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18 WHEREAS, American consumers deserve to have confidence that	at the
19 products they buy, when used for their intended purposes, are sa	afe; and
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21 WHEREAS, a federal chemical management program should place	-
22 the public health, including children's health, as its highest p	priority and
23 should include strict oversight; and	
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25 WHEREAS, a federal chemical management program should pres	
26 America's role as the world's leading innovator and employer in	
27 manufacture, processing, distribution in commerce, and use of commerce	hemicals; and
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29 WHEREAS, the current chemical management law, the Toxic St	
30 Control Act, 15 U.S.C. § 2601 et seq., was signed into law in 19	9/6 and 1s now
31 nearly thirty-five (35) years old; and 32	
33 WHEREAS, since the enactment of the Toxic Substances Conta	rol Act 15
34 U.S.C. § 2601 et seq., our ability to understand the impact cher	
35 the human body and the environment has advanced significantly;	
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1 WHEREAS, these advancements in science and technology should be 2 integrated into the federal chemical management program; and 3 4 WHEREAS, momentum for modernization of the federal chemical regulatory 5 system is growing in the United States Congress; and 6 7 WHEREAS, amendments to the Toxic Substances Control Act, 15 U.S.C. § 8 2601 et seq., should ensure that chemicals are safe for their intended use; 9 require companies that manufacture, import, process, distribute, or use 10 chemicals to provide the United States Environmental Protection Agency with 11 relevant information to the extent necessary for the agency to make safe use 12 determinations; assure that potential risks to children from exposure to 13 chemicals are considered in the assessment of safe use; empower the agency to 14 impose a range of risk management controls to ensure that chemicals are safe 15 for their intended use; encourage companies and the agency to work together 16 to enhance public access to chemical health and safety information; enable 17 the agency to have the staff, resources, and regulatory tools needed to 18 ensure the safety of chemicals; and ensure that the Toxic Substances Control 19 Act, 15 U.S.C. § 2601 et seq., remains a vehicle to promote and encourage 20 technological innovation and the maintenance of a globally competitive 21 industry in the United States; and 22 23 WHEREAS, amendments to the Toxic Substances Control Act, 15 U.S.C. § 24 2601 et seq., should require the agency to systematically prioritize 25 chemicals for the purpose of assessing their safe use, to act expeditiously 26 and efficiently in assessing the safe use of chemicals, and to rely on 27 scientifically valid data and information; and 28 29 WHEREAS, a robust federal chemical management system will obviate the 30 need for state governments to adopt different and at times conflicting state 31 regulatory programs that have the potential to have negative impacts on the 32 national economy, 33 34 NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED BY THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES OF THE EIGHTY-NINTH GENERAL 35 36 ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ARKANSAS:

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2	THAT the House of Representatives encourages the United States Congress
3	to enact legislation that modernizes the Toxic Substances Control Act, 15
4	U.S.C. § 2601 et seq.
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6	BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that upon adoption of this resolution, the Chief
7	Clerk of the House of Representatives shall mail a copy of this resolution to
8	each member of the Arkansas congressional delegation. WHEREAS, the purpose of
9	this resolution is to support the modernization of the federal Toxic
10	Substances Control Act of 1976.
