12	(2) Interest After a member has vested in the system, interest
13	shall be paid on accumulated member contributions at the rate of four percent
14	(4%) per annum.

16	SECTION 15. EMERGENCY CLAUSE. It is found and determined by the
17	General Assembly of the State of Arkansas that it is vital that the Arkansas
18	Public Employees' Retirement System be permitted to immediately implement
19	policies regarding the termination of employment, eligibility of employees to
20	receive benefits, availability of information, and when to pay interest on
21	employee contributions; and to clarify the meaning of terms in the Arkansas
22	Code of 1987 Annotated to avoid the undue consumption of the system's
23	resources. Therefore, an emergency is declared to exist, and this act being
24	immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health, and
25	safety shall become effective on:
26	(1) The date of its approval by the Governor;
27	(2) If the bill is neither approved nor vetoed by the Governor,
28	the expiration of the period of time during which the Governor may veto the
29	bill; or
30	(3) If the bill is vetoed by the Governor and the veto is
31	overridden, the date the last house overrides the veto.
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
