7	SECTION 7. REAPPROPRIATION. There is hereby appropriated, to the Bureau
8	of Legislative Research of the Legislative Council, to be payable from the
9	State Central Services Fund, from the balance of the appropriation remaining
10	on June 30, 2013 in Section 3 of Act 101 of 2012, there to be used for the
11	same purposes for the fiscal year ending June 30, 2014, in a sum not to
12	exceed\$2,000,000.

14	SECTION 8. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS
15	CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW. TRANSFER
16	PROVISION - LINE ITEMS. The Director of the Bureau of Legislative Research
17	is hereby authorized to direct the Chief Fiscal Officer of the State to
18	transfer appropriation between line items within appropriations and also
19	between the appropriations made by this Act in such amounts as determined
20	necessary.
21	The provisions of this section shall be in effect only from July 1, -2012
22	<u>2013</u> through June 30,— <u>2013</u> <u>2014</u> .
23	
24	SECTION 9. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS
25	CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW. COST OF
26	LIVING INCREASES. Employees of the Bureau of Legislative Research assigned
27	to positions having a labor grade shall be eligible for cost-of-living
28	increases on July 1, in an amount equal to that granted to all other state
29	agency, board, commission or institution of higher education employees on
30	those dates. Any additional adjustments in annual salary rates for Bureau
31	employees, labor market adjustments, merit pay adjustments or employee
32	retention or recruitment requirements shall be made at the discretion of the
33	Director of the Bureau. Salary payments shall not be restricted to maximum
34	amounts authorized by law, if the salary adjustments exceed the maximum line
35	item amount authorized by law for a position, the amount shall be paid to the

employee as a lump-sum payment.

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The provisions of this section shall be in effect only from July 1, 2012 2 2013 through June 30, 2013 2014.

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4 SECTION 10. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS
5 CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW.

- 6 DISBURSING OFFICER. The Director of the Bureau of Legislative Research of the
- 7 Legislative Council shall be the disbursing officer for the funds
- 8 appropriated by this Act, including the Interim Committee Study Expenses. The
- 9 Director shall appoint a designee who shall serve as the disbursing officer
- 10 in his/her absence. In the event there is no Director, the Co-Chairs of the
- 11 Arkansas Legislative Council can appoint a disbursing officer. All
- 12 expenditures from the appropriations provided by this Act shall be in
- 13 accordance with procedures established by the Legislative Council and in
- 14 accordance with appropriate law.
- 15 The provisions of this section shall be in effect only from July 1, -2012
- 16 2013 through June 30, 2013 2014.

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SECTION 11. COMPLIANCE WITH OTHER LAWS. Disbursement of funds authorized by this act shall be limited to the appropriation for such agency and funds made available by law for the support of such appropriations; and the restrictions of the State Procurement Law, the General Accounting and Budgetary Procedures Law, the Revenue Stabilization Law, the Regular Salary Procedures and Restrictions Act, or their successors, and other fiscal control laws of this State, where applicable, and regulations promulgated by the Department of Finance and Administration, as authorized by law, shall be strictly complied with in disbursement of said funds.

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SECTION 12. LEGISLATIVE INTENT. It is the intent of the General Assembly that any funds disbursed under the authority of the appropriations contained in this act shall be in compliance with the stated reasons for which this act was adopted, as evidenced by the Agency Requests, Executive Recommendations and Legislative Recommendations contained in the budget manuals prepared by the Department of Finance and Administration, letters, or summarized oral testimony in the official minutes of the Arkansas Legislative Council or Joint Budget Committee which relate to its passage and adoption.

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1	SECTION 13. EMERGENCY CLAUSE. It is found and determined by the
2	General Assembly, that the Constitution of the State of Arkansas prohibits
3	the appropriation of funds for more than a one (1) year period; that the
4	effectiveness of this Act on July 1, 2013 is essential to the operation of
5	the agency for which the appropriations in this Act are provided, and that in
6	the event of an extension of the legislative session, the delay in the
7	effective date of this Act beyond July 1, 2013 could work irreparable harm
8	upon the proper administration and provision of essential governmental
9	programs. Therefore, an emergency is hereby declared to exist and this Act
10	being necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health
11	and safety shall be in full force and effect from and after July 1, 2013.
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
