenient, educational options 34 in order to reach their full potential. 35

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
