5	(B) In determining the number of qualified electors in the		
6	county under subdivision (e)(1)(A) of this section, the total number of all		
7	votes cast in the county for Governor in the immediately preceding general		
8	gubernatorial election shall be conclusive of the number of qualified		
9	electors residing within the county.		
10	(2) The petition shall be filed during the party filing period.		
11	(3) The county clerk shall verify the sufficiency of the		
12	petition within thirty (30) days of filing.		
13	(4) A candidate for sheriff shall file a political practices		
14	pledge, an affidavit of eligibility, and a notice of candidacy at the time of		
15	filing the petition.		
16	(5) The sufficiency of a petition filed under this section may		
17	be challenged in the same manner as election contests under § 7-5-801 et seq.		
18	(f)(1)(A) A candidate for sheriff may not use more than three (3)		
19	given names, one (1) of which may be a nickname or any other word used for		
20	the purpose of identifying the candidate to the voters.		
21	(B)(i) A candidate for sheriff may add as a prefix to his		
22	or her name the title or an abbreviation of an elective public office the		
23	candidate currently holds.		
24	(ii) A candidate may only use as the prefix the		
25	title of sheriff in an election for sheriff if the candidate is currently		
26	serving as sheriff.		
27	(C) A nickname shall not include a professional or		
28	honorary title.		
29	(g)(l) Votes for a write-in candidate in an election for sheriff shall		
30	not be counted or tabulated unless the candidate or his or her agent gives		
31	notice in writing of his or her intention to be a write-in candidate for		
32	sheriff to the county board of election commissioners and the county clerk.		
33	(2) The written notice shall be given not later than ninety (90)

1	(n)(1) If no candidate for sheriff receives a majority of the votes
2	cast in the general election, the two (2) candidates receiving the highest
3	number of votes cast for the office to be filled shall be the nominees for

6	(2) If the office of sheriff is unopposed, then the single
7	candidate for sheriff shall be printed on the general election ballot and the
8	votes for sheriff shall be tabulated as in all contested races.
