2	assessed as a Level 3 or Level 4 offender to knowingly enter a swimming area		
3	or children's playground contained within an Arkansas State Park.		
4	(c) A violation of this section is a Class D felony.		
5			
6	SECTION 2. EMERGENCY CLAUSE. It is found and determined by the		
7	General Assembly of the State of Arkansas that high-level sex offenders often		
8	target young children as victims; that during the summer months, state parks		
9	are popular destinations for families with young children, especially those		
10	with a swimming area or a playground; and that this act is immediately		
11	necessary in order for it to be effective before the late spring and summer		
12	of this year when children will begin to go to state parks. Therefore, an		
13	emergency is declared to exist and this act being immediately necessary for		
14	the preservation of the public peace, health, and safety shall become		
15	effective on:		
16	(1) The date of its approval by the Governor;		
17	(2) If the bill is neither approved nor vetoed by the Governor,		
18	the expiration of the period of time during which the Governor may veto the		
19	<u>bill; or</u>		
20	(3) If the bill is vetoed by the Governor and the veto is		
21	overridden, the date the last house overrides the veto.
