24	by teachers and students of Little Rock Central High School to obtain and
25	preserve personal stories of individuals who have lived through historic and
26	current civil rights struggles, not only at Central High School but across
27	Arkansas; and
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29	WHEREAS, the Little Rock Central High Memory Project created a website
30	to serve as a permanent online resource for students, teachers, historians,
31	and families of those who shared their stories; and
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33	WHEREAS, "Mapping the Road to Change: Insights on Perceptions,
34	Prejudice, & Acceptance" (2012) is the second volume created through the
35	Memory Project; the first volume, "Beyond Central, Toward Acceptance", was
36	published in 2010; and



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2	WHEREAS, "Mapping the Road to Change: Insights on Perceptions,
3	Prejudice, & Acceptance" is a collection of oral histories of individuals who
4	have lived through civil rights struggles, collected and written by Central
5	High School ninth-grade civic students; and
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7	WHEREAS, senior editors chose the essays in the book from over 300
8	reviewed, organized the essays into chapters, selected appropriate artwork,
9	and wrote chapter commentaries under the guidance of three (3) social studies
10	teachers; and
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12	WHEREAS, teachers also created a list of lesson ideas to align with the
13	Common Core State Standards; and
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15	WHEREAS, "Mapping the Road to Change: Insights on Perceptions,
16	Prejudice, & Acceptance" provides insights on perception, prejudice, and
17	acceptance gained through oral histories collected by students of Little Rock
18	Central High School; and
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20	WHEREAS, "Mapping the Road to Change: Insights on Perceptions,
21	Prejudice, & Acceptance" is dedicated to the Little Rock Nine, who first
22	blazed the trail to change, and to the men and women who helped widen this
23	path by openly sharing their personal experiences; and
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25	WHEREAS, "Mapping the Road to Change: Insights on Perceptions,
26	Prejudice, & Acceptance" has been praised by Dr. Judith A. Hayne, associate
27	professor at the University of Arkansas at Little Rock, as a book in which
28	the "stories are moving and poignant, and the conclusions by the young
29	journalists are heart-felt; thus, teens will be drawn into the lives of
30	others who have weathered prejudice and turned it into acceptance"; and

34	the Memory Project Revolving Loan Fund; and
