10	As used in this subchapter:			
11	(1) "Executive school leader" means a person holding an Arkansas			
12	administrator license or the equivalent who is serving in a leadership role			
13	as a school district-level or building-level executive leader in a public			
14	school, including a public charter school; and			
15	(2) "Leader-to-Leader" means a program with mentoring			
16	opportunities designed to build the capacity of executive school leaders			
17	through a one (1) year experience of meeting and working with other executive			
18	school leaders on a regular basis to improve school districts and public			
19	schools from the board room to the classroom.			
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21	6-1-603. Board of directors.			
22	(a)(1) The Board of Directors for the Arkansas Tech Center for			
23	Executive Leadership shall consist of eleven (11) members with three (3)			
24	nonvoting members and eight (8) voting members .			
25	(2) The three (3) nonvoting members shall be:			
26	(A) The Commissioner of Education or the commissioner's			
27	<u>designee;</u>			
28	(B) The Director of the Center for Leadership and Learning			
29	at Arkansas Tech University; and			
30	(C) The Executive Director of the Arkansas Tech Center for			
31	Executive Leadership.			
32	(3) The eight (8) voting members shall be:			
33	(A) Four (4) school-district level executive school			
34	leaders who are graduates of the Leader-to-Leader program representing each			
35	congressional district;			
36	(B) Two (2) building-level executive school leaders who			

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1	are graduates of the Leader-to-Leader program;
2	(C) The Executive Director of the Arkansas Association of
3	Educational Administrators; and
4	(D) The Executive Director of the Arkansas Public School

6	(b)(1) The current board members of the Arkansas Tech Center for
7	Executive Leadership shall continue to serve until the appointed membership
8	under subdivision (a)(3)(A) and (B) of this section are appointed.
9	(2) The current board members of the Arkansas Center for
10	Executive Leadership may be appointed to the newly created board under this
11	section.
12	(c)(1) Board members shall serve on a voluntary basis.
13	(2) Board members may be reimbursed for expenses under § 25-16-
14	902 paid by the Department of Education if funds are available.
15	(d)(1) Each member shall serve a term of three (3) years.
16	(2) The initial members appointed under subdivision (a)(3)(A)
17	and (B) of this section shall draw lots to determine the length of the
18	initial terms with:
19	(A) Two (2) appointees serving one (1) year;
20	(B) Two (2) appointees serving two (2) years; and
21	(C) Two (2) appointees serving three (3) years.
22	(e)(1) The voting membership of the board shall annually elect one (1)
23	of the voting members to serve as the chair.
24	(2) The chair shall serve as a nonvoting member during his or
25	her tenure as chair.
26	(f)(1) A majority of the total membership of the board shall
27	constitute a quorum for the purpose of transacting business.
28	(2) All board action is by majority vote of the quorum.
29	(g) The board shall meet a minimum of three (3) times per year or more
30	often as determined by the chair.
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32	6-1-604. Powers and duties.
33	The Board of Directors of the Arkansas Tech Center for Executive
34	<u>Leadership shall:</u>
35	(1) Provide oversight to the programs for executive school
36	<u>leaders;</u>

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1	(2) Select participants for the Leader-to-Leader programs based			
2	on a nomination and screening process established by the board;			
3	(3) Monitor the Leader-to-Leader programs to ensure they reflect			
4	the current needs of executive school leaders and to aid in the improvement			
5	of school districts and public schools, including public charter schools; and			
6	(4) Conduct an annual evaluation of the Arkansas Tech Center for			
7	Executive Leadership and provide a copy of the evaluation to the State Board			
8	of Education and the Board of Trustees of Arkansas Tech University no later			
9	than September 30 each year.
