23 SECTION 17. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS 24 CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW. EMERGENCY 25 GRANTS & EXTRA HELP POOL. An Institution of higher education that suffers an 26 emergency/disaster event resulting in all or a significant portion of campus 27 operations being interrupted, may request disaster assistance through the 28 Arkansas Department of Higher Education. Upon the declaration of an 29 emergency by the Governor, the institution may request, subject to the 30 recommendation of the Director of the Department of Higher Education and 31 approval of the Governor, a grant from the Disaster Relief Fund to assist in 32 returning that campus to operation and/or to a sister campus providing 33 services to the students from the affected campus. Certified law enforcement 34 officers employed by an institution of higher education may be granted 35 jurisdiction at the sister institution, upon agreement of both institutions. 36 The Department of Higher Education is authorized a pool of 500 extra help

positions for use in such emergency situations. These positions may be assigned to the campus suffering the disaster event or to a sister campus providing services to the students from the affected campus. The Governor may waive the 1,500 hour limit of ACA 6-63-314 on these assigned extra help pool positions.
