SECTION 16. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS 10 11 CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW. EMERGENCY 12 GRANTS & EXTRA HELP POOL. An Institution of higher education that suffers an 13 emergency/disaster event resulting in all or a significant portion of campus 14 operations being interrupted, may request disaster assistance through the 15 Arkansas Department of Higher Education. Upon the declaration of an 16 emergency by the Governor, the institution may request, subject to the 17 recommendation of the Director of the Department of Higher Education and approval of the Governor, a grant from the Disaster Relief Fund to assist in 18 19 returning that campus to operation and/or to a sister campus providing 20 services to the students from the affected campus. Certified law enforcement 21 officers employed by an institution of higher education may be granted 22 jurisdiction at the sister institution, upon agreement of both institutions. 23 The Department of Higher Education is authorized a pool of 500 extra help 24 positions for use in such emergency situations. These positions may be assigned to the campus suffering the disaster event or to a sister campus 25 26 providing services to the students from the affected campus. The Governor 27 may waive the 1,500 hour limit of ACA 6-63-314 on these assigned extra help 28 pool positions.

29 The provisions of this section shall be in effect only from July 1, $\frac{2012}{30}$ 30 $\frac{2013}{2013}$ through June 30, $\frac{2013}{2014}$.

32 SECTION 17. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS 33 CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW. 34 REALLOCATION OF RESOURCES FOR INSTITUTIONS OF HIGHER EDUCATION. Upon 35 determination by the president or chancellor of an institution of higher 36 education that a reallocation of resources for purposes of reorganization or

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1 consolidation of administrative functions within the institution is necessary 2 for efficient and effective operations of the institution, the president or 3 chancellor, with approval of the institution's board of trustees, may have 4 the authority to transfer positions, appropriations and related funds between 5 campuses, divisions, branches, and other budgetary units of the institution, 6 after receiving prior approval of the Legislative Council or Joint Budget 7 Committee. The transfers of positions, programs, or activities shall be used 8 for those purposes for which the appropriations were approved by the General 9 Assembly. The transfers, consolidations, or reorganizations which involve 10 academic programs shall be reviewed by the Department of Higher Education 11 prior to submission to the Legislative Council or Joint Budget Committee. 12 Provided, however, that the institution shall be limited to submitting no more than two (2) individual transaction transfer requests during any fiscal 13 14 year and shall be further limited to no more than five percent (5%) of the 15 total General Revenue and Special Revenue appropriation, funding, positions 16 specific to each institution, and no Tobacco Settlement funds or 17 appropriations may be reallocated pursuant to this section. 18 Determining the maximum number of employees and the maximum amount of 19 appropriation and general revenue funding for institutions of higher 20 education each fiscal year is the prerogative of the General Assembly. This 21 is usually accomplished by delineating such maximums in the appropriation 22 act(s) for institutions of higher education and the general revenue 23 allocations authorized for each fund and fund account by amendment to the 24 Revenue Stabilization law. Further, the General Assembly has determined that 25 institutions of higher education may operate more efficiently if some 26 flexibility is provided to institutions of higher education authorizing broad 27 powers under this Section. Therefore, it is both necessary and appropriate 28 that the General Assembly maintain oversight by requiring prior approval of 29 the Legislative Council or Joint Budget Committee as provided by this 30 The requirement of approval by the Legislative Council or Joint section. 31 Budget Committee is not a severable part of this section. If the requirement 32 of approval by the Legislative Council or Joint Budget Committee is ruled 33 unconstitutional by a court of competent jurisdiction, this entire section is 34 void.

35 The provisions of this section shall be in effect only from July 1, 2012
36 <u>2013</u> through June 30, 2014.

SECTION 18. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS 2 CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW. LOANS. In 3 4 order to provide timely payments under financial aid appropriations made in 5 this Act, the Chief Fiscal Officer of the State is authorized to provide 6 loans from the Budget Stabilization Trust Fund to make available all funds 7 attributable to the financial aid programs under the then current official 8 revenue estimates. In the event of an unanticipated state revenue shortfall, 9 any such loans remaining at the end of a fiscal year shall be repaid from 10 revenues distributed in the first two months of the next fiscal year. Funds 11 for appropriations made in this Act for purposes other than financial aid 12 shall not be affected by the application of this provision.

13 The provisions of this section shall be in effect only from July 1, 2012

SECTION 19. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS 16 17 CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW. WORK 18 FORCE 2000 DEVELOPMENT FUND PROCEDURES. After the amounts to be made 19 available to the various technical colleges have been determined as set out 20 in Arkansas Code 26-51-205(d)(2), such documents as may be necessary shall be 21 processed so that funds may be transferred from the Work Force 2000 22 Development Fund to the State Treasury fund or fund account from which the 23 technical college draws its general revenue support. Such funds as may be 24 transferred shall not exceed 93.691% of the total funds available from the 25 Work Force 2000 Development Fund during the fiscal year. 26 In the event that a technical institute or comprehensive lifelong learning 27 center which receives support from the Work Force 2000 Development Fund as 28 determined by law transfers or merges into the Arkansas Technical College and 29 Community College System for which Work Force 2000 Development Fund monies

New funding actually received 5 for salary increases shall be spent exclusively for salary increases based 6 upon the state general revenue portion of total unrestricted educational and 7 general revenue. 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14 SECTION 37. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS 15 CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW. 16 APPROPRIATION TRANSFER PROCEDURES - AR GEOGRAPHICAL CRITICAL NEEDS MINORITY 17 TEACHER SCHOLARSHIP PROGRAM. The Director of the Arkansas Department of 18 Higher Education shall determine the amount available, up to \$200,000 per 19 fiscal year, to fund the Arkansas Geographical Critical Needs Minority 20 Teacher Scholarships and shall certify to the Chief Fiscal Officer of the 21 State and the State Treasurer such amount as is required to be transferred 22 from the Higher Education Grants Fund Account. Upon receiving such certification, the Chief Fiscal Officer of the State and the State Treasurer 23 24 shall cause to be transferred the necessary funds and appropriation to the 25 fund account of the University of Arkansas at Pine Bluff for implementation 26 of this program. HIGHER 34 EDUCATION CENTRAL POOL POSITIONS. a) Universities - (1) The Department of 35 Higher Education shall establish and maintain a central pool of three hundred 36 (300) positions to be used to establish additional positions when an

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1 institution does not have sufficient positions available to meet

2 unanticipated enrollment growth, industry training demands, and its mandated

3 responsibilities.

4 (2) Central pool positions are to be used by the institutions if the
5 personnel service needs exceed the number of positions authorized by the
6 General Assembly and that were not anticipated at the time of the passage of
7 the institution's operating appropriation act.

8 (3) No position established under this section may exceed the salary rate of 9 the highest maximum annual salary rate or the highest grade level position 10 authorized by the General Assembly in the requesting institution's operating 11 appropriation act.

12 (4) The institution shall provide justification to the Department of Higher13 Education for the need to allocate positions from the central pool.

14 (5) Titles shall not be assigned to the institution from the central pool
15 until specific positions are requested by the institution, recommended by the
16 Department of Higher Education and approved by the Arkansas Legislative
17 Council or the Joint Budget Committee.

18 (6) If an institution requests any central pool position to be continued
19 during the subsequent fiscal year, the position must be requested as a new
20 position in the institution's subsequent fiscal year budget request.

(b) Colleges - (1) The Department of Higher Education shall establish and maintain a central pool of two hundred fifty (250) positions to be used to establish additional positions when an institution does not have sufficient positions available to meet unanticipated enrollment growth, industry training demands, and its mandated responsibilities.

(2) Central pool positions are to be used by the institutions if the personnel service needs exceed the number of positions authorized by the General Assembly and that were not anticipated at the time of the passage of the institution's operating appropriation act.

30 (3) No position established under this section may exceed the salary rate of 31 the highest maximum annual salary rate or the highest grade level position 32 authorized by the General Assembly in the requesting institution's operating 33 appropriation act.

(4) The institution shall provide justification to the Department of Higher
Education for the need to allocate positions from the central pool.
(5) Titles shall not be assigned to the institution from the central pool

until specific positions are requested by the institution, recommended by the
 Department of Higher Education and approved by the Arkansas Legislative
 Council or the Joint Budget Committee.

4 (6) If an institution requests any central pool position to be continued
5 during the subsequent fiscal year, the position must be requested as a new
6 position in the institution's subsequent fiscal year budget request.

7 (c) Determining the maximum number of employees and the maximum amount of 8 appropriation and general revenue funding for institutions of higher 9 education each fiscal year is the prerogative of the General Assembly. This 10 is usually accomplished by delineating such maximums in the appropriation 11 act(s) for institutions of higher education and the general revenue 12 allocations authorized for each fund and fund account by amendment to the 13 Revenue Stabilization law. Further, the General Assembly has determined that 14 institutions of higher education may operate more efficiently if some 15 flexibility is provided to institutions of higher education authorizing broad 16 powers under this Section. Therefore, it is both necessary and appropriate 17 that the General Assembly maintain oversight by requiring prior approval of 18 the Legislative Council or Joint Budget Committee as provided by this 19 section. The requirement of approval by the Legislative Council or Joint 20 Budget Committee is not a severable part of this section. If the requirement 21 of approval by the Legislative Council or Joint Budget Committee is ruled 22 unconstitutional by a court of competent jurisdiction, this entire section is 23 void.

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SECTION 40. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. Arkansas Code Title 6, Chapter 62,
Section 803, concerning limits on funding of athletic programs, is amended to
read as follows:

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1 6-62-803. Limits on funding.

2 (a) Beginning in fiscal year 1991-1992, the amount of unrestricted educational and general funds for intercollegiate athletic programs at state-3 4 supported institutions of higher education shall be limited to four hundred 5 fifty thousand dollars (\$450,000) at four-year institutions and to fifty-one 6 dollars (\$51.00) per full-time-equivalent student per year at two-year 7 branches of four-year institutions and at other two-year institutions of 8 higher education. 9 (b)(1) Beginning in fiscal year 1997-1998, state-supported four-year 10 institutions of higher education may use an additional three hundred thousand 11 dollars (\$300,000) per fiscal year of unrestricted educational and general 12 funds to provide gender equity in intercollegiate athletic programs. 13 (2) Two-year branches of the four-year institutions and other two-year 14 institutions of higher education may use an additional amount of unrestricted 15 educational and general funds for providing gender equity in intercollegiate 16 athletic programs in the amount of thirty-four dollars (\$34.00) per full-17 time-equivalent student per year. 18 (c)(1) Beginning in fiscal year 2005-2006, the limits on the amount of 19 unrestricted educational and general funds for intercollegiate athletic 20 programs at state-supported institutions of higher education set forth in 21 subsections (a) and (b) of this section shall be adjusted as determined by 22 the Department of Higher Education based on the consumer price index. (2)(A) For fiscal year 2005-2006, the adjustments shall take into 23 24 account the inflation increases since the figures set forth in subsections (a) and (b) of this section were established or last adjusted. 25 26 (B) In subsequent years, the adjustment shall be for the period 27 from the last adjustment to the beginning of the relevant fiscal year. 28 (a) For the certification required under 6-62-805, the amount allowed to be 29 budgeted of unrestricted educational and general funds for intercollegiate 30 athletic programs at state-supported institutions of higher education shall 31 be limited to an amount established by the Department of Higher Education for 32 the fiscal year 2012-2013 or an amount of not more than two and one half 33 percent (2.5%) of the actual total unrestricted educational and general 34 revenues of the previous fiscal year at institutions of higher education. 35 (b) The Department of Higher Education shall annually adjust the allowable

36 <u>transfer based upon the consumer price index.</u>

2 SECTION 41. COMPLIANCE WITH OTHER LAWS. Disbursement of funds authorized by this act shall be limited to the appropriation for such agency 3 4 and funds made available by law for the support of such appropriations; and 5 the restrictions of the State Procurement Law, the General Accounting and 6 Budgetary Procedures Law, the Revenue Stabilization Law, the Regular Salary 7 Procedures and Restrictions Act, or their successors, and other fiscal 8 control laws of this State, where applicable, and regulations promulgated by 9 the Department of Finance and Administration, as authorized by law, shall be 10 strictly complied with in disbursement of said funds.

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SECTION 42. LEGISLATIVE INTENT. It is the intent of the General 12 13 Assembly that any funds disbursed under the authority of the appropriations 14 contained in this act shall be in compliance with the stated reasons for 15 which this act was adopted, as evidenced by the Agency Requests, Executive 16 Recommendations and Legislative Recommendations contained in the budget 17 manuals prepared by the Department of Finance and Administration, letters, or 18 summarized oral testimony in the official minutes of the Arkansas Legislative 19 Council or Joint Budget Committee which relate to its passage and adoption. 20

SECTION 43. EMERGENCY CLAUSE. It is found and determined by the 21 22 General Assembly, that the Constitution of the State of Arkansas prohibits 23 the appropriation of funds for more than a one (1) year period; that the 24 effectiveness of this Act on July 1, 2013 is essential to the operation of 25 the agency for which the appropriations in this Act are provided, and that in 26 the event of an extension of the legislative session, the delay in the effective date of this Act beyond July 1, 2013 could work irreparable harm 27 upon the proper administration and provision of essential governmental 28 29 programs. Therefore, an emergency is hereby declared to exist and this Act 30 being necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health and safety shall be in full force and effect from and after July 1, 2013. 31 32 33 34
